**Subject:** APPLICATION FOR VARIATION OF A PREMISES

LICENCE RELATING TO INSPIRATIONS COFFEE

HOUSE, TANFIELD ROAD HARTLEPOOL

#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application to vary the premises licence in respect of the Inspirations Coffee House, Tanfield Road, Hartlepool.

#### 2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

- 2.1 Applicant: Hartlepool Borough Council
- 2.2 The premises currently holds a licence that authorises the following activities between 0830 hours and 1830 hours Monday to Sunday: -
  - 1. Supply of Alcohol (on sales only)
  - 2. Plays
  - 3. Films
  - 4. Live Music
  - 5. Recorded Music
  - 6. Performances of Dance
- 2.3 A copy of the current licence is attached as **Appendix 1.**
- 2.4 The application is to vary the current licence so as to extend the licensed hours for the following activities to 2100 hours 7 days a week: -
  - 1. Supply of alcohol (on sales only)
  - 2. Recorded music
  - 3. Live music

A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 2.** 

2.5 The initial application was to extend all of the licensed activities to 2100 hours on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesday and Sundays and 2300 hours on Thursday, Fridays, Saturdays and Bank Holidays but, at the request of the applicant, this has subsequently been reduced to the activities and times detailed in paragraph 2.4 above.

#### 3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and a total of 13 individual objections have been received (attached as **Appendices 3 15**).
- 3.2 The representations collectively refer to the potential for all of the Licensing Act's licensing objectives to be undermined should the application be granted. Many objectors have stated that a licensed premises, offering music and the sale of alcohol, would be a nuisance to those visiting the cemetery to pay their respects to loved ones.
- 3.3 In addition to the individual representations received, two petitions objecting to the application have also been submitted with a total of 100 signatories and this will be circulated to Members at the committee hearing.

#### 4. ISSUES

- 4.1 As relevant representations have been received a hearing must be held for a licensing sub-committee to consider the application.
- 4.2 The current licence was granted on 4<sup>th</sup> June 2013.
- 4.3 An application to extend planning permission for this property was considered by the Planning Committee on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2013 and a number of conditions were attached to the approval. Some of these are relevant to the licence application and objections that have been received. A copy of the planning permission is attached as **Appendix 16.**
- 4.4 The sub-committee is reminded that the statutory guidance that accompanies the Licensing Act states that licensing authorities must avoid attaching conditions that duplicate other regulatory regimes and that where there are other legislative provisions which are relevant and must be observed by the applicant, no additional conditions are appropriate.
- 4.5 Essentially this means that if the sub-committee is minded to grant the application it should not attach conditions to the licence that duplicate conditions already attached to the planning permission.
- 4.6 A number of objectors have expressed their concerns over alcohol being supplied from a premises that is so closely associated with a cemetery. Members of the sub-committee are reminded that they must only consider those aspects of objections that relate specifically to the four licensing objectives which are:
  - i) The prevention of crime and disorder
  - ii) Public safety
  - iii) The prevention of public nuisance, and
  - iv) The protection of children from harm

- 4.7 Members of the sub-committee are also reminded that the recent national deregulation of live music means that live music can be offered from alcohol licensed premises, or any other workplace, between 0800 hours and 2300 hours, without the need for a licence or specific authorisation. If the sub-committee was minded to refuse the application for live music it could be argued that this would have no binding effect on the applicant who could, if they wished, offer live music within the times detailed above without a licence provided that it does not become a public nuisance.
- 4.8 The deregulation of live music also extends to any licence conditions that are intended, or have the effect of, controlling the provision of live music insofar as such conditions are unenforceable during the hours of 0800 and 2300.
- 4.9 Such limitations do not however apply to planning permission and the subcommittee will see that conditions 8, 9 and 10 of the planning permission for the premises, attached in Appendix 16, are designed to ensure that no noise nuisance should be experienced as a result of music taking place.
- 4.10 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - i) To approve the application in its entirety
  - ii) To approve the application in part with or without the addition of further conditions
  - iii) To reject the whole or part of the application

#### 5. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

5.1 That Members consider the representations made by the applicant and the objectors and determine what aspects, if any, of the application should be granted and, if appropriate, what conditions, if any, should be attached.

# **ANNEX 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
    - Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 2. In relation to the exhibition of films, the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with the classification designated by the British Board of film Classification (BBFC) or other authority designated by the Video Recordings Act 1984 for the film, or films being exhibited.
- 3. Each individual employed or otherwise engaged at the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 4. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

    (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
  - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

    (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
    (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 7. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 8. The responsible person shall ensure that—
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

