Craft activity - Snake



Materials:

- White card
- Pens
- Straw
- Scissors
- Glue






Step 1: Draw a circular spiral shape for the body of the snake.



Step 2:Cut this out following the lines so the body is bouncy.



Step 3: Colour and decorate with a pattern.



Step 4:

Using the left-over card, draw the snakes face and cut out as shown.

Using this as a template draw a second shape and cut out..



Step 5:


Draw on the snake's face on one piece of the paper and colour in.



Step 6:


Glue the two pieces of paper together for the face but leave a gap in the middle.

Place the straw in the gap.



Step 7:

Glue the face to the centre of the snake's body.



Step 8:

Using the left-over card, cut out a long strip for the tongue and colour in.

Spiral the paper and glue to the snake's mouth.

Craft activity - Ladybird / Bumble Bee



Materials:

- White paper
- Red/ yellow card
- Lollipop sticks
- Pipe cleaner
- Scissors
- Glue/ Sellotape





Step 1:Get the coloured piece of card and draw around a circular object such as a tin of beans.



Step 2: Cut the circle out.



Step 3: Cut the circle in half to make the body. Rotate the pieces as shown.

Glue to a lollipop stick.



Step 4:

Decorate the ladybird.


REMEMBER- They have an equal number of dots on each wing.



Step 5:

On the white piece of paper, draw the ladybirds face as shown and colour in black.

Cut this out.



Step 6:

Glue on the ladybird's face.

Draw two little circles for the eyes, cut out and glue to the ladybird's face.



Step 7:

Cut the pipe cleaner into two equal pieces.

Curl the ends using a pencil.

Glue to the ladybird as shown.



Step 8:

You can repeat this and make a bumble bee with yellow card.

What other insects can you make?

Craft activity - Dream Catcher



Materials:

- Paper plate
- Pens
- Wool
- Scissors
- Glue / Sellotape
- Feathers
- Hole punch (optional)





Step 1: Draw a circular shape on the paper plate.




Step 2:Cut this out following the shape you have drawn. Be careful with the scissors.



Step 3: Either using a hole punch or scissors make holes around the paper plate as shown.

TIP- make sure the holes are not too close to the edge and ask an adult for help with this part if you are using scissors.









Step 4:

Decorate your dream catcher.

Step 5:

Thread the wool in different directions as shown.

Step 6:

Turn the dream catcher around as shown.

Cut long pieces of the wool and stick to the paper plate.

Step 7:

Add feathers or any other decorations you like to the dream catcher.


Step 8:

Make two holes at the top of the paper plate.

Cut a piece of wool and thread through the holes as shown.

Tie a knot at the top.

Craft activity – Easy Peg Bee



Materials:

- Pegs
- Pipe cleaners
- Small yellow beads (optional)
- Black and yellow colouring
- Googly eyes
- Glue
- Bee wing template





Step 1: Decorate your peg with black and yellow stripes.



Step 2: Fold printable in half and cut out one set of wings. Unfold each wing and glue in place.



Step 3: Glue on googly eyes.

Cut pipe cleaner in half and discard one half. Thread one bead onto each tip, fold in half and hold in place with peg (or glue them on if you prefer).

Craft activity – Watercolor Planet



Materials:

- Watercolour paint and paintbrushes
- Chalk
- Canvas / watercolour paper
- Black card
- Scissors
- Glue



Step 1:

Draw a large circle on a piece of blank canvas / watercolour paper. This is going to be your planet.

Fill that planet with colour using your watercolours. Experiment with different shapes, patterns, and colours. Carefully put your planet to one side to dry when you are done painting.



Step 2:

Using your chalk, cover your black card in white dots to resemble stars in space.



Step 3:

Go back to your planet and make sure its fully dry.

When it is, carefully cut it out.



Step 4:Put glue on the back of your planet, making sure it's all covered.




Step 5:Carefully place your planet where you want it on the black paper and press it down.

If your planet starts to curl off the paper, turn the paper over and put something heavy on it. Just make sure there is not any extra glue you can see around it. Leave the weight on it until some of the glue has dried.

Craft activity - Watercolor Resist Painting

Try out your watercolour palate and wax crayons and paint some bright summer fruit in wax crayons and then paint over the top.







Craft activity - Love Heart Origami



Materials:

- White paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Pens






Step 1: Fold the A4 paper as shown.



Step 2:Cut the strip of paper so you end up with a square.Turn it around so you have a diamond shape.



Step 3: Fold the paper in half as shown.



Step 4:

You should have a diamond shape like this with two folds.



Step 5:

Fold the top corner to the centre.



Step 6:

Fold the bottom corner to the top edge.



Step 7:

Fold the bottom right edge to the centre crease as shown and repeat for the left edge.



Step 8:

The love heart should now look like this.



Step 9:

Fold the top of the heart and the sides so the edges are flat. Decorate as you like.

Craft activity - Chalk Art Activities

Number 1

Have hours of fun by drawing a giant chalk art town and roadway all over your driveway.

Draw a twisty, turvy roadway complete with a yellow dotted line in the middle to divide the lanes. Then draw buildings, houses, trees, and whatever else you would like in your town.

Once you have it all drawn out, dig out your toy cars and drive all over their chalk art town.



Number 2

Move about with your very own chalk art "obstacle" course.

Write out instructions like "turn in a circle," "touch your toes," "jump up and down three times" along with some cute directional pictures to follow along their your custom course.

You can also draw squiggly lines to follow, straight lines to jump over, and spirals to spin on. The possibilities are endless.

Number 3

Drawing fun chalk art scenes as a character makes a fun afternoon activity – and makes for some fun photos!

Draw butterfly or bird wings and lie down in the middle as if you are the body of the butterfly or the bird and get someone to take a photo.

