TV Licence

In the UK if you have a television you must hold a TV licence. As of 1 April 2019 the yearly cost for this is £154.50 and can be paid for in a number of ways:

Monthly £12.87 Quarterly £39.87

Getting Around Hartlepool

There are buses that travel around Hartlepool.

There is a railway station with links to other parts of the country.

Taxis are frequently available. The yellow coloured taxis can be hailed from the street and private hire taxis can be booked by telephone.







Driving – if you decide to drive, please follow the legal requirements. You must be in possession of a valid driver's licence, road tax, MOT certificate and motor insurance.

Shopping

Hartlepool has an outdoor market once a week on a Thursday and an indoor market, open Monday to Saturday. You can buy fresh fruit and vegetables, clothing and other useful items.

Hartlepool has a Farmers Market held at the National Museum of the Royal Navy (opposite ASDA) on the second Saturday of every month. You can buy bread, fresh fruit and vegetables, jams and cakes. The produce is all locally sourced.

Middleton Grange Shopping Centre has a wide range of shops.

A number of supermarkets are accessible across the town including: ASDA, Morrisons, Tesco, Aldi and Lidl.







Education

Education is free in the UK and by law children between five and 18 years must attend school or college.

Education for children under the age of five is not compulsory. Information about local nurseries and playgroups can be found at The Children's Hub or online.

Some two year old children are entitled to 15 hours free Nursery Entitlement, for more information speak to a member of staff at the Children's Hub, Civic Centre.

Primary school – your child should be able to start school in the September following their fourth birthday.

Secondary Schools are for children aged 11 to 16.

Colleges provide free education for children aged 16-18 years. The school year starts in September and ends in July of the following year.

Adult Education – adults can have access to further education. A fee may apply

To work or claim benefits you will need a National Insurance Number, arranged at your local Job Centre or by telephoning the National Insurance number helpline on 0845 6060 234.

Looking for Work

If you are allowed to work it is important to apply for a National Insurance number. Contact your local Job Centre for more information.

If you are looking for a job you will see adverts in local newspapers, you can search online or with an employment agency.

NHS Health Care Services

You will have free access to Healthcare and Dentists. With an exemption certificate (HC2) you can receive NHS medical treatment. This includes medicines, dental treatment and eye tests. If you do not have this certificate you must complete an application form available at a benefits office, doctor's surgery, pharmacies or refugee support agency.

You will be able to register at a local doctor's and dental surgery.

There is an Urgent Care Centre at University Hospital of Hartlepool, Holdforth Road, Hartlepool, TS24 9AH. If you are unwell and need to use the service we advise that you book an appointment first by phoning 111. If you have a minor injury you should walk into the service.

There is no Accident and Emergency service in Hartlepool. The nearest is in Stockton and is at North Tees Hospital, Hardwick, Stockton-on-Tees, Cleveland TS19 8PE.



Basic medical advice can be found at a local pharmacy.



Worship

Community Safety

The Police in the UK prevent and investigate crime and seek to protect life and property. They also work closely with communities to ensure everyone is safe.



If you require their help, do go to your local police station or telephone them for an appointment.

If there is **not** an emergency but you need to speak to the police or report an incident dial 101.

In an **emergency only**, you need to dial 999 for the emergency services.

Harassment / Hate Crime

Racial harassment means that someone is threatening you or treating you unfairly because of your race, religious belief, language, colour or ethnicity. It is against the law for anyone to harass, insult, or threaten you for any of these reasons. It can happen to you, your family, children, friends or community. If you are a victim of racial harassment, tell the police. If it happens to your child at school, encourage them to tell the teacher.

Sexual harassment / assault is illegal against both men and women in the UK. Sexual harassment means unwelcome attention such as sexual remarks, looks and advances. Sexual assault is any physical sexual action against someone's will and should be reported immediately to the police.

Sexual Assault Referral Centre (SARC) Teesside provide a 24/7 service for anyone who has experienced rape, sexual assault or other sexual abuse. The service is free, and you do not have to report to the police to receive advice and support. You can contact SARC Teesside on 03333 448283

HALO Project

Forced Marriage, Honour Based Violence and Female Genital Mutilation are all against the law in the UK. If you are suffering from any of these you can get free support from the HALO Project by ringing 01642 683 045.

Domestic violence and abuse means violence against you by family or friends in the home. It can be physical but it can also include emotional and psychological abuse.

There are organisations to help people who suffer from domestic abuse.
