1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the variation of a premises licence in respect of 131/133 Elwick Road, Hartlepool.

2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

2.1 Applicant: Mr Paul David Grange

Premises: 131/133 Elwick Road Hartlepool TS26 9BQ

2.2 The applicant has applied for the following:

Supply of alcohol Monday – Sunday 0600 – 2300

A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 1**.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The application is for the variation of an existing premises licence in respect of 131 Elwick Road. The applicant intends to extend the premises so as to include 133 Elwick Road and, as a result, the licence must be amended.
- 3.2 The licence for 131 Elwick Road currently authorises the supply of alcohol between 0600 and 2300 hours seven days per week.
- 3.3 The current licence was granted by a licensing sub-committee on 23rd July 2009 following the consideration of eleven objections from Interested Parties.
- 3.4 The current application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and representations have been received from **eighty four** Interested Parties. The representations have been made on a pro forma letter, a copy of which is attached as **Appendix 2**.
- 3.5 The nature of the representations can be summarised as follows:

- There will be an increase in crime and disorder if the premises licence is granted.
- The premises are close to a local school.
- Granting the licence would increase the fear of crime in the area.

4. **ISSUES**

- 4.1 As relevant representations have been received within the prescribed time period, a hearing must be held for Members to consider those representations (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 A map, highlighting the location of the premises, is attached as **Appendix 3**.
- 4.3 The application being considered is for the extension of an existing licence for 131 Elwick Road to incorporate the neighbouring premises 133 Elwick Road. Members may wish to consider whether the application raises any new issues that were not considered by the licensing sub-committee when the licence for 131 Elwick Road was granted on 23rd July 2009.
- 4.4 The licensing sub-committee's determination is attached as **Appendix 4** along with a copy of the original report at **Appendix 5**.
- 4.5 It is understood that 131 Elwick Road has not been used to sell alcohol since the licence was granted in July 2009.
- 4.6 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - i) Grant the application without amendment
 - ii) Grant the application in part and/or with conditions or amended conditions
 - iii) Refuse the application
- 4.7 The licensing objectives are:
 - i) The prevention of crime and disorder
 - ii) Public safety
 - iii) The prevention of public nuisance, and
 - iv) The protection of children from harm
- 4.8 Members are reminded that they must only consider those aspects of the licence application that are relevant to the representations received.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I would like to object to the application for a license for the sale of alcohol pertaining to 133 Elwick Road, Hartlepool, specifically the proposed opening times of 6am – 11pm, which in my view are far to lax.

The reasons for my objection are in line with the council's own licensing objectives, which are 1. Prevention of crime and disorder; 2. Prevention of public nuisance; 3. Public safety; and 4. Protection of children from harm.

This area of the town has suffered from alcohol related problems for some time, so much so that the council's own licensing committee recently extended the Designated Public Place Orders, banning the consumption of alcohol in public, into the streets off Elwick Road. This was supported by our local neighbourhood police team and is a clear indication of an existing problem.

Furthermore the well documented problems of nearby Baden Street have been linked to alcohol related crime, disorder and nuisance. Recent efforts have seen this area begin to slowly improve and granting this license, with such broad hours of sale could jeopardise that progress.

The premises are in close proximity to Eldon Grove School and also on a bus stop from which many young people are picked up and taken to school. The result of this is that first thing in the morning many children are in the area and using the shops up and till 9am. I feel it therefore not right to expose these young people to an alcohol culture and would therefore see it as eminently sensible to restrict the hours so that sales of alcohol cannot start until 10am.

Balance north-east (an alcohol charity) recently found that people in Hartlepool have a statistically higher fear of alcohol related violence than the rest of the north-east. Allowing more cheap alcohol to be freely available, especially late at night, in a community already suffering such problems can only threaten public safety and contribute to increased alcohol related crime, disorder and nuisance.

A recent study by the council's scrutiny process found that one of the major problems in terms of alcohol related crime was the ability of people to access cheap booze from off-licences allowing them to drink more before going out. Therefore I believe that restricting the hours so that no alcohol is sold after 10pm would help combat such problems.

Finally, Hartlepool recently received a "red-flag" following the Comprehensive Area Assessment relating to the treatment of alcohol related problems. How does making more cheap alcohol available in an area where it is already prevalent help solve that problem? It actually makes it worse.

As a local resident I urge the licensing sub-committee to impose more restrictive times onto this application, in line with its own objectives, so that it will only be permitted to sell alcohol between the hours of 10am and 10pm.

The Licensing Authority hereby approves the application for a new premises licence for the sale of alcohol.

The Licensing Authority was not satisfied that the interested parties' representative, together with the interested parties present and the interested parties' written representations, disclosed strong enough reasons and evidence to demonstrate that the application would not promote the licensing objectives.

In respect of the contention that the licensing objectives relating to the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance would be undermined, it was noted that there had been no evidence presented on behalf of the police to demonstrate this.

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for a new Premises Licence in respect of 131 Elwick road, Hartlepool.

