- 5. Questions by Members to applicant and/or applicant's witnesses.
- 6. Representations by responsible bodies and/or interested parties and witnesses introduced where appropriate.
- 7. Questions by Members to responsible bodies/interested parties and/or their witnesses.
- 8. Licence/Club Certificate holder presents their case (either personally or via legal representation) and introduces witnesses where appropriate.
- 9. Parties may guestion and clarify issues raised with the consent of the Chair.
- 10. If required, applicant/responsible bodies/interested parties to be given opportunity to sum up.

#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the review of a premises licence in respect of The Office, Church Street, Hartlepool.

#### 2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

2.1 Party requesting review: Cleveland Police

Premises to which the review relates: The Office

Church Street Hartlepool

- 2.2 The current licence authorises the following activities between 1100 and 0200 hours on Monday to Thursday inclusive and 1100 to 0400 hours on Friday to Sunday inclusive: -
  - 1. Supply of alcohol (on and off premises)
  - 2. Live Music
  - 3. Recorded Music
  - 4. Performance of Dance
  - 5. Anything similar to 2, 3 or 4 above
  - 6. Provision of facilities fro making music
  - 7. Provision of facilities for dancing
  - 8. Provision of facilities similar to 6 or 7 above (restricted to karaoke)
- 2.3 A copy of the premises licence is attached as **Appendix I**.

#### 3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Cleveland Police has requested a review of the premises licence on the grounds that there has been a constant breach of the terms and conditions of the licence and that there have numerous incidents that have undermined the licensing objectives.
- 3.2 The application for review has been advertised in the prescribed manner and additional representations have been received from Hartlepool Borough Council's Environmental Health department and The Hillcarter Hotel.

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- 3.3 Environmental Health officers have alleged that there have been numerous breaches of the premises licence condition that requires doors and windows to be kept closed whilst regulated entertainment is being provided.
- 3.4 The Hillcarter Hotel has alleged that the premises plays 'extremely loud music which can be heard up and down the whole of Church Street which is compounded by the fact that the premise has its doors fixed open all evening'. It is also alleged that on one recent occasion the music was so loud that one of the Hillcarter Hotel residents checked out of the hotel at 0130 hours as a direct result of the excessive noise coming from The Office.

#### 4. ISSUES

- 4.1 An application for the review of a licence is made under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application must be made by either a Responsible Authority or Interested Party as defined by the Act. Cleveland Police are a Responsible Authority.
- 4.2 The application must also relate to at least one of the Act's 'licensing objectives'. These are:
  - i) The prevention of crime and disorder;
  - ii) Public safety;
  - iii) The prevention of public nuisance; and
  - iv) The protection of children from harm
- 4.3 Following consideration of the application, relevant representations and any comments of the licence holder, Members may take such steps as they consider necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 4.4 The steps are: -
  - To take no action;
  - To modify the conditions on the licence (this may include altering or omitting an existing condition or adding a new condition);
  - To exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
  - To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
  - To revoke the licence.

#### 5. RECOMMENDATIONS

5.1 That Members consider the representations made by the Cleveland Police, Environmental Health, the Hillcarter Hotel and licence holder and determine what action, if any, should be taken.

## **ANNEX 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
    - Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 2. Each individual employed or otherwise engaged at the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
  - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

    (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
    (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that-
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

## ANNEX 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours includes:

New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31<sup>st</sup> December).

Permitted hours under this licence do not prohibit:

- (a) During the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises:
- (b) During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) During the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) The sale or supply of alcohol, to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's navel, military or air forces;
- (h) The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (i) The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (j) The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- 2. Registered door supervisors shall be provided for all late night openings past 23:00 and will remain present until the premises close to the public, including the drinking up period requested in the application.
- 3. The premises shall have a CCTV system that complies to a minimum approved standard set in partnership with Cleveland Police. The system will also be maintained at regular service intervals and always record when the premises is open for business. Any recordings will immediately be made available to the responsible authorities if requested.
- 4. A drugs policy shall be prepared and implemented incorporating a secured drug seizure box of the type approved by Cleveland Police. In preparing the policy

regard should be had to the guidance documents "Safer Clubbing" – guidance for licensing authorities, club managers and promoters published by the Home Office.