## ANNEX 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. A "Challenge 25" policy shall be operated throughout any events. Customers attempting to purchase alcohol who appear to be less than 25 shall be challenged by staff to produce a passport photo driving license or a PASS approved Proof–of-Age card. No other form of identification shall be accepted. All staff must have received sufficient training to ensure they understand it and can comply with it. At any sales counter where alcohol sales may take place there shall be a means of alerting or reminding staff of the Challenge 25 Policy.
- 2. At the sales counter there shall be a means of alerting or reminding staff to verify the age of a prospective purchaser whenever an age restricted product is presented for purchase.
- 3. Except with prior written approval of the licensing Authority and subject to any conditions which may be attached to such approval;-
  - (a) No special effects, naked flames, smoke production or any process creating a risk of fire, or the illusion of smoke or fire shall be used for the purpose of providing regulated entertainment on the premises.
  - (b) No explosives or highly flammable substances shall be brought into or used on the premises.
  - (c) No special effects shall be used or displays given on the premises, which consist of or include the use of lasers.
- 4. The licensee must ensure that the electrical socket outlets in the licensed premises, which are used for the purpose of providing licensed entertainment, are protected by a residual current device being a 30mA tripping circuit.
- 5. In the event of the fire alarm being activated a suitable relay should be provided so that the electrical power supply to all sound amplification system in the licensed premises shall be immediately intercepted so that the alarm can be clearly heard in all parts of the licensed premises.
- 6. There shall be maintained on the premises at all times an adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials for use by patrons.
- 7. All external doors and windows shall not be kept open when regulated entertainment/karaoke is being provided.
- 8. Live Music shall be restricted to occasional incidental acoustic music.



Dear Sir or Madam

I would like to register my objection to the extension of the licence for alcohol sales in Inspirations Coffee House.

I understand that in this economic climate, Hartlepool Borough Council needs to profit from its ventures but I feel that this a wholly inappropriate way to do so, on several levels.

I am confused about the *actual* extension being asked for as I was informed that it had been revised slightly from the original application submitted at the beginning of February i.e. that the hours had been reduced somewhat. I can find no evidence of these changes and I would challenge the validity of the application and ask that it be declared invalid.

I would also like you to note that the application has an error within it, in that it states in Section M part b, that the Cemetery gates are locked; this is actually not the case. The large vehicle gates are locked on an evening but the smaller pedestrian gates are left open. If this is to be changed, there is a danger that access to graves could be curtailed in the name of making a profit. The use of CCTV within the Cemetery grounds has also been something of a contentious issue to date. Local residents have lobbied for this in the past and several council officers have taken great pains to explain why it has not been forthcoming in terms of the cost/benefit. This licence doesn't give any assurances as to how this will be taken forward even from a monitoring point of view.

The application also talks about strong links with neighbourhood police teams. Services have been recently reduced and are likely to be reduced again in the near future, due to budget cuts. How then will this ensure public safety?

I would also challenge Section M part d. The first bullet point states "Coffee house opening hours are between", but there is no further detail - how does this omission reflect on the prevention of public nuisance or on the application itself? Furthermore, though the car park may mitigate some level of public nuisance for Tanfield Road residents, it will not for those living in Westbrooke Avenue. There will be increased noise that unfortunately, signs are unlikely to prevent either. Car parking as a mitigating factor in this application is also a risk given that the licence is an extension to sell alcohol!

Section M part e (the protection of children from harm) states that "Children (unaccompanied) will not allowed after 21.00pm without being accompanied by an adult". An obvious question to ask I imagine but does this mean that unaccompanied children will be allowed in up to 21.00pm?

Finally, the Cemetery site already suffers from a level of anti-social behaviour and I genuinely feel that any extension could add to this. On visiting the Cemetery this evening, the police were called by a local resident as a man was collapsed (a drink related incident) just inside the gates.

The new procedures apply with regard to all requests made to the Council to discharge conditions imposed on planning approvals or requests seeking confirmation of compliance with such conditions. The request can be made in any written form, which is clear, understandable and identifies the relevant permission and conditions concerned. Alternatively, the Government has provided a new form to be used for the submission of details to discharge a planning condition. The form is available at:

The fee payable for requests is £28.00 for conditions on householder developments and £97.00 on all others. The fee must be submitted at the same time the request is made. Requests that are received without the appropriate fee will be returned unanswered.

The fee is payable for each request made. A single request may seek to discharge more than one condition. If you later decide to change the details of an agreed condition a new payment is required.

The local planning authority will seek to respond within eight weeks. A longer period of time may be required where ongoing discussion and correspondence are necessary. If the authority fails to provide confirmation or notification that confirmation cannot be provided within twelve weeks of the date of receipt, the fee will be refunded.

# NOTIFICATION TO BE SENT TO AN APPLICANT WHEN A LOCAL PLANNING AUTHORITY REFUSE PLANNING PERMISSION OR GRANT IT SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS

# Appeals to the Secretary of State

- If you are aggrieved by the decision of your local planning authority to refuse permission for the proposed development or to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Secretary of State under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- If this is a decision on a planning application relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as is already the subject of an enforcement notice, if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within 28 days of the date of this notice.
- If an enforcement notice is served relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as in your application and if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within:
   28 days of the date of service of the enforcement notice, or within 6 months
  - [12 weeks in the case of a householder appeal] of the date of this notice, whichever period expires earlier.
- If this is a decision to refuse planning permission for a householder application or for a minor commercial application if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision then you must do so within 12 weeks of the date of this notice.
- In all other cases if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision then you must do so within 6 months of the date of this notice.
- Appeals must be made using a form which you can get from the Secretary of State at Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN (Tel: 0303 444 5000) or online at <a href="https://www.planningportal.gov.uk/pcs">www.planningportal.gov.uk/pcs</a>.
- The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal but will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.
- The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to the Secretary of State that the local planning authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions they imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of any development order and to any directions given under a development order.
