1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for a new premises licence in respect of 91 Elwick Road, Hartlepool.

2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

2.1 Applicant: Mr Vasanthy Kanapathippillai

Premises: 91 Elwick Road

Hartlepool TS26 9AU

2.2 The applicant has applied for the following activities: -

Supply of Alcohol (Off Sales)

Monday to Sunday 09:00 – 22:00

A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 1**.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and a total of 74 individual representations have been received. These consist of three from local councillors (**Appendices 2-4**), one from Cleveland Police (**Appendix 5**), one from Burn Valley North Residents Association (**Appendix 6**) and 69 from local residents.
- 3.2 The objections from residents are attached as **Appendices 7-13**. Most of the objections submitted by residents were on one of two different pro forma letters which are attached as **Appendices 12 and 13**.
- 3.3 The representations from local councillors refer to concerns over a possible increase in crime, disorder and nuisance for those residents who live nearby.
- 3.4 Cleveland Police have stated that of the 48 incidents of crime reported during 2012 in the Elwick Road area, 21 (44%) of these were related to licensed premises and there is concern that an additional premises may lead to further

- crime. The Police also refer, amongst other things, to the potential for underage sales activity in the area.
- 3.5 Burn Valley North Residents Association refers to, amongst other things, the fact that drug crime (including alcohol related) and anti social behaviour in the Burn Valley Ward are higher than average for Hartlepool and that an additional licence premises would have a negative impact on these issues.
- 3.6 The representations from residents collectively refer to the current high levels of crime and anti social behaviour in the area, the number of other licensed premises already in the vicinity and the previous noise nuisance and anti social behaviour experienced around this particular property.

4. ISSUES

- 4.1 As relevant representations have been received within the prescribed time period a hearing must be held for Members to consider the application.
- 4.2 The premises to which this application relates has recently operated as a beauty therapist and, for a short period, a fireworks retailer.
- 4.3 Members are advised that at the request of the Trading Standards Service the applicant has agreed to a number of conditions being added to the licence relating to the provision of a CCTV system and a Challenge 25 age verification policy.
- 4.4 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - i) To approve the application in its entirety
 - ii) To approve the application in part with or without the addition of further conditions
 - iii) To reject the whole or part of the application
- 4.5 The licensing objectives are:
 - i) The prevention of crime and disorder
 - ii) Public safety
 - iii) The prevention of public nuisance, and
 - iv) The protection of children from harm
- 4.6 Members are reminded that they must only consider those aspects of the licence application that are relevant to the representations received.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

5.1 That Members consider the representations made by applicant and the objectors and determine what aspects, if any, of the application should be granted and, if appropriate, what conditions, if any, should be attached.



With reference to the application for a retail sales alcohol licence in respect of no. 91 Elwick Road, I wish to register as an interested party in this case in my roles as a local resident and ward councillor.

I do not believe that the four licensing objectives will be promoted by the granting of this licence on the grounds that :-

- PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

There have significant problems with similar outlets in the area notably in Cornwall Street crime and anti-social behaviour has reduced since the closure of an un-supervised outlet in that district:

- PUBLIC SAFETY

Other premises in the area have supervision e.g. the Co-op Stores in Elwick Road have a security guard to deter potential trouble-makers;

- PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

Local residents concerns centre around a number of issues -

very close proximity to residential properties; parking problems in an already congested area; late opening - problems existed when the shop was an outlet closing at 5 pm;

- PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

SEE POINT ABOVE REGARDING SECURITY GUARD WHICH WILL NOT APPLY HERE;

late availability of cheap alcohol due to potential for "price wars."

Dear lan,

I would like to formally object to the proposed licence for the sale of alcohol at 91 Elwick Road, which I understand is due to come before a sub-committee of Councillors in the New Year.

This premise, which is the heart of the Burn Valley ward, is surrounded by residential homes, local community centres, a public park and a primary school and I believe firmly that this application, if granted, would have a severely detrimental effect on this thriving community.

