Digital Skills Courses

The digital world has become important in almost every area of life; from searching for jobs, or keeping in touch with friends and family.

Digital Skills for Beginners

Designed for the total beginner, you will learn how to use a PC correctly. You will also learn some basic word processing skills, how to search for information on the internet as well as set up and use an email Account.

Functional Skills (Entry Level) *

An ideal qualification for learners wishing to develop practical, transferable skills in ICT in order to work confidently, effectively and independently in life. These qualifications will develop your ICT skills to ensure you are confident and capable in choosing and using a range of ICT systems, tools and software packages, such as the Internet, Word and Excel to meet your needs. It is suitable for a wide range of individuals and is fundamental to the successful completion of various wider qualifications and frameworks, such as Foundation Learning.



Functional ICT Level 1 & 2 *

These qualifications are suitable for learners who wish to be recognised for their achievement of a wide range of practical ICT skills for use in everyday life, e.g. Word, internet/email and basic spreadsheets, database and PowerPoint. These courses will help you develop your knowledge and skills in a range of software applications that most employers desire. These can include using spreadsheets with advanced formulae e.g. IF function and filtering information.

ECDL Level 1 & 2*

Existing experience and knowledge will be developed to improve understanding of Microsoft Office applications including Word. PowerPoint and Excel Spreadsheets. Progressing to build on your existing experience and knowledge to gain a level 1 or 2 qualification and become more proficient in the use of Microsoft applications.

Internet for Beginners

Improving everyday internet skills. The internet is a giant library of information. Knowing how to access this information is useful for practical everyday tasks. Learn how to use the internet to compare prices, discover training opportunities, job search, research your hobbies, keep in touch with friends and family and bag a bargain when shopping online. Also learn the basics of using the internet safely and protecting your details online.

Make Social Media Work for You

In this course you will learn about different social media platforms and networks and how you can use these to connect with people and share information online for work, study or socialising. This course will allow you to stay in control of your information and stay safe. Learn how social media can be used to promote events and businesses: create, edit and use contacts when sending and receiving online communications, comprising text and other digital content to individual and multiple recipients: initiate and participate in a video call and identify the types of digital activities that leave a 'digital footprint' and understand the implications.

Staving Safe Online

This course will cover how to pay bills safely online and also how you can switch your utility services such as gas and electric to get you the best deal being safe and responsible online, protecting privacy, protecting data and digital wellbeing.

Beginners Photo Editing

Have you ever wanted to design your own digital artwork or images but not sure how? This course is an inspiring way for you to enter the world of image manipulation and digital graphic design.

Our Photo Editing for Improvers course then builds on these skills further.

Business and Administration Courses

Enrol on a business administration course to help with employability and work skills.

Introduction to Customer Service

Ever thought about looking into a new career in Customer Service? This short and friendly 2 hour session will introduce you to studying in this area to find a new career that suits you, and is an insight into the Distance Learning Customer Service course.

Level 1 AAT Access Award in Bookkeeping & Software*

You will create accounts, process accounting Information, read reports and learn to understand the risk and reward of using accounting software. From this course you will gain an understanding about the role of a bookkeeper. This course introduces essential accounting skills and principles such as the double entry system, trial balances and credit control.

Level 2 AAT Foundation Certificate in Bookkeeping and Software*

Develop further use of manual bookkeeping skills and software skills to the next level. You will be able to set up your accounting software to produce reports. This will cover bookkeeping transactions, control accounts, journals & costings.

AAT Business Skills

This 12 week course is perfect for young people and those taking their first step on the career ladder. As well as covering the basic accounting techniques and principles you'll gain a broader understanding of the business environment and how to prepare for entering the world of work.

Minute Taking Skills

Minutes are a very important method of recording information from a meeting. This short minute taking course will provide you with practical tips and techniques for taking effective meeting minutes that capture vital information, thoughts and ideas.

