Subject: APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE,

239 RABY ROAD, HARTLEPOOL

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for a new premises licence in respect of 239 Raby Road, Hartlepool.

2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

2.1 Applicant: Mr Peter Gupta

Premises: 11 Danby Grove

Hartlepool TS25 1EL

2.2 The applicant has applied for the following activities: -

Supply of Alcohol (Off Sales)

Monday to Sunday 0900 - midnight

A copy of the application is attached as Appendix 1.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and representations have been received from four local residents, Hartlepool Borough Council's Trading Standards Service and Hartlepool Borough Council in its capacity as licensing authority (attached as Appendices 2-7).
- 3.2 The representations from local residents refer to crime, nuisance and public safety.
- 3.3 The Trading Standards Service has requested that the applicant agree to a number of conditions being imposed on the licence specifically the installation and operation of a CCTV system and procedures to prevent the sale of alcohol to children.
- 3.4 The representation from Hartlepool Borough Council in its capacity as licensing authority relates to the fact that the trading hours requested in the

application go beyond those stated in the Council's Licensing Policy as being suitable for residential areas. The licensing authority believes that granting the proposed licence will lead to an increase in nuisance for residents who live close to the premises concerned.

3.5 It is understood that the applicant, Mr Gupta, has operated this property as an off-licence previously, but enquiries would suggest that this was some time prior to 1999.

4. ISSUES

- 4.1 As relevant representations have been received within the prescribed time period, a hearing must be held for Members to consider those representations (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 Members are reminded that whilst a number of the representations from local residents refer to the fact that there are already a number of licensed premises in the area, the 'need' for another off-licence is not something that can be taken into account when considering whether a new licence should be granted.
- 4.3 The Trading Standards Service has requested that the applicant agree to a number of additional operating procedures. These relate to the implementation of a 'Challenge 25' age verification policy, a till prompt system that will alert shop staff whenever alcohol is being purchased, a 'refusals book' where staff would record any failed alcohol purchases by children and the installation of a suitable CCTV system,
- 4.4 The representation made by the Principal Trading Standards & Licensing Officer on behalf of the licensing authority draws attention to the Council's current Licensing Policy which states: -
 - 4.25 The licensing authority does not accept that longer opening hours have been a benefit to Hartlepool but rather that they place an undue and unnecessary strain on the local transport infrastructure, Accident & Emergency services and law enforcement agencies and creates a nuisance for those residents who are affected by revellers returning home during the early hours.

Shops, stores and supermarkets will in general be licensed to provide sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises at any time when the retail outlet is open for shopping but licences for before 9:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. in residential areas will generally be refused....

And

- 5.4 The licensing authority is aware of the problems that the sale of alcohol can cause for local residents and, for this reason, applications for licences in residential areas will generally only be granted if the operating hours fall within 0900 hours and 2200 hours for off licences.
- 4.5 Members are asked to note that the Licensing Policy does not create a concept of 'automatic refusal' but rather that every application must be considered on its individual merits, taking into account the licensing authority's position as expressed in its policy and all other evidence presented.
- 4.6 Members may wish to note that another premises in Raby Road, the 24 Hour Store, had its licence reviewed in 2009 following complaints from a number of local residents who alleged that the late opening hours were causing significant nuisance. This was particularly the case on Saturday and Sunday nights when the main supermarkets close at 2200 hours or earlier and alcohol could only be bought from those estate premises that stayed open later.
- 4.7 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - i) To approve the application in its entirety
 - ii) To approve the application in part with or without the addition of further conditions
 - iii) To reject the whole or part of the application
- 4.8 The licensing objectives are:
 - i) The prevention of crime and disorder
 - ii) Public safety
 - iii) The prevention of public nuisance, and
 - iv) The protection of children from harm
- 4.9 Members are reminded that they must only consider those aspects of the licence application that are relevant to the representations received.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

5.1 That Members consider the representations made by applicant, local residents and Responsible Authorities and determine what aspects, if any, of the application should be granted and, if appropriate, what conditions, if any, should be attached.



I have written to the applicant and requested 4 conditions as follows.

- 1. Closed Circuit Television System (CCTV) must be installed and maintained in good working order and be correctly time and date stamped. The system will incorporate sufficient built-in hard drive capacity to suit the number of cameras installed, whilst complying with Data protection legislation. CCTV will be capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, particularly facial recognition. Cameras will encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, outside areas and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs. There will be a minimum of 28 days recording required. The system must have a minimum of a simplex multiplexing facility and be recording for 24 hours a day. The system will incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on any desktop computer. The digital recorder must have the facility to be password protected to prevent unauthorised access, tampering, or deletion of images. There will be at all times a member of staff on duty who is trained in the use of the equipment and upon receipt of a request for footage from police or any other responsible Authority, will be able to produce the footage within a reasonable time – within 24hrs or immediately if urgently required for investigation of serious crime.
- 2. A "Challenge 25" policy shall be operated at the premises at all times. Customers attempting to purchase alcohol who appear to be less than 25 shall be challenged by staff to produce a passport, photo driving license or a PASS approved Proof-of-Age card. No other form of identification shall be accepted. The policy shall be documented and all staff must have received sufficient training to ensure they understand it and can comply with it. A written record shall be maintained detailing when the Challenge 25 training was provided and shall be signed as confirmation by the member of staff to whom the record relates. The policy and training records shall be made available for inspection by Police Officers or other authorised officers. A Challenge 25 Notice or Poster shall be visible at the entrance to the premises and at each point of sale to both inform the public and remind staff of the policy.
- 3. At the sales counter there shall be a means of alerting or reminding staff to verify the age of a prospective purchaser whenever an age restricted product is presented for purchase.
- 4. The business must maintain a refusals book to record all occasions where the supply of alcohol has been refused including dates/times, staff member and

description of the incident. The Designated Premises Supervisor / Store manager / Business Owner is to check the book and sign / date it at least every 28 days.