Try your hand at an outer space scene and pose like you are bouncing on the moon. Next, draw an umbrella to keep out some chalk art raindrops and lie down and pose like you are holding the umbrella handle. You could even draw an underwater scene and lie down on the ground and pose like you are swimming through the ocean. Really commit to the scene!



DIY Fidget Spinner Instructions

- 1. Choose which template you would like to make and cut it out!
- 2. Trace onto your cardboard old cereal packets are idea, but you will need two layers glued together
- 3. Once you have your basic shape decorate it whatever way you want doodle on it, paint on it, stick more colourful paper on it... your imagination is the limit

- 4. Take 2 or 3 1 penny coins (or coins of similar denomination from your country). You will need 2 for simple fidget spinner and 3 for all other shapes. If you wish, you can replace these coins with buttons (the heavier the better) or small bolts.
- 5. Glue your coins into place and let dry.
- 6. Use your template to help locate the centre of your fidget spinner and make a hole with a pin. Using smaller scissors, make the hole bigger until your toothpick fits in comfortably and loosely. Test the spin. If it keeps getting stuck, make the hole a little bigger

- 7. Now cut out 2-4 cardboard discs (if using cereal box cardboard you will need 4 in total, glue two together).
- 8. Again take your pin and make a small hole. Use your toothpick to widen that hole, so the toothpick fits in tightly.
- 9. Glue the first disc to the end of your toothpick.

(a hot glue gun dries quickly and is great if making this in groups)

- 10. Insert the toothpick into your fidget spinner. Take your second disc and slide down the other side of the toothpick and glue in place.
- 11. Snip off any protruding toothpick.






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



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
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

Creative Activity - Paper and pencil game: Heads Bodies and Legs

Players:

Two or more

Also known as:


Picture consequences

Players take turns in drawing a head, a body, and a pair of legs, without letting the other player see them. The point of the game is the fun of seeing the resulting pictures.

Description:


Each player starts with a small piece of paper - half of A4 or US Letter is about right.

Each player begins by drawing a head in the top third of the sheet, and then folds over the paper so just the neck is showing:




The players then exchange pieces of paper, taking care not to let the other player see their drawing.

Each player then draws a body in the centre third of the paper, joining the neck lines, and folds over the paper so just the legs are showing:




Again, the players exchange pieces of paper.

Finally, each player draws legs and feet, joining the leg lines, and folds the paper so nothing is visible.




Finally, after exchanging again, each player opens their piece of paper to reveal the whole drawing:



Variations:

An amusing addition is to add an extra stage in which each player folds the page to leave a blank strip at the bottom of the paper.

After exchanging, each player writes a name for the drawing in the blank space.




Creative Activity – Graffiti bubble letters

Step 1: Draw the letters, B A D, with a pencil.



Step 2: Now draw circular shapes around the lines. On the curved lines in B and D, break your circular bubble shapes into segments.



Step 3: Draw around the outside and inside edges with a dark marker.



Step 4: Erase the pencil lines. Add little lines inside to make the letter more bubbly.



Step 5: Redraw the letters close together, overlapping the edges. You can cut them out and move them around if you want, then trace them.



Step 6: Add 3D effects.


Creative activity - Collage


Creative activity - 3D Spring Wreath

To create your own spring wreath:

- · Carefully glue the 2 wreath designs together.
- Once the glue is dry on the wreaths, glue/tape each of the butterflies to the end of string.
- Glue/tape the other end of the strings to the bottom of the wreaths.
- · Loop and tie a piece of string through the hole on the top of the wreath so you can hang it.








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Creative activity – Make your own fortune-teller



- 1. Cut out the square above (make sure to get a parent / guardian to help you).
- 2. Valley fold paper from corner to corner, making a triangle.
- 3. Valley fold the triangle from corner to corner, making a smaller triangle.
- 4. Unfold.
- **5.** Fold the four corners to the centre of the square (where the X crosses).
- 6. Flip the paper over.
- **7.** Fold the four corners to the centre of the square (where the X crosses).
- 8. Fold and unfold the bottom edge of the square up to the top.
- 9. Fold and unfold the left edge of the square over to the right.
- **10.** Push the four corners of your square into the centre and then slide 4 fingers into the flaps of your fortune teller.

Creative activity – Art gallery

Players:

Two or more

The players take turns in naming an object which they each have to incorporate into a drawing.

Description:


This is a non-competitive picture-drawing game that's great for playing with children. It's also good as an ice-breaker with adults.

Each player starts with a blank sheet of paper. The players then take turns in naming an object, which all players must incorporate into their drawing. Players should wait until everyone has finished drawing before naming the next object.

At some agreed point, usually when one player cannot fit any more objects into their picture, everyone agrees to stop and reveal their drawings.

Example:

For example, if the players named: "Sun", "Star", "City", "Tree", and "Plane", one player's drawing might look like this:



Creative activity – Make a Cress Head



You will need from your pack;

Eggs Cotton Wool Pen Cress Seeds

- 1. Making sure not to waste the egg inside (Eggy bread anyone?!), try to crack the shell as near to the pointed end as possible
 - 2. Wash the inside of the egg shell carefully and let it dry.
- 3. Using your black pen, draw a face on the egg shell. Make it funny and silly if you like. You only need to draw the features of the face eyes nose and mouth.
 - 4. Place in the cotton wool and pour in the water to make it damp
 - 5. Sprinkle your cress seeds on top of the cotton wool
 - 6. Put your egg shell in a light place but NOT in direct sunlight.
 - 7. Water it but make sure it is not waterlogged.
 - 8. Your cress hair will start growing from its head in a couple of days.
 - 9. Once it grown how about egg and cress sandwiches all round?!