Introduction to Working in Business Administration

This course is designed for those who want to work in administrative support roles in public or private sector organisations. You will learn how to carry out essential administrative tasks and on completion of the course you will be able to progress to higher level study to gain qualifications that meet the needs of employers.

Bookkeeping Workshop

This course will introduce you to manual bookkeeping documents and a manual process to record the documents.

You will learn terminology, how to calculate VAT and have to process some documentation.

Following on you can progress on to a 10 week
Bookkeeping course and then to an AAT qualification.

Computerised Account Workshop

This course will introduce you to using a computerised package of entering invoices, payments, credits and adding customers, suppliers and new ledger accounts. Following this you can progress to a 10 week computerised accounts course and then to an AAT qualification.

Payroll Workshop

This course will give you an understanding of the basics of payroll and how to log on, backup and restore.

Business Administration NVQ Courses

NVQ Courses are held regularly throughout the year. Call 01429 868616 to arrange an appointment. Price on request.

NVQ Certificate in Business and Administration Level 2

Designed for those already working or volunteering in a business administration role. You will build an ePortfolio of evidence based on activities carried out in the workplace.

NVQ Certificate in Business and Administration Level 3

This course is for people working in an administrative role at a supervisory level. You will be assessed carrying out real workplace activities and build up an ePortfolio of evidence to prove competence.

NVQ Certificate in Business and Administration Level 4

This course is for people working in an administrative role where they are responsible for system change and who work with a high level of autonomy. You will be assessed carrying out real workplace activities and build up an ePortfolio of evidence to prove competence.

NVQ Certificate in Customer Service Level 2

This course will increase your awareness and knowledge skills of customer service. You must be working or volunteering in a customer facing role to acquire the evidence to build an ePortfolio.

NVQ Diploma in Customer Service Level 3

A qualification for those who work in a customer facing role without direct supervision. Your competence in the role will be assessed by building an ePortfolio of evidence based upon activities carried out within your existing role.

Level 3 Diploma in the Principles of Leadership and Management

This qualification aims to give team leaders and potential first line managers the foundation for their formal development in this role. The qualification does this by developing basic team leadership skills and assisting participants in gaining the basic knowledge required at this level.

NVQ Management Level 5

This qualification is suitable for aspiring senior managers, heads of department and directors. Building on knowledge and skills to progress within your role in management.



Level 6 Diploma in Career Guidance and Development

This course provides a high quality and nationally recognised qualification for learners working directly with clients providing Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG). In order to achieve this qualification, you will produce an ePortfolio of evidence on a range of units including career guidance theory and using Labour Market Information with clients.

Teaching, Learning and Assessment Courses

Comprehensive courses that will offer a starting point or increase opportunity for people either new to, or currently working within the education sector.

Level 3 Award Internal Quality Assurance

The Level 3 Award Internal Quality Assurance course is designed for those who are relatively new to assessing and would like to develop their knowledge and understanding of the basic principles and practices. The course is applicable to the majority of sectors, whether you work with employers, in further education, in adult continued learning or in the third sector, this course will provide you with a recognised qualification opening up the door to further progression routes.

Understanding Child Development

This course introduces four theories, these theories are sometimes referred to as 'grand theories' in the sense that they offer general explanations of child development as a whole, rather than just certain areas.

Level 2 Award in Mentoring

The role and responsibilities of a mentor in practice are multifaceted. This course prepares you for this challenging and immensely rewarding role by giving you the knowledge, understanding and skills necessary to be a competent mentor.

Level 3 Certificate in Education and Training

This Level 3 qualification is a relevant and useful course for trainee teachers in a post 16 context. This course is an induction to teaching that will give an insight into the roles, responsibilities and relationships in education and training, how to plan and deliver inclusive teaching sessions and how to assess and give constructive feedback.

Level 1 Award in Preparing to Work in Schools

This course is designed to give you an introduction to supporting learning in the classroom. An ideal way to explore your next steps into employment or training.