- 5. Persons who appear to be under the age of 18 years shall be required to produce proof of age by way of recognised proof of age card, accredited under the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) or if a proof of age card is not available a photo driving licence or passport.
- 6. Plastic glasses or toughened glass shall be used.
- 7. No irresponsible drinks promotion will be used.
- 8. Thirty minutes drinking up time shall follow the conclusion of the sale of alcohol.
- 9. There shall be maintained on the premises at all times an adequate and appropriate supply of First Aid Equipment and materials for use by patrons.
- 10. Except with the prior written approval of the licensing authority, and subject to any conditions, which may be attached to such approval: -
  - (a) No special effects, naked flames, smoke production or other process creating a risk of fire or the illusion of smoke or fire shall be used in the premises.
  - (b) No explosive or highly flammable substances shall be brought into or used on the premises.

Except with the prior written approval of the licensing authority and subject to any condition, which may be attached to such approval, no special effects shall be used or displayed given on the premises, which consists of or includes the use of lasers. Applications for consent, giving detailed descriptions of the equipment to be used and details of the event, including dates and times shall be made not less than 28 days before the date of the event.

- 11. The licensee shall ensure that the electrical socket outlets in the licensed premises to be used with electrical equipment provided for the purposes of entertainment shall be protected by a residual current device being a 30mA tripping unit.
- 12. In the event of a fire alarm being activated a suitable relay should be provided so that the electrical power supply to all sound amplification systems in the licensed premises shall be immediately intercepted so that the alarm can be head in all parts of the licensed premises.
- 13. The external doors and windows to the parts of the premises used for regulated entertainment are not to be left open whilst regulated entertainment is being held on the premises.
- 14. Children are prohibited entry to the premises whilst any 'adult entertainment' is being provided.
- 15. Children shall vacate the premises before 20:00 hours.
- 16. Customers shall not be allowed to leave the premises with drinks in glasses/bottles.

- 17. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
  - (i) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence
  - (ii) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there
  - (iii) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from where there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
  - (iv) The bar is in the railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licenœ is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

No child under 16 years of age shall be admitted to any other part of the licensed premises unless accompanied by an adult.

18. This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933.

- 3.2 The application for review was advertised in the prescribed manner and additional representations were received from Hartlepool Borough Council's Environmental Health department and The Hillcarter Hotel.

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- 3.3 Environmental Health officers alleged that there had been numerous breaches of the premises licence condition that requires doors and windows to be kept closed whilst regulated entertainment is being provided.
- 3.4 The Hillcarter Hotel alleged that the premises played 'extremely loud music which can be heard up and down the whole of Church Street which is compounded by the fact that the premise has its doors fixed open all evening'. It also alleged that on one recent occasion the music was so loud that one of the Hillcarter Hotel residents checked out of the hotel at 0130 hours as a direct result of the excessive noise coming from The Office.
- 3.5 Following the application for review the licence was transferred from Miss Rachael Gilfoyle to the Haygarth Trading Company, the licensed hours were reduced from 0400 hours to 0200 hours and conditions were added to the licence to electronically limit the volume of amplified music.
- 3.6 At the licensing sub-committee meeting on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2010 Members were advised of the changes to the licence and all parties requested that the matter be adjourned for two months to allow for their impact to be monitored.
- 3.7 The sub-committee agreed that consideration of the review be adjourned until 'on or around 1<sup>st</sup> February 2011'.

## **ANNEX 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

1. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours includes:

New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31<sup>st</sup> December).

Permitted hours under this licence do not prohibit:

- (a) During the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) During the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) The sale or supply of alcohol, to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's navel, military or air forces;
- (h) The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (i) The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (j) The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- 2. Registered door supervisors shall be provided for all late night openings past 23:00 and will remain present until the premises close to the public, including the drinking up period requested in the application.
- 3. The premises shall have a CCTV system that complies to a minimum approved standard set in partnership with Cleveland Police. The system will also be maintained at regular service intervals and always record when the premises is open for business. Any recordings will immediately be made available to the responsible authorities if requested.

