1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the variation of a premises licence in respect of 78 Church Street, Hartlepool.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 Applicant: Surfraz Akbar

Premises: 78 Church Street

Hartlepool

2.2 The current licence authorises the following activity: -

Late Night Refreshment

Monday to Sunday 23:00 - 03:00

2.3 A copy of the current premises licence is attached as Appendix I.

3. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

- The applicant originally applied for an extension of licensable hours until 05:15 a.m. 7 days a week, but following representations, the application has been amended to a request for an extension of hours until 04:30 a.m. 7 days a week.
- 3.2 A copy of the application is attached as Appendix II.
- 3.3 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and one relevant representation has been received from **Cleveland Police** (Appendix III).
- 3.4 The representation from Cleveland Police states that any extension to the current opening hours would increase problems associated with late night

revellers in the vicinity and would therefore undermine the 'crime and disorder' and 'public safety' licensing objectives.

4. ISSUES

- 4.1 As a relevant representation has been received within the prescribed time, a hearing must be held for Members to consider those representations (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 The licensing objectives are:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - b) public safety;
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - d) the protection of children from harm
- 4.3 Cleveland Police have stated that late night refreshment establishments in the area in which the premises are situated, historically have become a flashpoint for alcohol related crime and disorder. Previous incidents of crime and disorder in the area have resulted in persons being injured which consequently placed additional demands on the Police resources. In their opinion granting an extension of the current permitted hours would undermine the crime and disorder and public safety, licensing objectives.
- 4.4 Having regard to the representation received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
 - 1) Grant the application without amendment
 - 2) Grant the application with conditions, or amended conditions
 - 3) Reject those parts of the variation that are relevant to the representations received
- 4.5 Members are reminded that they must only consider those aspects of the licence variation that are relevant to the representations received.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

5.1 That Members consider the representations made by the applicant and the Cleveland Police and determine what aspects, if any, of the proposed variation should be granted and, if appropriate, what conditions if any, should be attached.

ANNEX 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. No under 18 year olds shall be permitted in the premises after midnight.
- No orders shall be taken after 03:00 hours.
- 3. No customers will be admitted after 03:00 hours.
- 4. All customers shall have vacated the premises by 03:15 hours.

Cleveland Police have received an application for a variation of the above premises licence which is a fast food take away establishment. On this basis, Cleveland Police wish to make the following representations:

The application is to extend the opening hours from 3.00am until 5.15am every day. Indeed, it is only six months ago that this premises applied for a licence until 3.00am and Cleveland Police expressed concerns regarding the late opening, but agreed to the hours on the basis that conditions were placed on the licence. Unfortunately, on this occasion, Cleveland Police do not believe that additional conditions placed on the licence will prevent undermining the licensing objectives, namely the crime and disorder and public safety objectives.

Patrons vacating licensed public houses are fuelled with alcohol which results in late night refreshment establishments becoming a flashpoint for crime and disorder. Historically, allowing such persons to loiter unnecessarily in the vicinity has resulted in crime and disorder and persons being injured.

Although each case is judged on its merits, it is not so long ago that Cleveland Police had cause to have to request that a late night refreshment shop close due to concerns regarding public

Mr Ian Harrison Licensing Department Hartlepool Borough Council DX 60669 Hartlepool safety when late night revellers attended a venue in such numbers that public safety and fear of crime and disorder were imminent unless the venue closed. There is no reason to suggest that this venue will not suffer from the same problems. This incident resulted in a drain on police resources when officers were called from other areas of the town to deal with the problem.

In the event that this application is not withdrawn, a witness statement from PC Swales will be sent in the near future.

I trust that the above information is sufficient to form the basis of police representations. Should you have any further queries in relation to this matter, you may wish to speak to PC Swales on the above number.

At present the premise is licensed to sell food from 11pm until 3.00am with a closing time of 3.15am.

The license has the following conditions attached to it;

- No person under 18 years to be admitted to the premises after midnight.
- 2. No orders to be taken after 3.00am
- 3. No customers to be admitted after 3.00am
- 4. All customers to vacate the premises by 3.15am
- 5. CCTV cameras to be installed in the premises and recordings retained for a minimum of 31 days and kept in a locked and secure cabinet The system must be maintained at regular service intérvals and record when the premises are open for business. Staff must be trained and capable of downloading CCTV evidence onto DVD disks and it shall be made available to responsible authorities upon request.
- There must be a minimum of one (1) SIA approved premises supervisor to be present from 11.00pm until closing at 3.00am within 2 months of grant of the licence.

The proposed variation is to extend licensable hours until 4.30am.

The conditions attached to the license are to remain the same

Between the 19th December 2008 and the 01 May 2009 Cleveland Police had no recorded incidents "specific" to "Mama Mia", 78 Church Street, Hartlepool.

However, between midnight and 5.00am, on Friday and Saturday evenings only, between the 1st October 2008 and 31st March 2009, in Church Street, Hartlepool, crime pattern analyses shows eighty (80) crimes were recorded.

