- 6. Representations by responsible bodies and/or interested parties and witnesses introduced where appropriate.
- 7. Questions by Members to responsible bodies/interested parties and/or their witnesses.
- 8. Parties may question and clarify issues raised with the consent of the Chair.
- 9. If required, responsible bodies/interested parties be given opportunity to sum up.
- 10. If required, the applicant to be given opportunity to sum up.
- 11. Members to have the opportunity to clarify any points raised. The Chair shall ask whether all parties are satisfied they have said all they wish to.
- 12. Members to go into closed session to deliberate.
- 13. Chair informs parties of their decision, with reasons.

Subject: APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE – ASHFIELD CARAVAN PARK LTD, ASHFIE LD FARM, DALTON PIERCY

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for a premises licence by Ashfield Caravan Park Ltd in relation to Ashfield Caravan Park, Dalton Piercy, Hartlepool.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 An application has been received for a premises licence in respect of Ashfield Caravan Park, Dalton Piercy.
- 2.2 The Council's Licensing Policy states that applications for premises licences will not normally be considered until the premises to which the application relates has appropriate planning permission.
- 2.3 The applicant has made a planning application and the issue was discussed by Planning Committee on 6th June 2007.
- 2.4 Due to various reasons, the planning committee deferred the matter until a later date.

3. ISSUES

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires that hearings relating to licence applications must be commenced within a specified period of time following the end of the 28 day statutory consultation period.
- 3.2 As the Council's licensing policy requires planning permission to be in place before a licence may be granted and, due to the deferral of the planning application by the planning committee, Members may consider it appropriate to adjourn the licence hearing until the planning issue has been resolved.

4. RECOMMENDATIONS

4.1 That Members adjourn the review hearing for Ashfield Caravan Park until a date to be set following the resolution of the planning application.

Subject: APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE – SHOP AND SAVE, 128 CORNWALL STREET, HARTLEPOOL

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for a premises licence in respect of 128 Cornwall Street, Hartlepool.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 Applicant: View Bar Ltd Trading As 'Shop and Save' Premises: 128 Cornw all Street Hartlepool

3. SUMMARY OF THE APPLICATION

3.1 The applicant has applied for a new premises licence to authorise the following activities: -

Supply of Alcohol (for consumption	Mon – Sat	0900 – 2300
off trade premises)	Sun	1000 – 2200

A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 1**.

- 3.2 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and fifteen representations have been received one from Cleveland Police (Appendix 2) and fourteen from Interested Parties who reside in the immediate vicinity (Appendices 3 16).
- 3.3 The representations refer to crime, disorder and anti social behaviour in the area. A number of representations, including that of the Police, also refer to there already being a number of licensed premises in the area i.e. a 'saturation'.
- 3.4 **Appendix 17** provides an indication of the exact location of these licensed premises including the premises subject to this application.
- 3.5 Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states that the 'need' for another licensed premises in a particular area is not a matter for consideration by a Licensing Committee.

- 3.6 'Cumulative impact' (i.e. where there is a significant number of licensed premises in an area) is a proper matter for a licensing authority to consider when drafting its Licensing Policy. The Guidance is silent how ever as to whether cumulative impact should be given consideration as part of an individual licence application where such an application relates to premises that are outside of any designated cumulative impact area.
- 3.7 Hartlepool's only adopted cumulative impact area is in the tow n centre but has its Southern boundary at Lister Street i.e. it does not include Cornwall Street or the immediate area surrounding Cornwall Street.

4. ISSUES

- 4.1 As relevant representations have been received within the prescribed time period, a hearing must be held for Members to consider those representations (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 The applicant has, as part of their application, agreed to a number of conditions that will be attached to the premises licence should it be granted. These conditions include: -
 - A CCTV system, of a standard approved by Cleveland Police, shall be installed at the premises. Video recordings shall be made immediately available to the Police or licensing officers on request.
 - A 'Challenge 21' scheme shall be adopted, requiring anyone w ho appears to be under the age of 21 to produce proof of age before they are supplied with alcohol.
 - A Criminal Records Bureau check shall be carried out for all staff.
- 4.3 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - i) Grant the application without amendment
 - ii) Grant the application with conditions, or amended conditions
 - iii) Reject those parts of the application that are relevant to the representations received
- 4.4 The licensing objectives are:
 - i) The prevention of crime and disorder
 - ii) Public safety
 - iii) The prevention of public nuisance, and
 - iv) The protection of children from harm

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

5.1 That Members consider the representations made by the applicant, Cleveland Police and Interested Parties and determine what aspects, if any, of the application should be granted and, if appropriate, what conditions, if any, should be attached.