## 3.1 Appendix 1

- 4. A drugs policy shall be prepared and implemented incorporating a secured drug seizure box of the type approved by Cleveland Police. In preparing the policy regard should be had to the guidance documents "Safer Clubbing" guidance for licensing authorities, club managers and promoters published by the Home Office.
- 5. Persons who appear to be under the age of 18 years shall be required to produce proof of age by way of recognised proof of age card, accredited under the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) or if a proof of age card is not available a photo driving licence or passport.
- 6. Plastic glasses or toughened glass shall be used.
- 7. No irresponsible drinks promotion will be used.
- 8. Thirty minutes drinking up time shall follow the conclusion of the sale of alcohol.
- 9. There shall be maintained on the premises at all times an adequate and appropriate supply of First Aid Equipment and materials for use by patrons.
- 10. Except with the prior written approval of the licensing authority, and subject to any conditions, which may be attached to such approval: -
  - (a) No special effects, naked flames, smoke production or other process creating a risk of fire or the illusion of smoke or fire shall be used in the premises.
  - (b) No explosive or highly flammable substances shall be brought into or used on the premises.

Except with the prior written approval of the licensing authority and subject to any condition, which may be attached to such approval, no special effects shall be used or displayed given on the premises, which consists of or includes the use of lasers. Applications for consent, giving detailed descriptions of the equipment to be used and details of the event, including dates and times shall be made not less than 28 days before the date of the event.

- 11. The licensee shall ensure that the electrical socket outlets in the licensed premises to be used with electrical equipment provided for the purposes of entertainment shall be protected by a residual current device being a 30mA tripping unit.
- 12. In the event of a fire alarm being activated a suitable relay should be provided so that the electrical power supply to all sound amplification systems in the licensed premises shall be immediately intercepted so that the alarm can be head in all parts of the licensed premises.
- 13. All external doors and windows shall be closed whenever live music is being provided. When recorded music is being provided, external doors and/or windows may remain open only if the music is being limited by means of an electronic noise limiter set at a level agreed with the Hartlepool Borough Council's Environmental Health Department.

## 3.1 Appendix 1

- 14. Children are prohibited entry to the premises whilst any 'adult entertainment' is being provided.
- 15. Children shall vacate the premises before 20:00 hours.
- 16. Customers shall not be allowed to leave the premises with drinks in glasses/bottles.
- 17. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
  - (i) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence
  - (ii) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there
  - (iii) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from where there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
  - (iv) The bar is in the railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

No child under 16 years of age shall be admitted to any other part of the licensed premises unless accompanied by an adult.

18. This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933.

Cleveland Police wish to make an application to review this premises for the following reasons:

Since February 2010, the premises has become a concern to Cleveland Police.

There has been a constant breach of licensing conditions, mainly failure to adhere to the CCTV condition placed upon the premises licence. On 26<sup>th</sup> March, a Section 19 Criminal Justice and Police Act notice was served on the premises for breach of the condition. Indeed on 28<sup>th</sup> March 2010, PC Swales advised the then DPS, Lee Haygarth that if he failed to comply with the CCTV condition, a review of the Premises Licence would be considered. On the same evening, it was observed that the fire alarm system was faulty, potentially putting the safety of persons at risk. Mr Haygarth advised PC Swales that he did not want to be the DPS at the premises.

On 30<sup>th</sup> August 2010 at 01.00 hours, there were no Door Supervisors on duty, despite the fact that Door Supervisors should have been present from 23.00 hours. Graham Kelly, father of the tenant of the premises told Cleveland Police that the door company would be arriving when another premises had closed. This was later denied by the Door Company who said that the premises said they would let them know if they were required. On the same evening, a person was observed leaving the premises with glasses.

There have been numerous occasions when the premises have had to be warned by police regarding noise emanating from the premises. The Office is situated near to a residential area. Nearby premises have also complained about the noise to police. Despite the warnings, noise problems continue despite the change of Premises Licence Holder and DPS.

There has been a constant change of Designated Premises Supervisor who have also been the DPS at other premises. On 1st April 2010, Michael West advised police that he was the new DPS on a short term basis. By 18th July 2010, the DPS had changed to Sandra Twidale. However, on 26th August, Sandra Twidale resigned. Having been in the role for just over a month, Ms Twidale advised Cleveland Police that the running of the premises was "poor".

