1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for a new premises licence in respect of Vicky's Convenience Store, 36 Mulgrave Road, Hartlepool.

2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

2.1 Applicant: Mr Suvaissan Savarimuthu

Premises: 36 Mulgrave Road

Hartlepool TS26 8EB

2.2 The applicant has applied for the following activities: -

Supply of Alcohol (Off Sales)

Monday to Saturday 09:00 – 22:00 Sunday 10:00 – 21:00

A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 1**.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and representations have been received from Hartlepool Borough Council Trading Standards department, Cleveland Police, a local trader and three Ward Councillors (attached as **Appendices 2 5**). In addition to this two petitions were also submitted containing a total of 213 names (attached as **Appendices 6 and 7**).
- 3.2 The representation from Trading Standards relates to a request for the applicant to agree to the imposition of a number of conditions onto the licence designed to reduce the possibility of sales of alcohol to children. At the time of writing this report the applicant had failed to agree to such conditions.
- 3.3 The other objections collectively refer to the potential impact of granting the application on the four licensing objectives of: -

- Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- Protection of Children from Harm
- 3.4 Among the issues specifically raised by the objectors are a potential for the return of anti social behaviour that had previously been prevalent in the area and a possible increase in underage sales.

4. ISSUES

- 4.1 As relevant representations have been received within the prescribed time period a hearing must be held for Members to consider the application (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 The premises to which this application relates has previously been a butchers and most recently a fruit and vegetable shop which closed early in 2012.
- 4.3 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - i) To approve the application in its entirety
 - ii) To approve the application in part with or without the addition of further conditions
 - iii) To reject the whole or part of the application
- 4.4 The licensing objectives are:
 - i) The prevention of crime and disorder
 - ii) Public safety
 - iii) The prevention of public nuisance, and
 - iv) The protection of children from harm
- 4.5 Members are reminded that they must only consider those aspects of the licence application that are relevant to the representations received.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

5.1 That Members consider the representations made by applicant and the objectors and determine what aspects, if any, of the application should be granted and, if appropriate, what conditions, if any, should be attached.



Hi,

I am requesting 4 conditions for this application:

- 1. Closed Circuit Television System (CCTV) must be installed and maintained in good working order and be correctly time and date stamped. The system will incorporate sufficient built-in hard drive capacity to suit the number of cameras installed, whilst complying with Data protection legislation. CCTV will be capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, particularly facial recognition. Cameras will encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, outside areas and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs. There will be a minimum of 28 days recording required. The system must have a minimum of a simplex multiplexing facility and be recording for 24 hours a day. The system will incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on any desktop computer. The digital recorder must have the facility to be password protected to prevent unauthorised access, tampering, or deletion of images. There will be at all times a member of staff on duty who is trained in the use of the equipment and upon receipt of a request for footage from police or any other responsible Authority, will be able to produce the footage within a reasonable time within 24hrs or immediately if urgently required for investigation of serious crime.
- 2. A "Challenge 25" policy shall be operated at the premises at all times. Customers attempting to purchase alcohol who appear to be less than 25 shall be challenged by staff to produce a passport, photo driving license or a PASS approved Proof-of-Age card. No other form of identification shall be accepted. The policy shall be documented and all staff must have received sufficient training to ensure they understand it and can comply with it. A written record shall be maintained detailing when the Challenge 25 training was provided and shall be signed as confirmation by the member of staff to whom the record relates. The policy and training records shall be made available for inspection by Police Officers or other authorised officers. A Challenge 25 Notice or Poster shall be visible at the entrance to the premises and at each point of sale to both inform the public and remind staff of the policy.
- 3. At the sales counter there shall be a means of alerting or reminding staff to verify the age of a prospective purchaser whenever an age restricted product is presented for purchase.
- 4. The business must maintain a refusals book to record all occasions where the supply of alcohol has been refused including dates/times, staff member and description of the incident. The Designated Premises Supervisor / Store manager / Business Owner is to check the book and sign / date it at least every 28 days.

Objections to Proposed Licence at 36 Mulgrave Road

Dear Sir,

As Sergeant for the South and Central Neighbourhood Policing Team I would like to table my objections to the proposed alcohol licence at the above named address.

Whenever I hear about a new licence being sought in our wards, I have immediate concern as to how that may affect the quality of life of the many residents who my Police Officers and PCSO's support in their neighbourhoods.

I will refer to each of the licencing objectives as I list the concerns of myself and my colleagues.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

The proposed site is situated towards the South-West boundary of the busiest of our six policing wards. I have experienced officers assigned to that ward who work diligently to ensure that crime and anti-social behaviour is policed robustly. Massive improvements have taken place over the years through partnership working, but historically any establishment that sells alcohol will always be a catalyst for retail theft and anti-social behaviour usually driven by alcohol abuse. There are other retail outlets nearby that sell alcohol, and another one situated way from the heart of Victoria Ward will only add to the pressures of policing a very busy ward.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

As previously stated premises that sell alcohol have major potential to attract groups of people who will cause anti-social behaviour. Unlike other off licences that form part of a precinct of shops, this proposal relates to a single shop in very close proximity to residential homes. If the licence is granted it would be highly likely that these residents would be severely affected by noise made by persons both using and loitering near to the store.