NVQ Diploma in Residential Childcare Level 3

This qualification is designed to build the knowledge and skills needed when working with children and young people from birth to 19 years who are in residential care. It covers a diverse range of job roles and occupational areas.

NVQ Level 2 Certificate in Support for Teaching and Learning in Schools

The Level 2 Certificate is applicable to learning support staff whose responsibilities at work are supervised. Designed for those who are employed or work as a volunteer for a minimum of two days a week in a school for three terms. It is suitable for those who wish to gain a recognised qualification and/or progress in the workplace.



NVQ Level 3 Diploma in Specialist Support for Teaching and Learning in Schools

This course is designed for support staff whose role requires competence across a range of responsibilities. The frameworks provide training for the roles of teaching, classroom and learning support assistant, special needs assistant and behaviour support assistant/coordinator.

NVQ Certificate in Information, Advice and Guidance Level 3

This course is designed to increase your awareness, skills and knowledge within an Advice and Guidance role. You must be employed or a volunteer working in an Advice and Guidance role. You will be assessed in the workplace using a range of methods, whilst building an ePortfolio of evidence.

NVQ Diploma in Information, Advice and Guidance Level 4

This course is for learners who undertake activities at Level 4 working directly with clients, disseminating information, advice and guidance and formal advocacy. Learners will be experienced in their job role. In order to achieve this qualification you will produce an ePortfolio of evidence which will include personal statements, case histories, assessor observation, written and oral answers and witness testimony.

Certificate in Assessing Vocational Achievement

This qualification is intended for those who assess occupational competencies, vocational skills and knowledge in an individual's work environment.

English Courses

Reading, writing and communication skills are required for most jobs or courses. We offer a range of flexible English courses to enhance your skills.

Practical English

An informative programme to improve English skills that are used in everyday situations.

English Stepping Stones at all levels

This course will develop skills in spelling, grammar, punctuation, reading, writing, speaking, listening, and presentation skills.

This course will help break English down into small steps to help rebuild confidence and understanding of the subject. On successful completion of each unit you will receive a qualification and can progress to Functional Skills English.

Functional English (Entry Level)*

This course will develop the practical skills in English to help get the most from life, learning and work, ensuring that learners have good communication skills in reading, writing, speaking and listening. Entry Level Functional Skills qualifications are designed to focus on problem solving and using these skills effectively in real situations.

Functional English Level 1 & Level 2*

Learners will develop the practical skills in English to help get the most from life, learning and work. ensuring that learners have good communication skills in reading, writing, speaking and listening. Working on Functional Skills helps to develop and secure the broader range of aptitudes and behaviours that will enable learners to make a positive contribution to the communities in which they live and work.



Maths Courses

Maths skills are needed to apply for most jobs or to study. We offer a range of flexible Maths classes.

Practical Arithmetic

An informative programme to improve Maths skills that are used in everyday situations.

Money Management

This course gives you practical guidance on compiling a budget and using it to make good decisions about your spending.



Maths Stepping Stones at all levels

Course includes sessions on numbers, decimals, percentages, fractions, ratio, data handling, probability and measure. This course will help break maths down into small steps to help rebuild confidence and understanding within maths. On successful completion of the course you will receive a qualification and can progress to functional skills Maths.

Functional Maths (Entry Level)*

Functional Maths aims to promote the mathematical thinking, problem solving and transferrable skills that are useful in everyday life and work. Entry Level Functional Skills qualifications are designed to focus on problem solving and using these skills effectively in real situations.

Functional Maths Level 1 & Level 2*

The key areas will focus on representing, analysing and interpreting mathematical information and will support learners to progress in learning, life and employment. On completion of the Level 2 you can move on to GCSE Maths.

Step into GCSE Maths/GCSE Maths*-Achieve a Higher Grade

This course will help you improve and develop a sound technique in a number of areas of Maths to achieve a GCSE at foundation level grade 4/5. You will cover number, algebra, geometry & data handling from the GCSE syllabus. You should already have a GCSE grade below grade 5 or be competent at level 2 functional skills to attend this course.