Following on from Ms Twidale, Steven Awford was put forward as the DPS. However, he was also running other premises and when questioned by police following his resignation, he advised police that he did not want to be associated with The Office or its clientele. Following this, Chris Kelly submitted a request for a particular person to be DPS of the premises. This person was totally unsuitable (and held a criminal record) therefore, Mr Kelly was advised accordingly. Indeed at a later date, this proposed DPS was later found to be causing a disturbance in the premises.

On 12 September, two 17 year old youths advised Cleveland Police that they had been drinking in The Office and had not been challenged by anyone when entering the premises.

In addition to the above, there have been a number of incidents whereby persons have been assaulted either in the premises, or assaulted having left the premises.

In a period of eight months, Cleveland Police have had cause to warn the premises on various matters on numerous occasions. These warnings have gone unheeded, hence undermining the above licensing objectives. For this reason, Cleveland Police have had no alternative but to make an application for review of the Premises Licence.

were unable to provide it. It transpired that there was no CCTV and therefore no supporting evidence. This was a contributing factor to the fact that the Police were unable to pursue a complaint of assault and the offender was then allowed to go on and commit further offences against the person.

On the 19th March 2010 at 01:10 a male was assaulted inside of The Office causing numerous facial injuries. Officers again attended the premises but there was no CCTV no witnesses coming forward. Due to the injuries sustained the IP was unable to identify the suspect and the offender was never located. The consequence of which meant the offender was never located and another serious offence was allowed to go undetected.

On the 26th March 2010 Christopher KELLY was issued with a section 19 closure notice by officers from Hartlepool police due to there being no CCTV system as specified in their licences. The section 19 closure notice was issued as a result of CCTV being unavailable when requested for the 20th March 2010 for officers from Hartlepool CID. This was to identify with Christopher KELLY the failings of his premise and to ensure that they were rectified and that the licensing objectives were promoted. This incident is referred to in the statement of Pc SWALES.

On 28th March 2010 Hartlepool Police attended the premise in company with Cleveland Fire Brigade. At this time there was a fault indicated on the fire alarm system. Voluntary closure was requested and agreed by Graham FRIEND (bar manager).

On the 30th March 2010 Pc SWALES spoke to the then DPS, Lee HAYGARTH, reference the CCTV and the investigation carried out Cleveland Fire Brigade. He was informed of the possibility of a review if the issue around the CCTV wasn't rectified. This is referred to in the statement of Pr SWAKES

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On the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2010 Hartlepool Police again attended the premise and spoke to Graham KELLY (father of Chris Kelly) reference the CCTV. The CCTV was viewed and deemed not up to the standard expected by Cleveland police with regards to facial recognition and coverage.

On the same date Michael WEST informed Hartlepool Police that he would be the new DPS. He was informed of the issued already outlined and stated that he was only going to be the DPS for a few weeks as he 'needed the money'.

This change of DPS was one of many showing the inconsistencies in Designated Premises Supervisors and the lack of confidence in the business.

On the 18<sup>th</sup> April 2010 Detectives from Hartlepool CID requested CCTV from The Office with regards to another serious assault which had taken place inside the premises. A door supervisor had been assaulted in Church Street and the offender made off through The Office. Numerous telephone messages left with Christopher KELLY and to date there is still no CCTV received and therefore further a breach of their licence.

On 26th May 2010 Christopher KELLY (who was also the registered tenant of Reds/ Scarlets bar in Church Street) had his tenancy terminated by his landlord.

On the 18<sup>th</sup> July 2010 Rachael GILFOYLE introduced herself to officers from Hartlepool Police as the new manager. Sandra TWIDALE, who was the DPS for Changes public house, became the new DPS. At this time GILFOYLE was warned reference the noise pollution coming from the bar and an entry made in the officers PNB which was signed By GILFOYLE. This is referred to in the statement of Pc SWALES.

