

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To inform Members that representative's from North Tees & Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust, Hartlepool PCT & North Tees PCT and DTZ will be in attendance at today's meeting to discuss the Momentum: Pathways to Healthcare proposals.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 Under Section 244 of the NHS Act 2006, local NHS bodies have a duty to consult local Overview and Scrutiny Committees on proposals for any substantial development of the health service or substantial variation in the provision in their areas.
- 2.2 Under the Momentum: Pathways to Healthcare Programme, formal consultations are now ongoing in relation to recommendations from the Independent Reconfiguration Panel for the development of a single site hospital serving the population covered by North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust. During the period of these consultations (2 June 2008 to 1 September 2008) three meetings of Hartlepool's Health Scrutiny Forum will be held to discuss the issue, with representations from Durham Council. These meetings will be held on:-
 - 3 July 2008, 3pm (today's meeting)
 - 16 July 2008, 3 pm, Council Chamber, Civic Centre, Hartlepool
 - 4 August 2008, 11 am, Council Chamber, Civic Centre, Hartlepool
- 2.3 As the first of these meetings, arrangements have been made for representatives from North Tees & Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust, Hartlepool PCT & North Tees PCT and DTZ to be in attendance at today's meeting to deliver a presentation on Momentum: Pathways to Healthcare proposals. 






Planned care - future model






Unplanned care - current model







Unplanned care - future model








Long term conditions - current and future model






Step up/step down - current model




Step up/step down - future model






Diagnostics - current model





Integrated Care Centres


- GP services




Proposed site A - Wynyard Business Park

Transport issues

- Both proposed sites have poor public transport services
- The Trust have employed a specialist transport consultant to develop a transport strategy
- Agreement has been reached for a multi-agency approach to solve the problems
- Good transport links are essential to make the hospital accessible to our communities
- Higher levels of care closer to home will reduce the number of journeys to hospital
- Community facilities will be placed in areas accessible by public transport with car parking as approved through planning permission
- We are working with a range of agencies



Transport issues

Aims of the Transport Group:

- Provide a public transport service to the hospital
- Implement a Park and Ride service
- Promote car sharing and other green travel initiatives
- Provide sufficient car parking at the hospital
- Supplement the above with a shuttle service if necessary
- Improve roads to minimise congestion

Momentum: Pathways to Healthcare

Update on Consultation Process

Introduction

Each local NHS body has a duty to consult the local overview and scrutiny committees on any proposals it may have under consideration for any substantial development of the health service in the area of the committees' local authorities, or on any proposal to make any substantial variation in the provision of such services. This duty to consult is set out in section 244 of the NHS Act 2006 and is additional to the duty placed upon any such body that has responsibility for health services to consult and involve patients, carers and the public as an ongoing process under section 242 of the NHS Act 2006.

From the **2 June until 1 September 2008**, Hartlepool Primary Care Trust, North Tees Primary Care Trust and North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust as a joint NHS Committee will be undertaking formal public consultation on how recommendations from the Independent Reconfiguration Panel for the development of a single site hospital serving the population covered by North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust is implemented. The consultation will ask people's views on:

- NHS services in or as near to your home as possible, with only things which need to be
 done in hospital taking place there, which will give us information about the functional
 content of the hospital and community facilities.
- The location of community facilities and the new hospital.
- In addition, we will be asking how best we can bring about the changes needed to build this
 new healthcare system which will highlight key issues or concerns to be taken into
 consideration.

In order to prepare for the formal consultation, a comprehensive programme of engagement has continued through:

- 1. quarterly partnership panel meetings
- 2. service pathway focus group discussions with clinical staff and patients, carers and the public
- 3. attendance at interested stakeholder meetings
- 4. meetings with relevant Overview and Scrutiny Committees

In order to assist with planning and implementing the consultation activity, following tendering exercises three organisations have been appointed to support different elements of the process:

- Proportion Marketing Ltd has been appointed to support the overall consultation and communication planning, distribution and collation and independent analysis and reporting of responses received during the consultation period.
- LBV Television has been appointed to organise, publicise and rollout a series of Roadshow events leading up to the formal consultation.
- Shepherd-Taylor Partnership has been appointed to organise, publicise and facilitate the four summit events.

Pre-consultation

In order to inform the general public of the proposals under the *Momentum: pathways to healthcare* programme, the following is planned:

Roadshow Events

There will be a series of Roadshows held in shopping centres across the area from 20th May - 1 June 2008 to raise awareness of the proposals and to allow for a more informed consultation process. This will give people the opportunity to see a short film about the consultation, hear about the proposals and give their views.

Formal Consultation

Consultation during the 13 week period (2 June to 1 September 2008) will take place at different levels:

1 Summit Events

To enable an informed and inclusive debate, as part of the consultation activity it is proposed to hold 4 Summit events across Stockton and Hartlepool, we hope to attract approximately 100 participants to each event. The purpose of these events is to hold considered discussions with interested participants in relation to the proposals which will be outlined within the consultation document. 2 events are planned for the start of the formal consultation period and 2 towards the end of the consultation period to allow the discussions to be progressive and to shape the programme activity and to determine outcomes.

2 Public Meetings

A number of public meetings will be held over the course of the consultation period to provide the opportunity for patients, carers, members of the public and other key stakeholders to put questions and issues to representatives from Hartlepool PCT, North Tees PCT and North Tees and Hartlepool Hospital Foundation Trust.

3 Interested groups

Attendance at a number of meetings of relevant interested parties will be scheduled to enable more detailed discussions to take place around specific issues or aspects of the proposal.

Supplementary requests to meetings will be responded to accordingly.

4 Other engagement/ communication methods

Website

A website has been developed for the programme. The website will include a publications section with background information and reports about *Momentum: pathways to healthcare*. It will also include information about the consultation, including details of how people can have their say and will include an online questionnaire for people to complete. The questionnaire will also be available in paper format and will be included in copies of the consultation document and will be made available at all public events.

Throughout the consultation as feedback is received and analysed, the website will be updated and will track and illustrate debate as it develops. There will also be an opportunity to add comments throughout the process.

Process and Feedback

All comments will be recorded, collected and analysed by Proportion Marketing Ltd in order to ensure appropriate independent analysis. Results from the questionnaire and the outcomes of the summit event discussions and public events will be available on line at www.momentum-consultation.org.uk. A full copy of the final consultation report will also be available online. Paper copies will also be available on request.

We are currently exploring other options to provide feedback in addition to those outlined above.