ESOL Courses

ESOL Skills for Life courses are for anyone in the UK whose first language is not English. There are 6 levels available: Introduction (pre-entry), Entry 1, Entry 2, Entry 3, Level 1 and Level 2.

You will complete an assessment and have time to speak with a tutor to make sure you enrol on the level which best suits your needs. ESOL Skills for Life courses cover 3 subjects; These are Speaking and Listening, Reading and Writing.

Introduction to ESOL

This course is for adults whose first language is not English, who have no English skills. It focuses on vocabulary for everyday situations, common phrases and topics like shopping, the home, money, time, travel and school.

Award in ESOL (Speaking and Listening) Entry Level*

ESOL Skills for Life is for anyone living in the UK whose first language is not English. There are varied levels available, to meet the needs of people whose English is at different levels.

Award in ESOL (Reading) Entry Level*

ESOL Skills for Life is for anyone living in the UK whose first language is not English. There are varied levels available, to meet the needs of people whose English is at different levels.

ESOL (Writing) Entry Level*

These courses are designed for adults who live and work or study in the United Kingdom. They are aimed at candidates who have little literacy knowledge or experience of English.

Award in ESOL (Speaking & Listening) Level 1 & Level 2*

ESOL Skills for Life is for anyone living in the UK whose first language is not English. There are varied levels available, to meet the needs of people whose English is at different levels.

Award in ESOL (Reading) Level 1& Level 2*

ESOL Skills for Life is for anyone living in the UK whose first language is not English. There are varied levels available, to meet the needs of people whose English is at different levels.

Award in ESOL (Writing) Level 1 & Level 2*

ESOL Skills for Life is for anyone living in the UK whose first language is not English. There are varied levels available, to meet the needs of people whose English is at different levels.

Maths for ESOL Learners

This course is for ESOL learners. It aims to raise awareness of the challenges and differences that learners might meet whilst developing numeracy skills. It will support learners in their study of mathematics, whilst improving their English skills.

History for ESOL

This course is ideal for ESOL learners who want to learn more about British history, culture, political establishment and British Values. It will help you prepare for the "Life in Britain" nationality test and improve your overall English knowledge. You will need to be working at ESOL entry 2 or higher in Reading, Writing and Speaking and Listening to enrol on this course.



Family Learning Courses

Enterprise

Our courses help parents, grandparents, guardians and carers feel more confident about supporting their children. They offer the opportunity to share, enjoy and learn with your children. Distance Learning Courses

After an initial taught session, these courses will be delivered through flexible, distance learning with tutor support.

Level 2 Certificate in Dignity and Safeguarding in Adult Social Care

This programme strives to equip learners with an indepth understanding of how to understand dignity and safeguarding in adult social care. This is the ideal programme for individuals who work or are intending to work with vulnerable adults in the health and social care sectors, in a range of settings, such as hospitals, hospices, domiciliary care, or nursing homes.

Level 2 Certificate in Principles of Working with Individuals with Learning **Difficulties**

This is a level 2 qualification suitable for learners working with, or intending to work with, individuals with learning disabilities. This can be in a variety of areas, including a range of community settings, domiciliary care, schools, day provision, care or nursing homes, hospitals, hospices, or other settings in which people are being cared for.

Level 2 Certificate in Common Health Conditions

Healthcare workers need to have a good understanding of a wide range of illnesses and health conditions. Each individual they support will be different and each will have their own set of health issues and concerns.

Level 2 Certificate in Understanding **Nutrition and Health**

This qualification is ideal for learners who are interested in improving their understanding of nutrition and healthy eating. You must successfully complete all five mandatory units to be awarded the NCFF level 2 Certificate in Nutrition and Health.