On the 26<sup>th</sup> July 2010 officers spoke to TWIDALE who stated that Jackson Security would be providing the required SIA door staff. She was informed of the breach 26<sup>th</sup> March 2010

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(no CCTV) the officers PNB was signed. This is referred to in the statement of Pc SWALES.

On the 8<sup>th</sup> August 2010 at 00:30 hours officers attended The Office and asked Rachael GILFOYLE and Christopher KELLY to turn the music down as it could be heard across the road. It was pointed out that Church Street is also residential and that there a hotel directly opposite it expected that all premises pay respect to that fact. A PNB entry was made and signed to this effect. The entry was made in the PNB of Pc HUSSAIN, exhibit YH/1.

On the 9<sup>th</sup> August 2010 at 00:35 hours officers again had cause to attend The Office and request Daniel KELLY (manager) to turn the music down. A further PNB entry was made signed to that effect. The entry was made in Pc HUSSAIN'S PNB, exhibit YH/2

On the 10<sup>th</sup> August 2010 at 03:35 hours a group of males who had been in the office where asked to leave the area on several occasion by Police. Upon leaving the area one member of the group exposed himself before making off. As they left the area the CCTV operator followed them and captured one of the males assault another male knocking him to the floor.

The Office is attracting specific types of cliental who are drinking to the extreme before going on to commit offences against the person. The Office is assisting in maintaining the high levels of violent crime in the NTE by allowing potential trouble causers to get drunk in their premise. Several Police Officers had to be used in order to defuse this particular situation which meant that they could not provide support for the other premises within Church Street.

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On the 14th August 2010 at 01:10 hours officers again had cause to attend The Office and request Daniel Kelly to turn the music down. A further PNB entry was made and signed to that effect. The entry was made in the PNB of Pc HUSSAIN'S PNB, exhibit YH/3.

On the 25th August 2010 TWIDALE informed Pc Swales that she was intending to resign as the DPS.

Just over a month after taking over as the DPS, TWIDALE resigned.

On the 26th August 2010 I spoke with TWIDALE reference her resigning as the DPS. She stated that the day to day running of the premise was poor. She said that the DJ would constantly turn the music up too loud despite being told by the police not to and that there were occasions when there would only be one door supervisor.

The same day Mr Graham KELLY (father to Christopher KELLY) submitted a request for Michael CRANNEY (also the DPS of 2 other public houses in Hartlepool) to become the new DPS. At this time Graham KELLY was acting on behalf of his son and Rachael GILFOYLE who were both away on holiday.

Friday the 27th August 2010 I spoke to Michael CRANNEY who stated that he had regretted taking on the DPS role at The Office and that he was going to withdraw it. He said that he had heard bad things about the running of the business. He withdrew his application.

That same day Graham KELLY submitted a request for a further DPS who was well known to Hartlepool Police for causing public order situations and being issued with directions to leave the town centre due to his volatile behaviour. This was strongly objected by Hartlepool police. Given that it was bank holiday weekend Graham KELLY informed me he

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was desperate to open the premise hence the inappropriate suggestion of the proposed DPS.

At closing that day Graham KELLY submitted a request for Steven AWFORD (DPS of The Staincliff, Seaton Crew). This request was approved by Hartlepool police.

The same evening officers attended The Office and spoke to Daniel KELLY. Steven AWFORD was not present but attended upon request to discuss noise issues.

On the morning of the 29<sup>th</sup> August 2010 at 01:48 hours officers spoke to Daniel KELLY reference the noise. Hartlepool Borough Council noise abatement team were present and requested the noise be turned down as it could be heard beyond the premise. A PNB entry was made and signed to that effect. This is referred to in the statement of Pc SWALES.

On Monday the 30<sup>th</sup> August 2010 at 01:06 hour officers attended The Office and observed that there were no door supervisors. The license stipulated that there should be SIA door supervisors from 2300 hours and therefore this shows a further breach of their licence. There were also persons leaving the premises with glasses due to this fact. Officers were also requested to assist Daniel KELLY remove a male from the premise who was refusing to leave. Officers observed that it was in fact the male that Graham KELLY had requested to be DPS but which was opposed by Hartlepool Police. Upon see officer the male decided to leave of his own accord.