Public Safety

Historically off licenses have been a target for criminals. With this premises being a retail outlet not immediately surrounded by other stores the staff and customers using the store could be at potential risk from crime and public disorder.

Protection of Children from Harm

Licence holders have a massive responsibility in ensuring that the licensing objectives are met, with none more important than protecting children from harm. The proposed location is on a street corner in a quieter location than most similar outlets. As the premises is further away from the heart of Victoria

Ward I feel that young people intent on acquiring alcohol could easily be tempted to target the store staff and customers in order to pressurise adults into purchasing alcohol for them.

I would urge the licensing committee to take my concerns seriously as I feel that this ward does not need another off licence premises.

Should the decision be to grant a licence I would ask for consideration to tailor the licensing hours to be set sensibly to allow residents some respite during quality family time on an evening. This would further allow me to ensure a reasonable level of policing cover rather than the risk of my units being stretched to unacceptable levels.

We being the owners of a Convenience Store/Off Licence do strongly object to Suvaissan Savvarimuthu(Vicky Convenience Store) applying for a Licence to sell alcohol from 36 Mulgrave Road, as this is only 5 Doors from our premises, and feel that there is no need for another in the area, as there is another Two within close approximately of Mulgrave Road.

Permission of this Licence will be most detrimental to the area on the grounds of return of public nuisance and disorder in the area due to increased attraction for younger elements of the public to congregate in the area.

When we were issued with our Licence, we listened to our Customers who had misgivings about what times we would be opening and we assured them that we would be closing at 7.30 p.m. on Wednesdays and Saturdays due to these being Lottery nights and the rest of the week would be 7 p.m. and Sundays 1 p.m. to keep rowdy behaviour down to a minimum. This having being adhered to has had the desired reduction effect to the betterment of the area.

Since notice was displayed stating that a Licence was being applied for many of our Customers have voiced their feeling about another Licensed Premises in the area, and requested us to arrange a petition, and this will be forwarded to you before the 16th November.

The same Customers have told us how pleased they were when Victoria Wines closed down as there was always noise and sometimes abusive behaviour from the young public. Since Victoria Wines closed and the Re-Generation Programme in the area Mulgrave Road and the surrounding Streets have been very much quieter.

We first applied for our Licence in 1998, but we were turned down due to too many other Licensed Premises and the Victoria Wines was across the road from our Premises.

Hoping you will look favourably upon our Objection and realise that another licensed premises is not needed in the area.

The three councillors of Victoria Ward would like to lodge an objection to the proposal to have an 09:00 - 22:00 Off Licence in the former greengrocer's shop at 36 Mulgrave Road.

We have been approached by a number of residents in the Mulgrave Road area who are anxious that the granting of an off licence to these premises will result in groups of young people hanging around the shop at unsociable hours, drinking and causing a nuisance.

Previously, when Victoria Wines operated a similar licence on the opposite side of the road, residents were continually beset by antisocial behaviour; children pestering adults going into the store to get them to buy drink; noise and disturbance from gangs of youths roaming the area in an intoxicated state and petty crime. We understand that a 400+ signature petition is already circulating so this will give you an indication of the strength of feeling against the proposal from local residents.

We have worked very hard with Residents' Associations and Neighbourhood Police Teams to ensure that the area is a safer, better place to live and we share the anxieties that residents and police have that permitting a development of this type will result in a rise in crime and antisocial behaviour, not to mention the danger to children of underage drinking.

We hope that the Licensing Committee will take these objections into account when they consider the application.

We the undersigned are against the proposal to open yet another store to sell alcohol in Mulgrave Road. Within walking distance there are premises that already sell alcohol; namely the newsagents Westhorpes, which are about 100 yards away also Charlie's, Hartley's store, and the Supporters club in Duke Street.

Our concern is also that our peace, and the safety of others will be compromised in the vicinity and it will be more so than it is at present if yet another alcohol license is permitted.

There is already rowdiness in Mulgrave Road at night. The congested parking already causes us concern for the safety of the general public. This is likely to increase bringing an increased risk of accident or even death to an adult or child. The junction of Grange Road and Mulgrave Road is already a junction where accidents have occurred. Teenagers and the youth constantly drive through Mulgrave Road at high speed making their tyres screech and 'burn' leaving behind a trail of white smoke.

Where the demon alcohol is there will always be consequences; whether that is in the lives of the people around the store or the people who drink it. Please find attached to the leaflet of what such consequences could have on the people and teenagers in this area; this is also a concern. Already there is a problem with glass bottles smashed, litter dropped from takeaways, empty cans, and other rubbish we believe this would increase.

Today no one appears to care about the comfort and peace of residents; or the damage teenagers and adults full of alcohol can do to property. Our homes and cars are already damaged on a regular basis and this could well escalate. We have had our cars scratched, wing mirrors pulled off, windscreens put through and this has already caused anxiety and fear without the extra cost involved. Please consider the long term effects of this on our health and well being always wondering; what will happen tonight? We do not have any desire to live in such an atmosphere.

We ask that you will allow us the privilege of living our life in relative peace and safety and that you deny a licence to sell yet more alcohol in Mulgrave Road. Some of us are getting on in years and just want some peace when we retire to bed.

We hope you will take all the above into consideration when you make your decision and our desire for peace and safety where we live.