Level 2 Certificate in Understanding **Autism**

This course is ideal for learners who want to develop awareness and understanding of autism and know how to support individuals with the condition. This qualification is ideal for learners who support individuals with autism in a variety of settings. including health, social care, entertainment, leisure, nursing, education, training and the public sector.

Level 2 Certificate in Equality and Diversity

The aim of this qualification is to give learners an introduction to the issues around stereotyping. prejudice and discrimination to identify the basic rights that all people should enjoy and the shared values people have, and to examine the responsibility each person and organisation has in ensuring that barriers to participation in society are removed.

Level 2 Certificate in the Principles of **Dementia Care**

This course is ideal for care workers and any other health professional, this course will provide the essential knowledge needed to offer the very best professional approach to caring for people with dementia

Level 2 Certificate in the Awareness of **Mental Health Problems**

This distance learning programme has been written for everyone who is involved in the care sector and aims to give all staff, supervisors and managers the essential knowledge needed to offer the very best professional approach to understanding working in mental health.

Level 2 Certificate in Information. Advice or Guidance

This qualification aims to develop the learner's knowledge and understanding of the key principles of information, advice or guidance and applying these within their own context. The objectives of this qualification are to prepare learners for further training and to support a role where learners may give initial information, advice or guidance to others.

Distance Learning Courses

After an initial taught session, this course will be delivered through flexible, distance learning with tutor support.

Level 2 Certificate in Principles of Customer Service

This course will help you to develop your customer service knowledge, enhance day to day interactions with customers and boost your CV. You will learn about the delivery of excellent customer service, improve your communication skills and develop the knowledge and principles that underpin good customer care. The skills you gain will be transferable and applicable in a range of industries and sectors.

Level 2 Certificate in the Principles of End of Life Care

This course is aimed at those whose careers involve caring for people at the end of their life. It is suitable for people working in a variety of settings, including hospitals, hospices, day provision, care or nursing homes and domiciliary care. It is also suitable for people who are already working in other care settings and are considering working in end of life care. The course is divided into five units, each covering a different aspect of caring for those at the end of their lives.

Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills

This course is for anyone interested in developing listening skills, gaining an understanding of the counselling process and developing personal insights and self-awareness.

Level 2 Certificate in Preparing to Work in Adult Social Care

Access to GCSE English

An overview of what's involved in an English GCSE programme. This course offers excellent preparation for the full GCSE English programme.

Access to GCSE Maths

Health & Social Care Courses

Level 1 Health and Social Care

- Respite care

Level 2 Health and Social Care Technical Certificate

Accredited courses to demonstrate your skills in the workplace or in other practical situations.

Level 2 Award in Helping Skills

This qualification is designed for anyone who uses, or would like to use helping skills either at work or in a personal capacity. You may then wish to progress towards further qualifications - such as health and social care, children's care, learning and development, voluntary and community work.

Infant/Baby First Aid Essentials

Nobody likes to think of their child being in an emergency situation, but learning first aid will give you the confidence to be able to help should you need to. This course has been designed with parents in mind, to guide you through exactly what you need to know. It covers a range of childhood emergency situations.

Making Positive Differences

This course offers you the chance to discover your abilities and potential. Learn about self-awareness, increasing confidence and self esteem; make small changes that could have huge benefits in your everyday life.

Family First Aid

You never know when something could happen to someone in your family, so learning now will prepare you to deal with an emergency situation should it arise.

Volunteering

In June 2015, the Council secured £400,000 of Big Lottery Reaching Communities Funding to support the development of the Promoting Change, Transforming Lives Project.

The project is based at Waverley Terrace Allotment and provides unemployed adults with access to personal, social and employability initiatives to help individuals with lifeskills, raise their aspirations and prevent social isolation.

The project will provide work experience and placements and high quality training for individuals to develop relevant employability skills to assist them to progress into sustained employment. The site will be used as a pathway for individuals to build their confidence and when they are ready for progressing into mainstream employment, they will be supported by Employment Link Workers who will help individuals to identify their chosen career options and link them to local employers.