There are three principle reasons why I think councillors should reject this application:

- 1. Prevention of crime and disorder This area of the Burn Valley ward has been plagued by high levels of crime and disorder in the past, which was directly linked to alcohol. Thankfully, through a combination of resident support, police action and investment by the local council and others, things have improved. The greater access to alcohol and the greater number of drunken individuals, who would almost certainly be attracted to such a premise if this licence is granted, threatens this progress and is, in my view, certain to increase crime and anti-social behaviour.
- 2. Public nuisance Added to the above you have the low-level disturbance that is routinely associated with such premises, with noise and litter being the most obvious examples. 10pm may not sound late to some people but for many of the older residents in the area (including those across the road in Elwick Grange Nursing Home) the sound of drunken revellers at such a time is often annoying and sometimes highly intimidating.
- 3. Public safety The increase of crime and anti-social behaviour that would result from this premise being granted a licence puts innocent people into harm's way. This is a residential area, with people of all ages and backgrounds living there, and they deserve their way of life protected and their safety maintained. This is a dear duty of the licensing authority and one I feel we would be falling short of if we granted this application.
- 4. Protection of children from harm The area is populated with many young people, they walk to school at Eldon Grove, they play in the Burn Valley Gardens, they attend dubs at St. Matthew's Hall and they live in the residential homes all around 91 Elwick Road. To increase crime and anti-social behaviour by granting this licence puts these children in direct harm's way and we must do we can to prevent that.

In summary, our licending objectives clearly mandate councillors to vote against this application and I call on them to do so.

The area is already well served with licensed shops within the near vicinity of 91 Elwick Road - such as, Gillen's, Burn Valley Stores, Lister Street Newsagents and the neighbouring Co-op and Londis in Elwick Road itself.

Local residents are understandably concerned about this proposed development and I would therefore urge the Licensing Committee to refuse the application for any alcohol licence at the above address.

Objections to Proposed Licence at 91 Elwick Road

Dear Sir,

As one of the Ward Officers for the Burn Valley Ward in the South and Central Neighbourhood Policing Team area I would like to table my objections to the proposed alcohol licence at the above named address.

Whenever I hear about a new licence being sought in our wards, I have immediate concern as to how that may affect the quality of life of the many residents who my colleagues, both Police Officers and PCSO's support in their neighbourhoods.

I will refer to each of the licensing objectives as I list the concerns of myself and my colleagues.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

The proposed site is situated in the middle of one of the busiest of our six policing wards. I have experienced officers assigned to that ward who work diligently to ensure that crime and anti-social behaviour is policed robustly. Massive improvements have taken place over the years through partnership working, but historically any establishment that sells alcohol will always be a catalyst for retail theft and anti-social behaviour usually driven by alcohol abuse.

There are five other smaller retail outlets nearby that sell alcohol, and a large supermarket situated just over the border from the Burn Valley Ward, which currently add to the pressures of policing a very busy ward.

There are retail premises which sell alcohol who do not present themselves as such a target for shop theft and antisocial behaviour, these are the stores who employ security staff in order to reduce theft and deal with antisocial behaviour as it occurs, be that moving on youths from outside or ejecting unruly customers. Unless this store was to employ a staff member purely in a security role then I am sure that the introduction of another licensed premises to the Burn Valley area would provide another hub for crime and disorder to rear its ugly head.

There have been 48 incidents of shop theft in the Burn Valley Ward so far in 2012. Of this 48, 21 incidents relate to licensed premises in the Elwick Road area. This equates to 44% of total incidents in the ward. The addition of one more licensed premises will only add to this total and depending on the security systems installed i.e. quality of CCTV if this was not up to scratch the possibility of detecting any crimes which may occur would also suffer.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

Unlike other off licences that form part of a precinct of shops, this proposal relates to a single shop in very close proximity to residential homes, there is no area for additional parking for potential customers of the store to park, this would mean that customers would park wherever they could find a space, be it on the busy Elwick Road or in the side streets which run off it. If the licence is granted it would be highly likely that these residents would be severely affected by increased constant vehicle traffic stopping outside of their homes and parking in residential areas.

As previously stated premises that sell alcohol have major potential to attract groups of people who will cause anti-social behaviour. Residents in nearby properties will therefore be affected by the noise made by persons both using the store and loitering near it and the potential intimidating affect that groups can have.

Public Safety

Historically off licenses have been a target for criminals. With this premises being a retail outlet not immediately surrounded by other stores the staff and customers using the store could be at potential risk from crime and public disorder.

The fact that there is no specific parking area designated to the licensed premises would also cause a public safety hazard in that the increased amount of vehicular traffic to the residential areas surrounding the store could put pedestrians at risk. Children who play in the streets near to the store would have to be more vigilant than usual due to more cars parking in the street for short periods of time. There could also be potential problems when the store is receiving deliveries as the delivery driver would have to park in close proximity to the store possibly causing traffic obstructions on Elwick Road.