2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

2.1 Applicant: Mr Paul Grange

Premises: 131 Elwick Road Hartlepool TS26 9BQ

2.2 The applicant has applied for the following:

Supply of alcohol Monday – Sunday 0600 – 2300

A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix A**.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and representations have been received from eleven Interested Parties (see Appendices B L). One of these representations is from a local Ward Councillor and another from the Chairman of the local Resident's Association. In addition a petition has been received (Appendix M) containing 61 signatures some of whom had also provided individual representations.
- 3.2 The nature of the representations received can be summarised as follows:
 - There will be an increase in crime and disorder if the premises licence was granted.
 - Littering and loitering in the area will increase.
 - Another off-licence in the area will increase anti-social behaviour.

3.3 Following receipt of representations, and in compliance with statutory requirements, a Notice of Hearing has been sent to the applicant and those making representations.

4. **ISSUES**

- 4.1 As relevant representations have been received within the prescribed time period, a hearing must be held for Members to consider those representations (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 A map of the area is attached as **Appendix N** to allow Members to understand the proximity of the applicant's premises to other licensed premises referred to in some of the representations.
- 4.3 The Licensing Act 2003 states that representations against licence applications must refer to at least one of the Act's 'licensing objectives'. The petition attached as Appendix M is headed 'Objection to Drinks Licence' but does not refer to any licensing objectives. As such Members must determine whether the petition should be considered as a relevant representation.
- 4.4 A number of representations refer to the lack of 'need' for another off-licence in the area. Statutory Guidance that accompanies the Licensing Act states that "Need' concerns the commercial demand for another [premises]. This is not a matter for a licensing committee in discharging its functions'.
- 4.5 The applicant has agreed to a number of conditions that will be attached to the licence, should it be granted. These include the installation of a CCTV system, a 'Challenge 21' approach to under age sales (whereby anyone under the age of 21 would be required to produce proof of age) staff training and the monitoring of sales.
- 4.6 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - i) Grant the application without amendment
 - ii) Grant the application in part and/or with conditions or amended conditions
 - iii) Refuse the application
- 4.7 The licensing objectives are:
 - i) The prevention of crime and disorder

Dear Mr Harrison,

I am writing to inform you and your department of the objection I have to a licence being granted to the business located at 131 Elwick Road, Hartlepool allowing the sale of alcohol. Under the licensing objectives you have laid down as being relevant grounds for objection my objections are as follows.

Prevention of crime and disorder. There is already an Off Licence business next door to number 131 and there have been a number of incidents where the Police have been called. It is common knowledge that alcohol is the cause of a lot of crime and by introducing a second competitive Off Licence business next door this will undoubtedly lead to an increase of crime and disorder.

Prevention of public nuisance. The existing off licence business at 129 Elwick Road is often frequented by drunks, Beer cans and bottles are regularly discarded in the street and neighbouring front gardens and this can only increase with the introduction of another similar business.

Public Safety. The introduction of a second off licence business next door to the existing business will lead to extreme competition between the two businesses. This could lead to heavy discounting as one business tries to undercut the other. This will

in turn lead to an increase in the number of drunks and alcoholics frequenting the area looking for cut price booze and I believe that this will directly affect public safety. I also believe that as our medical services and hospitals are constantly overwhelmed with people suffering the effects of alcohol abuse by granting another license at this location would be irresponsible of the council.

Protection of children from harm. I believe that children growing up in this area will be harmed by the influence of these businesses. These shops are used by the local children to buy sweets and comics. To be bombarded with advertising and point of sale marketing for alcoholic drinks will cause harm in the long term.

In summation I would point out that alcohol abuse is a huge problem in this town and is often the underlying cause to most of the other social problems in the town. We don't need more shops selling alcohol we need less of them. I know that refusing this license won't solve all the problems but granting it will certainly add to them. I would just ask the council to think of residents here. No-one wants this shop to sell alcohol. We want our area protected and to be able to live peaceful lives. Thankyou.

I am writing on behalf of a number of Burn Valley residents who made representations to me objecting to the application for the sale of alcohol between the hours of 06:00 until 23:00, Monday to Sunday at the above premise.

It is clear that many residents have real concerns and anxieties about this application and its potential to exacerbate the problems of anti-social behaviour in the area. Indeed in conversation with a local PCSO, whose job it is to patrol the streets and deal with ASB problems, he is absolutely clear that the very last thing the area needs is another off-license.

It is worth noting that these objections are not a commentary on the owner, manager or any other staff who work at these premises. Sadly, however, problems associated with shops selling alcohol appear unavoidable despite the very best efforts of those in charge.

Alcohol remains one of the most serious issues being faced by our town and the hugely damaging effects of it are felt by residents in both Burn Valley and right across the town. As Chair of the Burn Valley North Residents' Association I am writing on behalf association members to object to the above application for an alcohol license.

Residents, Councillors and our local police team have all expressed great anxiety over this application as it is our view that should the licence be granted then it would exacerbate anti-social behaviour problems already seen in the area. Much as was the case in Cornwall Street on the other side of the ward such premises have the inevitable consequence of causing huge upset and unpleasantness to ordinary, law abiding residents. In short, it is neither right nor fair to grant this application.

This must be seen as a light against the owners of the premises in question as I am quite sure they are both responsible and conscientious to local residents, but sadly the link with even the best run off-licenses and anti-social behaviour and crime is simply undeniable.

We certainly do not need another off-license in the area and with local Councillors (Brash and Hall), local police officers and local residents against this application I would ask that on behalf of the Burn Valley North Residents' Association that this application be rejected.




