Your contribution to policing

It currently costs around £197m a year to provide policing and crime services in Cleveland.

Most of this funding (£146m) is provided by the Government. The remaining £51m is raised by contributions from local taxpayers.

Pay increases for police officers and staff, plus higher costs for insurance, vehicle maintenance and kennelling of dangerous dogs will increase policing costs in Cleveland by £11m next year.

Despite additional funds from Government, this will leave a shortfall of between £2m to £3m. To ensure Cleveland Police can maintain its current level of service and to meet this shortfall, Matt has made the decision to increase the police precept by 4.61%.
