As you grow up, you will become more able to make your own choices. We will help you to make choices about your care whenever we can. We will help you and your parents or your guardian to make decisions about your care record together. If you can not agree about who can see your care record, your social worker will ask for advice from other workers in the Child and Adult Services department.

It's OK to change your mind

Most of the time, we will not share information about you unless you say it is OK. We will only share information about you without your say-so if we think you might be in danger. There may be times when someone will need to look at information about you without having

your permission. This could happen if you ever need emergency care. We will tell you if this

Even if you agree that we can share your record, you can change your mind at any time. We

Anyone who we share your information with must understand their **duty of confidentiality**. We will make sure that they do. We will keep a list of everyone who has permission to look at your care record. If you want to see the list, talk to your social worker about it.

Every young person who is involved with us has something called a care record. Your care record is important. It holds information about you and the things that are happening in your life. It holds details of the care and support we are giving to you and why you need our help.

When we work with you, we will ask you if we can share the information in your care record with other people. This could be:

- your parents

- your doctor.