Graham KELLY stated that he had contacted Jackson Security and they said that they would be attending at 01:30 hours when MGM (another licensed premise) had closed. Graham KELLY stated that he decided to close the premise of his own accord, albeit over two hours after he should have had door supervisors. A PNB entry was made and signed by Graham KELLY. This is referred to in the statement of Pc SWALES.

On Thursday the 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2010 Steven AWFORD was interviewed by officers from the Alcohol Licensing Unit at Hartlepool police office reference him resigning as the DPS of The Office and also about the events of the previous weekend. He stated that he didn't want to be associated with The Office or it's cliental and didn't understand the issues associated with the premise. He said had he know that he wouldn't have agreed to be the DPS for that weekend.

The same day Pc Hussain spoke to Kevin JACKSON of Jackson Security reference there being no door supervisors on the evening of the 29<sup>th</sup> August 2010. He stated that Daniel KELLY had told Kevin that he would phone him if he required any door supervisors. He stated that neither him nor any of his staff heard from the Daniel KELLY and therefore didn't provide any staff. This incident is referred to in the statement of Pc HISSAIN.

On the 11th September 2010 AT 23:40 officers had cause to attend The Office and request them to turn down the music. A PNB entry was made and signed by Pc HUSSAIN and can be exhibited as YH/4

On the same night at 01:45 hours on the morning of the 12<sup>th</sup> September officers spoke to two young males, both aged 17 who claimed have been drinking in The Office. There was door staff on at the time but neither could say who let them in. Details were obtained of the young males.

On Saturday the 18<sup>th</sup> September 2010 at 0154 hours I attended The Office and spoke to Rachael GILFOYLE and Daniel Kelly. At this time the double doors on the front of the premises was open and the music was blasting out and could be hear at the top of Church Street some 200 yards away. I had to shout at the door staff as the music was so loud and requested them to ask Rachael to come to the front of the premises and speak to me. She

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attended in company with Daniel and I requested them to turn the music down as it was too loud and clearly causing discomfort to the door supervisors. I also asked them to close the double doors and use the main entrance which meant that revellers would walk through an air lock type system trapping the noise inside. The music was turned down and the double doors were closed to the obvious relief of the door staff.

Given that The Office is situated on a main strip of bars and clubs there is also a lot of other premises who open and operate at a similar time.

On numerous occasions staff from the Hillcarter, which is situated directly opposite, have attended and asked for the noise to be turned down due to complaints from the residents. Both the managers from the Hillcarter have attended The Office and asked for the noise to be turned down. See statement of Pc HUSSAIN.

Church Street does not only accommodate for licensed premises but it is also a residential street with a hotel.

The Office have on numerous occasions as outlined above, flaunted their lack of respect for other businesses and residents. Not only have they annoyed their neighbours but they have also failed to adhere to the conditions of their licence.

The Office appears to be operating at minimum outlay at all costs, even that of the safety of revellers. This is all in order to make money at all costs without taking the precautions stipulated on their licence and ensuring that the licensing objectives are adhered to.

The fact that they have had several DPS in the last 7 months which appears to show that no-one with the slightest knowledge of The Office are willing to take control and help promote the licensing objectives.

The incidents above-show serious breaches of the licensing objectives as outlined below;

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Prevention of crime and disorder.

The Office, in its current state is a public nuisance. The noise is a constant contributor to

this; as are the revellers who leave The Office and go onto to assault other revellers

enjoying their evening. Constant warnings have gone unheeded.

Public Safety.

Cleveland Fire Brigade, the Noise Abatement Team and Cleveland police have all had to

intervene at some stage with regards to Public safety. On too many occasions to say that

they were one off incidents.

The prevention of public nuisance.

The type of cliental that The Office attracts means that there will always be a public

nuisance. The Noise is a constant contributor to this; as are the revellers who leave The

Office and then go on to assault other revellers enjoying their evening.

The protection of children from harm.

Officers have shown that there are underage sales taking place inside the premises. If The

Office is operating a challenge 21 policy which they say they are then why are 17 year old

males drinking inside when they are clearly not old enough? They have a condition on their

licence to challenge persons under 18 and this is not happening.

