2020/2021 BUDGET & COUNCIL TAX

CLEVELAND FIRE BRIGADE

2020/21 Government Funding for Cleveland Fire Authority will be £188,000 higher than in 2019/20 – an increase of 1.5%. This is the first increase for nine years. As a result of reductions in Government funding in previous years the amount of Government funding to be received in 2020/21 is £6.1m less than it was in 2013/14 – a reduction of 32%.

The proportion of the budget funded from Council Tax in 2020/21 is 45%, compared to 32% in 2013/14



As a result of reductions in Government funding in previous years we made significant changes to modernise services and achieve efficiencies.


After reflecting the inflation increase in Government funding and a Council Tax increase of 1.9% - which raises an additional £237,000 - we needed to make efficiency savings of £221,000 to balance the 2020/21 budget. These savings have been achieved by negotiating reductions in a range of contracts, including Information Technology, building security and building cleaning contracts.

The table below shows the amount payable depending on the banding of your property. **Approximately 63% of households in our area are in Band A or B.**
