37. Regeneration and Neighbourhoods Department: Budget and Policy Framework Initial Consultation Proposals 2010/11 (Scrutiny Support Officer)

At a meeting of the Scrutiny Co-ordinating Committee held on 16 October 2009 it was agreed that the initial consultation proposals for 2010/11 be considered on a service area basis by the appropriate Scrutiny Forum. Given the recent restructure of departments within the Council, and creation of the Regeneration and Neighbourhoods Department and Child and Adult Department, the Director of Regeneration and Neighbourhoods had been invited to the meting to provide an overarching view of the general risks facing departmental budgets and key policy issues for the year. Any comments/observations would then be fed back to the meeting of Scrutiny Coordinating Committee on 27 November to enable a formal response to be presented to Cabinet on 14 December 2009.

At this stage of the budget process Cabinet had not identified specific efficiency proposals for individual departments as it was envisaged the savings necessary to balance the 2010/2011 budget would be achieved from the Business Transformation Programme.

The Director of Regeneration and Neighbourhoods and the Mayor, who were in attendance at the meeting, reported that whilst no budget pressures or priorities had been presented for consideration this year as a result of the Business Transformation Programme the future financial position remained a major concern for the Council. The impact the future financial uncertainties would place on the Council and the services provided were highlighted. Wth a predicted 5% minimum reduction in grant funding, it was anticipated that budget deficits would continue to increase.

Members commented on the excellent role that the Economic Development Team had provided, with a very limited budget. The Director of Regeneration and Neighbourhoods agreed that the Economic Development Team were a very important in the main non-statutory resource, however, the current budget position did not allow for extra funding to be allocated.

The Scrutiny Support Officer added that a more detailed financial position would be presented to the meeting of the Forum on 21 January 2010.

38. Scrutiny Investigation into the Hartlepool Transport Interchange - Evidence from Transport Operators (Scrutiny Support Officer)

As part of the Forum's investigation into the Hartlepool Transport Interchange additional written evidence had been collated from the responses of the transport operators, Arriva North East and National Express, attached as appendices to the report which outlined their views in relation to their potential usage of the Hartlepool Transport Interchange.

39. Scrutiny Investigation into the Hartlepool Transport Interchange - Draft Final Report (Chair of Regeneration and Planning Services Scrutiny Forum)

The Chair referred Members to the draft final report following the Forum's investigation into the Transport Interchange.

The report included the terms of reference, methods of investigation, key findings in terms of the history of the development, evidence from site visit to the Interchange, current milestones, views of transport operators towards the Transport Interchange together with details of future functionality plans. The Forum had taken evidence from a wide range of sources to assist in the formulation of a balanced range of recommendations. The Forum's key recommendations to Cabinet were as outlined below:-

- (a) That signage in and around the Transport Interchange is clear and ensures users are fully aware of where amenities are located;
- (b) That the Council sets in place an agreed procedure with Network Rail to ensure that the unused platform is cosmetically enhanced and made aesthetically pleasing;
- (c) That a review is carried out with all transport operators as potential users of the Hartlepool Transport Interchange into the plans for layover areas and loading / unloading bays, with the aim of maximising out of hours usage; and
- (d) That a process is put in place to regularly review and keep Members informed of the development of the Hartlepool Transport Interchange with particular reference to usage and transport operator linkage.

Recommendation

That the draft final report, be agreed.

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To provide the opportunity, as part of the Budget and Policy Framework consultation proposals for 2010/2011, for the Regeneration and Planning Services Scrutiny Forum to consider the Regeneration and Neighbourhoods Department's pressures relating to the provision of Regeneration and Planning Services.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 At a meeting of the Scrutiny Co-ordinating Committee held on 16th October, 2009, consideration was given to the Executive's Initial Budget and Policy Framework consultation proposals for 2010/2011 to 2012/2013. At this meeting it was agreed that the initial consultation proposals would be considered on a departmental basis by the appropriate Scrutiny Forum. This occurred throughout November, 2009.
- 2.2 The comments/observations of each Forum were fed back to the additional meetina the Scrutiny Co-ordinating Committee held 27th November, 2009 and were used to formulate the formal Scruting response to Cabinet. The Scrutiny Co-ordinating Committee's formal response was received by Cabinet on the 14 December 2009 and taken into consideration during the finalisation of its Budget and Policy Framework Proposals for 2010/2011 on 22nd December, 2009. The Executive's finalised proposals were considered by the Scrutiny Co-ordinating Committee on 15th January, 2010 and repeating the process previously implemented have again been referred to the appropriate Scrutiny Forum for consideration on a departmental basis.

2.3 To assist Members of this Scrutiny Forum in the consideration of the initial proposals, arrangements have been made for the Director of Regeneration and Neighbourhoods to be in attendance and an invitation to this meeting has also been extended to the relevant Portfolio Holder(s) (attendance subject to availability).
