1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the conversion of an existing Justices Licence into a Premises Licence and the subsequent variation of such in respect of The Melbourne Hotel, Hartlepool.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 Applicant: Mr George Thomas Stuart

Premises: The Melbourne Hotel

16 Stockton Road

Hartlepool

- 2.2 The applicant currently holds a Justices Licence authorising the following activities: -
 - Sale of Alcohol (On and Off Sales)
- 2.3 The current licence permits the above activities as follows: -

 $\begin{array}{ll} \mbox{Monday} - \mbox{Saturday} & 1100 - 2300 \\ \mbox{Sunday} & 1200 - 2230 \end{array}$

2.4 In addition to the above, holding a Justices Licence also permits the supply of alcohol to residents of the hotel 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

3. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

3.1 The applicant has applied to convert the above activities into a new Premises Licence and thereafter to vary the new licence as follows: -

- 3.2 It is proposed that the premises shall remain open to the public 24 hours per day throughout the week. However, the function room and restaurant will be open to the public from 1100 until 2400 Monday to Sunday.
- 3.3 A copy of the application is attached as Appendix I.
- 3.4 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and ten representations have been received from **interested parties** who live in the vicinity (Appendices II X).
- 3.5 These representations, which refer to both existing licensable activities and proposed variations, include problems of noise emanating from the premises and its car park, traffic and car parking congestion, noise from patrons leaving the premises and noise from people congregating outside the premises.

4. ISSUES

- 4.1 As relevant representations have been received within the prescribed time period, a hearing must be held for Members to consider those representations (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 No complaints have been received by the Public Protection and Housing Division regarding noise emanating from the premises.
- 4.3 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
 - 1) Grant the application without amendment
 - 2) Grant the application with conditions, or amended conditions
 - 3) Reject those parts of the variation that are relevant to the representations received
- 4.4 The licensing objectives are:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - b) public safety:
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - d) the protection of children from harm
- 4.5 Members are reminded that they must only consider those aspects of the licence variation that are relevant to the representations received.

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 5.1 That Members grant the conversion of the Justices' licence into a new Premises Licence.
- 5.2 That Members consider the representations made by the applicant and interested parties and determine what aspects, if any, of the proposed variation should be granted and, if appropriate, what conditions, if any, should be attached.

I am writing to object to the granting of a Premises Licence in its entirety for the above named property for the reasons outlined below. This covers all current activities, extension to any activities and extension to timings.

My understanding is that Mr Stuart is currently allowed to sell intoxicating liquor only to residents and to people attending pre-booked events at private functions, within the confines of his building, with accompanying live or recorded music up to 11pm.

I now believe that Mr Stuart has applied for a licence to extend the above activities to midnight, along with the same timing for a number of other activities including film, indoor sporting events, performance of dance, provision of facilities for making music and the provision of facilities for dance.

I object under the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance.

I regularly have to put up with excessive noise well past 11pm, from activities in the car park (especially the marquee and bouncy castle), from

the building itself and from vehicles and people outside when arriving and departing. This includes loud talking, shouting and vehicle horns. We would like this to decrease, rather than increase. Additionally, we hear music from within the building, particularly since the closing in of the patio area. We therefore want to reduce the noise coming out of the building and do not want it to increase.

I object under the licensing objective of public safety.

Dropping off and picking up of people attending pre-booked events cause regular restriction to the traffic flow, leading to the increased risk of accidents on the busy Stockton Road, especially as it is situated so close to a major roundabout. A wider range of events is likely to lead to increased vehicular activity and hence increase risk to us all. Additionally, rear access to a number of properties, particularly in Marske Street are blocked by parked vehicles left by people attending pre-booked events. This is a fire risk to residents as well as a great inconvenience.

I object under the licensing objective of the protection of children from harm.

If 16 Stockton Road is allowed to sell alcohol to people other than residents or those attending a pre-booked event, it could encourage another hotspot for underage drinkers, similar to one a couple of hundred metres along Stockton Road.



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

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

I am writing to object to the granting of a Premises Licence for the above named property for the reasons outlined below.

Background Information.

As the owner-occupier of 18 Stockton Road, my home is directly attached to 16 Stockton Road, with the whole of my living and sleeping accommodation being separated from 16 Stockton Road only by a party wall.