The area of Elwick Road from York Road to Baden Street is already a very busy road and this is currently made worse by the hoards of vehicles which visit the stores which currently operate in the area. The addition of another premises would only increase this and in turn the potential for accidents to occur.

Protection of Children from Harm

Licence holders have a massive responsibility in ensuring that the licensing objectives are met, with none more important than protecting children from harm. Young people intent on acquiring alcohol have historically targeted stores where they believe that staff would either agree to sell them alcohol or could be intimidated into selling them alcohol, either that or target the customers in order to pressurise adults into purchasing alcohol for them. This has thankfully been almost eradicated due to the fact that the remaining stores are established and Police and PCSO's have ensured that this practice does not occur. Young people will always push the boundaries simply to find out where they are and what is acceptable and what is not and the

introduction of a new licensed premises would open the door to this behaviour again, at least until a new precedent was achieved.

I would urge the licensing committee to take my concerns seriously as I feel that this ward does not need another off licence premises.

Should the decision be to grant a licence I would ask for consideration to tailor the licensing hours to be set sensibly to allow residents some respite during quality family time on an evening. This would further allow me to ensure a reasonable level of policing cover rather than the risk of my units being stretched to unacceptable levels.

I am writing to you on behalf of Burn Valley North Residents' Association to register our objection to the application for a licence to sell alcohol at the premises situated at 91 Elwick Road, Hartlepool.

Whilst Neighbourhood Policing Teams enjoy good relationships with community groups within the Burn Valley Area, the most recent Ward Profile reveals that total crime in this area is above the average for the Hartlepool Borough, and in particular, total drug crime and antisocial behaviour levels are higher than average. As a result of these findings a decrease in levels of antisocial behaviour and a reduction, especially in drug related crime are identified as key theme priorities for this area of Hartlepool. As you are aware alcohol related crimes are included under the drug related category, and we believe that the introduction of yet another alcohol licensed premises in the area would have a negative impact on achieving these objectives. In fact we believe another licensed premises could increase levels of crime and antisocial behaviour.

At present there are at least 5 licensed premises within a half mile radius of 91 Elwick Road; namely, The Cooperative Store and Londis in Elwick Road, Gillens and Burn Valley Wine Stores in York Road and Lister News in Lister Street. We can see no justification whatsoever for another licensed shop to be trading in what is already a saturated area for such outlets, and consequently we are imploring the Licensing Committee to reject this application, particularly as this outlet will be directly adjacent to private residential properties.

Finally, the third key theme priority for Burn Valley Ward is an improvement in levels of community spirit within the area, and as a group who are committed to working towards achieving this goal, we can certainly tell you that another off licence will have a significant negative impact on those local residents who really care about their community.

I frequently find empty bottles of Lambrusco, lager cans etc thrown over the wall into my garden.

My objection to an off licence in particular is that there are already three in the immediate area, ie the Co-op and Londis stores in Elwick Road itself and the Nisa store on the corner of Elwick and York Road. I am writing to register my objection to the application for a premises to be licenced, as stated above. The basis for this opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the councils objectives, particularly the prevention of crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour.

Recently a letter was sent to all residents in the Elwick Road area regarding the state of Baden Street and enabling the premises to sell alcohol would be totally detrimental to the aims and plans of bringing up the standards of the community in and around this area. In the past there has been an off-licence further up Elwick Road who had to resort to locking staff and customers in the store to safeguard them and increase security against theft and robbery. This establishment was closed to reduce this type of anti social and criminal behaviour and to consider re-opening the same kind of establishment is just bringing back this unacceptable behaviour to the area. The application proposes that alcohol will be sold for consumption off the premises between 9.00am and 10.00pm, seven days a week. Granting a licence would provide a further source of alcohol within an area already so heavily populated with licensed premises that crime, disorder and public nuisance would increase problem levels for the local police.

Residents in this area suffered noise, nuisance and antisocial behaviour when it was previously a general corner shop, without the sale of alchohol, at all hours of the day and night. This included urinating, increased rubbish levels, graffitti, foul and abusive language and experienced intimidating behaviour.

I feel by granting the licence this would increase the risk of adoloscents obtaining alcohol unlawfully and this has the potential for routine incidents of public nuisance to escalate to more serious incidents under the influence of alcohol. Alcohol related crime and disorder has a major impact on the quality of life of many people who live in this area.

In view of the above, I would urge the Licensing Authority to refuse the application