There have been numerous interventions by Hartlepool Police in an attempt to remedy the

issues which have been highlighted above, none of which appeared to have worked.

Despite Police action none of the issues appear have been resolved hence Hartlepool

Police initiating a review of the premises.

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I can only assume that the incidents which have been recorded and detailed above are only a small percentage of what actually does occur in The Office.

As a result of Police presence at The Office other premises who require our attention are also suffering. The ripples of which stem to the wider community because when we are dealing with incidents in The Office then we can not direct our resources to the rest of the community. The results of which are an increase in offences, more victims of crime and increase in the fear of violence within the Night Time Economy.

It appears Mr KELLY'S desire is to make as money in the shortest length of time, cutting as many corners as possible in the process means that this can only be at the expense of the tax payer and safety of the public. It is the belief of officers at Hartlepool Police that if something is not done to address the issues then it is only a matter of time for there a serious incident and an innocent member of the public is severely or even fatally injured.

At 14:35 hrs on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2010 at Hartlepool Police Station, whilst on duty in company with the witness, Acting Chief Inspector 442 Green, together we spoke with Christopher KELLY.

KELLY stated the owners of The Office are "HORNSY" but is leased via Greig Cavey Estate Agents, South Road, Hartlepool. KELLY stated he was taking over the tenancy from Lee HAYGARTH, HAYGARTH Trading Company, Bensway House, Usworth Road, Hartlepool, TS25 1PD.

Kelly further stated that Graham FRIEND will be the "Barman", Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor for The Office.

At 14:22hrs on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March 2010, at The Office, Church Street, Hartlepool, whilst on duty, I spoke with Christopher KELLY (sub lease holder) regarding a section 19 closure notice regarding breach of premises licence, (no closed circuit television recording facility, or CCTV not maintained/not in good working order). I requested CCTV evidence from

23:45hrs on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2010 on behalf of DC HOLBORROW and DC MOON. I observed the CCTV system was not working, not in good working order, not maintained. NO VHS or digital recording system present.

About 12:25hrs on Wednesday 26th May 2010 at Hartlepool Police Station, I received a telephone call from Christopher SANDERSON, STR Enterprises Limited, 30 The Oval, Benton, Newcastle Upon Tyne, NE12 9PP, "Landlord" at another nearby premises in Hartlepool, stating that they had exercised their right under the tenancy at will agreement

with Christopher KELLY (tenant) to change the locks at the premises because of failure to pay rent and insurance.

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
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
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

At 01:10 hours on Sunday 14th August 2010 I was on uniformed foot patrol on Church Street, Hartlepool, as part of licensing patrols to reduce drink related violence and anti social behaviour in the area.

At this time I had cause to attend The Office public house due to the music been played inside the premises could be heard outside the premises. I had already spoken to the manager Danny Kelly in relation to the loud music the previous weekend and had advised him accordingly.

Upon arrival I spoke with Danny Kelly and advised him that he was either to close the main doors and open the side door of the premises to allow customers entry in and out of the premises, or he was to turn the music down. I further warned Danny Kelly that once I left the vicinity of the premises and upon my return I found that the music had been turned up and could be heard outside onto the main street, I would request an inspector to attend the premises seek to close the premises down under section 161 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Mr Kelly agreed to close the main doors and open the side door for the remainder of the night, my pocket note book was signed to this effect by Danny Kelly, reference number 16454 applies, page 75, which I exhibit as YH/3



At 23:45 hours on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> August 2010 Mr Awford attended The Office public house in his capacity as DPS. The Office was quite at the time and appeared in order, Mr Awford left The office at midnight. Mr Awford stated that he didn't attend The office on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> August 2010 or Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> August 2010, however Mr Graeme Kelly had his contact details and had informed Mr Awford if there was any problems at The Office he would contact him. Mr Awford further stated as he had not heard from Mr Kelly he assumed all was in order at The Office.