Since the granting of the Justices Licence to Mr George Thomas Stuart last year, the quality of my life has decreased as a direct consequence of the activities that now occur in and outside of his property, 16 Stockton Road.

My understanding is that Mr Stuart is currently allowed to sell intoxicating liquor only to residents and to people attending pre-booked events at private functions, within the confines of his building, with accompanying live or recorded music up to 11pm.

I now believe that Mr Stuart has applied for a licence to extend the above activities to midnight along with the same timing for a number of other activities including film, indoor sporting events, performance of dance, provision of facilities for making music and the provision of facilities for dance.

16 Stockton Road has double yellow lines to the front, limited parking to the rear on its own land and in the surrounding residential area.

Prior to Mr Stuart's ownership last year, 16 Stockton Road was a low-key private hotel with minimal disturbing impact on the local residents. This is no longer the case.

My objections.

In summary, I object to the granting of the licence, on all 4 licensing objectives. My objections relates to

- 1. all activities covered under Mr Stuarts original Justice licence
- 2. any extension in timings and all additional activities such as provision of facilities for dance, indoor entertainment etc
- the selling of alcohol to people who are not residents or attending pre-booked events, to be imbibed in the building and for consumption off-site.

I will try and describe why, based on recent specific examples.

I object to the granting of the application under the licensing objective of **the prevention of public nuisance**, as currently I am put to great nuisance based on the activities already occurring.

For example,

On Thursday 14th July 2005, the noise coming from 16 Stockton Road was so loud at 9pm that I had to close all my windows to have any hope of hearing my television. As time went by, the noise increased and was still going on at 12.30am when I finally went to bed. It was so loud, I could not sleep despite being tired and despite having delayed going to bed in the hope, it would stop soon. I therefore came downstairs and phoned 16 Stockton Road to try and encourage them to decrease the noise inside the premises and also that coming from the people waiting in the street for taxis and private lifts.

My understanding is that the event should have been finished by 11pm, and also that Mr Stuart would have had taxis ready at that time to take

people away quickly to reduce public nuisance to residents of Stockton Road and also to Marske Street.

Friday 15th July 2005.

On this day a marquee and a bouncy castle were erected in the car park to the rear of 16 Stockton Road. Noise in the car park started at 6pm both from children talking, screaming, shouting and crying along with adults talking loudly and shouting in the car park.

As the night went on, the shouting increased as did the general noise level. The bouncy castle stopped being used at 10pm but the talking and shouting continued and in fact became louder. The event went on until at least midnight, when I went to bed exhausted. I also had to sleep in a spare room as far away from the source of the noise at the back of the property.

On this night (and subsequent nights), the gates to the car park (which was being used to its full extent by the marquee and bouncy castle) were closed and all event and staff attendees using their own cars would have had to park them elsewhere, particularly in Marske Street, The Maltings and Burn Valley Gardens.

Saturday 16th July 2005.

Around lunchtime noise from children and adults on the newly enclosed "patio" and in the car park making use of the bouncy castle and marquee began again. It then increased to such a level that I could not concentrate on paperwork that had to be done, so I went out to avoid the nuisance. I returned at 6pm, when I found the event was still going on. It continued until after midnight (the time I went to bed), when people started to come out. Then I could hear shouting from the car park, and people calling taxis, later followed by the tooting of car horns as taxis and lifts started to arrive. I would like to point out that I am 50% deaf, so if it is so noisy for me, how must the other residents of Stockton Road along with Marske Street feel?

Sunday 17th July 2005.

Around lunchtime, this started as a repeat of the previous day, but fortunately for me it started to rain at about 8pm, so it petered out, finally giving me some respite.

For 4 days in a row, the "licenced" activities at 16 Stockton Rd seriously affected my quality of life. It made me go to bed late, and even then I found it difficult to sleep. I worried about the noise and the effect it

would have on me. It also caused me anxiety about being in no fit state for a hospital appointment the following day. Current activities are having a deleterious effect on my physical and mental well-being and I feel I am being taken advantage of especially as I am elderly and living on my own. I therefore strongly object both to the granting of a licence for current activities and also to any expansion of them, both in time and type, based on the licence objective of the prevention of public nuisance, especially as 16 Stockton Road seems to be allowing more than it should already.

