Purpose of the report

To provide up to date information to enable further consideration to be given to the request by Hartlepool United Football Club for the Council to transfer ownership of the football ground and an additional area of land to

the North to the owners of the football club.

**Issues Considered by the Committee** 

The report contained details of consultation exercises undertaken,

financial implications and strategic planning issues.

The Committee noted that consultation exercises undertaken had failed to reveal any significant support for the release of the Council's interest. The Committee considered that, having regard to the potential for significant redevelopment in the area of the club some time in the future, the uncertainties thus arising were such as to render sale of the Council's interest premature. They recognised that redevelopment proposals were unlikely to be clear for some considerable time and thus saw no prospect for change in the Council's position in the foreseeable future. However, they welcome the Club's proposals for improvement of the ground and encourage the Club to progress them under the Club's current land

holding.

**Decision** 

The Committee resolved to decline the Club's offer to purchase the

freehold of the premises and the land to the north.