Of these eighty (80) crimes, eighteen (18) were reported as Assaults occasioning actual bodily harm. Eleven (11) were reported as harassment, alarm or distress. Nine (9) were reported as common assault and battery. Five (5) were reported as theft from a person and five (5) Assaults on police officers. Four (4) were reported as inflicting grievous bodily harm, The remaining offences vary from three (3) sexual assaults on females to having possession of a controlled drug and fear or provocation of violence. Fifty-two(52) crimes cited a location on Church Street, Hartlepool.

Between midnight and 5.00am am on Friday and Saturday evenings only, between the 1st October 2008 and 3l March 2009, in Church Street, Hartlepool, crime pattern analyses shows seventy-nine (79) incidents of anti-social behaviour were recorded. This included severity-seven (77) incidents of nuisance, rowdiness and/or inconsiderate behaviour.

Forty-four(44) incidents cited a location on Church Street Hartlepool.

The combined total of crimes and incidents reported between midnight and 5.00am on Friday and Saturday evenings only, between the1st October 2008 and 31st March 2009, in Church Street Hartlepool, is one hundred and fifty-nine (159).

The combined total of crimes and incidents reported in the specified area between the 1st October 2008 and 31st March 2009 is two hundred and sixty eight (268) which shows the disproportionate amount of crime and disorder attributable to the night-time economy between midnight and 5.00am in the Church Street area.

Alcohol related crime and disorder in the Church Street area of Hartlepool continues to be a significant problem and takeaway premises are quite often the flashpoint for violence and public disorder when intoxicated people become involved in confrontational situations whilst waiting for food to be cooked.

There are eight(8) licensed takeaway premises within Church Street, Hartlepool.

Two(2) premises have a 2.30am closing time, three(3) have a 3.00am closing time, two(2)

have a 3.15am closing time(including Mama Mia) and one(1) has a 4.30am closing time.

It must be noted that the premise with the 4.30am closing time is a restaurant with

takeaway facility and being the only premise with such a late closing time becomes very

busy when selling takeaway food.

Police assistance to prevent disorder.

This has led to overcrowding and public safety issues and in February 2009 the premise was the subject of voluntary closure at 4.15am on a Saturday morning as the licence-holder was unable to control the 20-30 intoxicated people who had crammed into the premises demanding to be served food. The closure was only able to take place with

It is the opinion of Police that if the licensing hours of 'Mama Mia' were extended they would be subject to the same problems with overcrowding and disorder as the aforementioned premises, probably to a greater extent as this is a specific 'takeaway' premises rather than a 'restaurant'. Consequently there are significant concerns regarding potential crime and disorder and public safety.

At present 'Mama Mia' is one of seven takeaway premises in Church Street, Hartlepool that have closing times between 2.30am and 3.15am and as a result there is a lesser

concern regarding overcrowding and disorder as revellers are spread between the seven(7) premises.

This is evidenced by the fact that since the licence was issued for 'Mama Mia' on the 9th December 2008 there have been no reported incidents of crime or disorder relating directly to the premises.

The only point of note is that in the early hours of Saturday 16th May 2009 Mr Akbar was given advice by Police after allowing persons into the premises at 3.10am in contravention of the conditions of his licence.(i.e. after 3..00am)

The concern for the level of crime and disorder within Hartlepool town centre, particularly on Friday and Saturday nights, has led Hartlepool Police's District Commander Superintendent Summerbell to arrange a meeting with Hartlepool Licensees to discuss the possibility of them voluntarily reducing their licensable activities back to 3.00am in an attempt to reduce incidents of crime and disorder and increase public safety.

This was supported by those at the meeting although Mr Akbar submitted his apologies and was not at the meeting.

If this proposal is accepted Police believe there will be less drunkenness and there will be more Police resources available to deal with incidents relating to the licensable activities.

Furthermore, after licensable activities have ceased and revellers have returned home, Police resources will be free to deal with other crime issues outside the town centre, which is not the case at the moment as Police resources are needed to deal with crime and disorder in the town centre until about 5.00am with the present closing times.

The town centre has a special saturation policy which would give an application such as this intense scrutiny. At present this premise is outside of that area.

However, such is the level of concern regarding crime and disorder within the Church Street area that if the proposals suggested by Hartlepool's District Police Commander are not accepted that consideration may be given to Police making an application to extend the area covered in the Special Saturation Policy to include Church Street in an attempt to promote the licensing objectives by reducing crime and disorder and increasing public safety.

The premise currently has a licence and Cleveland Police do not take issue with the applicant or with the premise having a licence, However, the representations are made in relation to the hours proposed.

It is felt that if the premises hours were extended this would encourage revellers to remain in the town centre buying and consuming food rather than vacating the town centre.

This is obviously at odds with what Police are trying to achieve in terms of shortening the licensing hours in an effort to reduce crime and disorder and increase public safety, and as such Police must oppose the application on the grounds it does not support the licensing objectives.

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
