Decision:	
<p>1) The Licensing Authority hereby grants the amended application for the variation to the existing hours for the provision of late night refreshment until 4.30am Thursdays to Saturdays and on a Sunday night preceding a Bank Holiday Monday. All customers must have vacated the premises 15 minutes after licensable activities have ceased.</p> <p>2) The Licensing Authority was satisfied that the licensing objectives in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance could be promoted by modifying the conditions of the licence as follows</p> <p>a) a minimum of one SIA registered door supervisor solely employed in that capacity will be employed on Thursdays to Saturdays and on a Sunday night preceding a Bank Holiday from 11.00pm – 4.45am</p> <p>b) in addition to the SIA door supervisor there will be a minimum of two members of staff on duty on the days and at the times to which paragraph 2a applies</p> <p>c) the premises must have a CCTV system fitted which complies to a minimum approved standard set in partnership with Cleveland Police. The system must be maintained at regular intervals and must record whenever the premises is open for business. Recordings must be kept for a minimum of 28 days and must be made available to responsible authorities upon request.</p>