At 13:00 hours on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> August 2010 Mr Awford stated that he received a telephone call from Graeme Kelly. Mr Kelly had informed him that on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> August 2010 leading into morning of Monday 30<sup>th</sup> August 2010 no door staff had turned up for work, due to this he was unable to keep The Office public house open. Mr Awford stated that as part of the The Office licensing conditions they must have 2 x door staff working on the doors from midnight on days the open to sell alcohol. Mr Awford stated that as he had been informed by Mr Kelly that as soon as no door staff attended he closed his premises at midnight Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> August 2010 morning of Monday 30<sup>th</sup> August 2010. Mr Awford further stated as far as he was concerned Mr Kelly closed the premises, therefore there was no issues for him as the DPS.

Mr Awford stated that on Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> August 2010 he e-mailed Hartlepool council licensing department and resigned as DPS for The Office public house from immediate effect. Mr Awford stated that he didn't want to be associated with The Office public house.

Mr Jackson informed me that he provides security door staff to licensed premises, including The Office public house. 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

hotel. Also on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor is a bar for residents and general members of the public to use.

Majority of clients who stay at the hotel during the week, Monday to Friday are business clients who work in the vicinity of Hartlepool. They are generally up at 7am on the morning, I have received complaints from clients who have stayed at the hotel in relation to the noise levels of the music coming from The Office public house.

The Office public House is situated on Church Street, Hartlepool and is directly opposite

The Hillcater. The complaints I have received from clients have been on Thursday and

Friday nights. I have witnessed the music being very loud coming from The Office,

however as police have attended the music level has been turned to a lower level.

Due to there being minimum police presence on Church Street on Thursday and Sunday nights. The music level from The Office has been extremely loud on a number of occasions. I have attended The Office myself and spoken with Christopher Kelly who is the licensee of The Office and requested him to turn the music noise level down. Informed Mr Kelly that residents staying within the hotel are business personal and are up early each morning for work. They are unable to sleep due to the noise coming from his establishment and are complaining. Mr Kelly has ignored my request on turning the music down. On occasions customers staying within the hotel have took it up on themselves to attend The Office, to ask them to turn the music down, however their requests have been ignored. On occasions I have contacted the police in relation to the excessive noise coming from The Office. I was given a contact number for the noise abatement team. I was informed they only operate Friday and Saturday nights. I have spoken to the Manager Caroline Hedley regarding the excessive noise coming from The Office, she has also complained to The Office regarding the noise being unacceptable coming from inside their

premises. Again they have ignored requests Miss Hedley has made in relation to them keeping their music to a level which doesn't affect any other premises on Church Street including our premises.

I appreciate that on a weekend Church Street is busy with revellers enjoying themselves, however all other establishments maintain their music to a level that doesn't affect another drinking establishment. The Office predominately keep their music very loud, ignoring requests from myself and Miss Hedley to turn their music down.

I can confirm that I have spoke with Mr Christopher Kelly and his brother Mr Daniel Kelly regarding the noise levels coming from inside their premises and complaints I have received from customers. However I have not recorded the time and date I have spoken with them.

I personally keep the music form inside my premises at a level that can only be heard inside the premises and not to any other person on Church Street. The Office should also keep their music to a level that can only be heard within their premises, and should not affect any other businesses in the vicinity or be heard outside of their premises.

This is a weekly occurrence me having to speak to The Office in relation to the loud music coming from their premises

way into the public house although it is rarely used as an entrance now.

Because of my DALU duties I am aware of a number of complaints regarding excessive noise from The Office. I am also aware of a number of interventions made by the Local Authority to address the issue and of frequent interaction with the premises management by my staff in order to tackle the din from The Office. At the time of this incident there had been no appreciable improvements; those that were implemented were, as far as I could tell simply the result of police intervention and not connected with any desire to actually improve the management of the premises or the comfort of residents in the area. There appeared to be a collective lack of desire by anyone connected with the management of The Office to improve their arrangements for noise reduction. In fact I would go so far as to say that the refusal was wilfully defiant.

I approached the premises and spoke to a person I know now to be Daniel Kelly, bn. 07.10.89. Mr Kelly was, he alleged, performing the role of Manager of the Premises. I pointed out the extreme level of noise, that the open double doors were exacerbating the problem and requested him to close them and start to use the airlock to reduce the noise. Mr Kelly agreed to do so and signed PNB 14487, page 72 to that effect.

I took no further part in the incident.
