Decision:	

Under Section 120 Sub-Section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 an objection notice stating the reasons why the Crime Prevention objective would be undermined if the Local Authority granted the Licence must be given by the Chief Officer of police within the period of 14 days beginning with the day the Chief Officer of Police received the notice from the Licensing Authority under Section 120 Sub-Section 4. The Licensing Authority are not satisfied that the objection notice dated 31 July 2007 and received on 6 August 2007 did contain the reasons required under Section 120 Sub-Section 5.

The Licensing Authority therefore do not consider that the objection notice is valid and therefore the Licensing Authority must grant the personal licence to AC.