A number or residents from these areas complained to me (as their Burn Valley Resident Representative for Hartlepool Borough Council) about the noise, the parking and the inconvenience of not being able to get in or out of their property due to back gates being blocked. I would therefore like to object to the granting of any extension in timings and type of all parts of this licence for public safety as people's back yards are blocked by parked vehicles connected with 16 Stockton Road. This could prevent people escaping from fires, as shown in the above example. It was not a one-off incident but happened on this a number of days and nights in a row on this occasion.

I would like to object to the granting of this licence with respect to the licensing objective of crime and disorder due to people hanging around late at night (and well past the current 11pm deadline) whilst waiting for lifts and taxis, having imbibed intoxicating liquor.

As another example,

on Sunday August 7th 2005, 4 taxis were parked on double yellow lines outside 16 Stockton Road at 7pm. These taxis were honking their horns trying to attract their clients from 16 Stockton Road. Cars were parked on the other side of Stockton Road too, on the single yellow line. This had the effect of forcing traffic coming in two directions on a busy road to converge and become single file near a busy roundabout. It can only be described as an accident waiting to happen. This is another example why I would like to object to the granting of the licence in any form from the licensing objective of public safety as well as crime and disorder, as current and increased use of the premises can only lead to an increased risk of accidents, fatalities as well as general disorder.

These are only a few examples of dates when similar activities and incidences have occurred. Further ones could be supplied if you wish.

I would like to object to the granting of the licence in its entirety for the licensing objective of the protection of children from harm for 3 reasons.

Firstly, if 16 Stockton Road is allowed to sell alcohol to people other than residents or those attending a pre-booked event, it could encourage another hotspot for underage drinkers, similar to one a couple of hundred metres along Stockton Road.

Secondly, it keeps young people residing in the vicinity awake well passed their bedtime and exposes them to activities people may not wish their children and grandchildren to see. This includes my grandchildren. Thirdly, bouncy castles, especially on tarmac can be dangerous especially if unsupervised by responsible adults, or if being used by less responsible adults.

I would also like to point out that I object to the selling of intoxicating liquor to people who walk in off the street, i.e. non-residents and those not attending a pre-booked event. If this were allowed, it would lead to increased crime and disorder, increased public nuisance and increased disturbance to children trying to sleep.

Finally, I would like to raise a number of issues.

- It seems that since the granting of the last licence, the patio area to the rear has been covered in, but with no or little effective sound insulation. Noise breakout is at a level which is already beyond a nuisance level. Examples of this occurred on the 23rd and 30th July 2005 when there were pre-booked events 'inside' 16 Stockton Road, i.e. not in the car park.
- 2. Does the current and will the future licence cover entertainment activities in the car park and in the newly enclosed patio area?
- 3. How can Mr Stuart ensure doors and windows be kept closed when there are private residents staying at this hotel when simultaneously a pre-booked event with associated loud entertainment is going on? The chance of keeping all doors and windows shut when guests are staying in the hotel, is low enough in winter but incredibly unlikely in hot weather. It begs the question whether a residential hotel is a suitable venue for entertainment and the simultaneous holding of events, especially in a predominantly residential area.

- 4. How can noise be reduced to an acceptable level, especially when the car park is being used as an entertainment area? Is this allowed under the current licence?
- 5. Health and safety issues with respect to fire risk, electricity sockets being overloaded, sprinkler systems, smoke production, naked flames or any illusion of smoke and fire also cause me worry. I therefore object to the granting of all aspects of this licence on the grounds of public safety, especially as my home is attached to 16 Stockton Road.

I have lived in 18 Stockton Road for nearly 30 years, and up until the last year it has been a pleasant place to live. However, since the granting of the licence to Mr Stuart last year, and the "nuisance" I have had to endure, I can no longer say it is.

In summary

I therefore strongly object to the granting of the licence, on all 4 licensing objectives. My objections relate to

- 1. all activities covered under Mr Stuarts original Justice licence
- 2. any extension in timings and all additional activities such as provision of facilities for dance, indoor entertainment etc
- 3. the selling of alcohol to people who are not residents or attending pre-booked events both for consumption on the premises and on an off-sales basis.


