Purpose of Report

To consider the recommendations of the Safer Hartlepool Partnership (SHP) Community Cohesion Grants Panel in respect of applications for community cohesion funding.

Issues for Consideration by Portfolio Holder

The Portfolio Holder considered the following proposals and recommendations for community cohesion grants:-

Owton Manor West Neighbourhood Watch and Residents Association – Russian and Polish for beginners - £797

Middle Warren Residents Association – Open day - £300

Funky World Community Interest Group – Launch of centre and workshops - £5,000

St Joseph's Church Community Cultural Celebration – Multi-Cultural Event - £1,200

The Wildlife Foundation – Food growing project - £3,045

Enterprise Schools in North Hartlepool Partnership – Workshops to learn about culture and history of Hartlepool - £4,600

Central Area Youth Forum – Portable ice rink - £1,000

Owton Manor West Neighbourhood Watch and Residents Association

Spanish for beginners - £550

Headland Future Limited – Fishing and robot building projects - £1,212

These grant applications totalled £17,704.

The Portfolio Holder expressed support for intergenerational community cohesion projects. However he had reservations with using public funds to support recently established voluntary groups which had no proven sustainability. It was noted that other Local Authority grants required that groups were established for at least two years before they were eligible for grant funding. The Crime and Disorder Co-ordinator assured the Portfolio Holder that his team monitored projects that received grant aid and if projects did not achieve their aims then there was provision for claw back of the grant aid.

The Portfolio Holder was supportive of the Owton Manor West Neighbourhood Watch and Residents Association's Russian and Polish for beginners lessons but did not think that their application for funding for a Spanish for beginners class fulfilled the community cohesion criteria although he supported the idea of the Spanish for beginners lessons.

- Middle Warren Residents Association Open day £300
- St Joseph's Church Community Cultural Celebration Multi-Cultural Event - £1,200
- Enterprise Schools in North Hartlepool Partnership Workshops to learn about culture and history of Hartlepool -£4.600
- Central Area Youth Forum Portable ice rink £1,000
- Headland Future Limited Fishing and Robot Building Projects

The Portfolio Holder declined support for:-
