## What Happened/How Was it Done?

The Countryside Wardens along with the School Environmental Action Officer visited the school and pupil representatives from across all year groups took part in a variety of activities. These included making bird

feeders, insect homes, bird boxes, bat boxes and hedgehog boxes to attract wildlife and provide shelter for various species thereby improving the biodiversity of the school grounds. The boxes and feeders made by the pupils have been erected around the school grounds and will be monitored by the pupils for signs of occupation over the next year.
