



When are the Tall Ships coming to Hartlepool?

The Tall Ships will be in Hartlepool from Thursday 6th to Sunday 9th July 2023.

What are the Tall Ships Races?

The Tall Ships Races is an international fleet of tall ships and small ships that will be racing between five European ports between 29th June and 6th August 2023 – please see the map below.



Why are the Tall Ships coming to Hartlepool?

Hartlepool hosted the Tall Ships in 2010. The event was a great success, with hundreds of thousands of visitors coming to the town from all over the world. Hartlepool Borough Council put in a bid to the organisers to host the Tall Ships again and we are very proud that the town has been selected as a Host Port for 2023.

We want to give people another amazing event and enable as many people as possible to be involved.

Hartlepool has a rich and interesting maritime history and is the perfect place to host an event of this nature.

What are the dates of all the other Host Ports?

- 1. Den Helder Netherlands 29th June – 2nd July 2023
- 2. Hartlepool United Kingdom 6th July – 9th July 2023
- 3. Fredrikstad Norway 15th July – 18th July 2023
- 4. Lerwick United Kingdom 26th July – 29th July 2023
- 5. Arendal Norway 3rd August – 6th August 2023



Who runs the Tall Ships Races?

The Tall Ships Races is run by Sail Training International, a charitable organisation which organises races all over the world, offering life-changing experiences to young people through sail training.

What is a Sail Trainee?

A Sail Trainee is a young person aged 15-24 with no sailing experience. We are looking for young people from Hartlepool and the Tees Valley to become Sail Trainees and go on an adventure of a lifetime in 2023! The Sail trainees – who will need a vaild passport – will be recruited and allocated to a ship and will take part in the race from Hartlepool to Fredrikstad in Norway. On board they will be taught to sail as well as be required to complete all tasks to keep the ship sailing efficiently day and night.

When they reach the finish line in Norway they will attend a Crew Party, Crew Prize-Giving and take part in the Crew Parade. There will be a whole host of festivities for them to enjoy before they fly home to Hartlepool.

How many Sail Trainees is Hartlepool looking for?

We are aiming to give 100 young people the opportunity to take part. This is a life-changing opportunity not to be missed!
