1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the variation of a premises licence in respect of 152 Northgate, Hartlepool.

2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

2.1 Applicant: Mr Ranga Gunamuthu

Premises: 152 Northgate

Hartlepool

2.2 The applicant has applied to extend the hours for the supply of alcohol as follows: -

Supply of Alcohol (Off sales)

Monday – Sunday 0800 – 2300 hours

A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 1**.

2.3 The current licence authorises the following activities: -

Supply of Alcohol (Off sales)

Monday – Sunday 0900 – 2200 hours

A copy of the current licence is attached as **Appendix 2**.

2.4 Street view images of the premises are attached as **Appendix 3**. The premises to which this application relates is identified on the photographs as 'Dimensions' as they were taken before the premises converted to the current shop.

3. BACKGROUND

3.1 The current premises licence was granted in May 2016 following a licensing sub-committee hearing.

- 3.2 The application to extend the licensed hours of the premises was advertised in the prescribed manner and one representation was received from Mr Simon Watson who lives directly above the property.
- 3.3 Mr Watson's representation is attached as **Appendix 4** and in it he refers to noise emanating from the licensed premises.
- 3.4 When the initial application for the grant of the licence was made in 2016, the application was for trading hours of 0800 2300 hours and Mr Watson was, again, the sole objector.
- 3.5 Following consideration of the evidence at the hearing in 2016, the sub-committee determined to grant a licence of 0900 2200 hours.

4. ISSUES

- 4.1 As a relevant representation has been received a hearing must be held for Members to consider it (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 Members attention is drawn to the Council's current Licensing Policy which states in paragraph 4.25: -

The licensing authority does not accept that longer opening hours have been a benefit to Hartlepool but rather that they place an undue and unnecessary strain on the local transport infrastructure, Accident & Emergency services and law enforcement agencies and creates a nuisance for those residents who are affected by the general operation of a premises or from revellers returning home during the early hours.

Shops, stores and supermarkets will in general be licensed to provide sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises at any time when the retail outlet is open for shopping but licences for before 9:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. in residential areas will generally be refused.

- 4.3 Following consideration of the application, relevant representations and any comments of the licence holder, Members may take such steps as they consider necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 4.4 The sub-committee may take any of the following steps:
 - i) Grant the application without amendment
 - ii) Grant the application in part and/or with conditions or amended conditions
 - iii) Refuse the application

4.5 The licensing objectives are:


- i) The prevention of crime and disorder



Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.
- 3. In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:
- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display
 of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day,
 provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a
 contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial
 arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting
 event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
- a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the

relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
- o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
- o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
- o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
- o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).
- 5. For example state type of activity to be authorised, if not already stated, and give relevant further details, for example (but not exclusively) whether or not music will be amplified or unamplified.
- 6. For example (but not exclusively), where the activity will occur on additional days during the summer months.

ANNEX 1 - Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- 2. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- **3.** (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act
 - (a) 1979;

"permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

P = D + (DxV)

(b) where—

- (I) P is the permitted price.
- (II) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (III) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

"relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

- (c)(i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a

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licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:

"relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club

(d) present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

(e)

- Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price
- (3) given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different(4) from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEX 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions. Cameras will encompass all entrances and exits to the premises including fire exits, and areas where the sale of alcohol occurs. Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped. All recordings must be kept in date order for a period of 31 days. There must be at all times a member of staff on duty who is trained in the use of the equipment who can on request of a responsible authority such as (but not exclusively) Cleveland Police produce the footage within a reasonable time.
- 2. All staff will be fully trained on a 6 monthly basis ad must include the laws relating to the sale of alcohol to underage persons, persons buying on behalf of under 18s (proxy sales), persons appearing to be under the influence of alcohol and also the operation of the associated 'Challenge 25' policy. Staff will receive refresher training at least every 6 months.
- Training records, signed by both the staff member and the Designated Premise Supervisor/Store Manager/Business Owner will be retained for future reference and shall be updated at least every 6 months. All staff training records will be made available to the Licensing Authority and/or responsible Authorities upon request.
- 4. A 'Refusals Book' shall be provided and completed for all instances where the sale of Alcohol has been refused. The 'date' and 'time' of the attempted sale and a description of the incident must be recorded in the book. The Designated Premises Licence Supervisor, Store Manager or Business Owner shall check and sign each page of the book and make it available for inspection to the Licensing Authority and/or Responsible Authorities.
- 5. There will be a minimum of two notices displayed on the premises indicating that the sale of alcohol to those under the age of 18 is illegal and those adults who buy alcohol for immediate disposal to those under 18 are committing an offence.
- 6. A "Challenge 25", policy will be implemented with all staff insisting on evidence of age from any person appearing to be under 25 years of age and who is attempting to buy alcohol. There shall be notices displayed at all points of sale and at all entrances and exits to inform customers and remind staff that the premises is operating a "Challenge 25" policy. Only valid Passport UK "photo card style" driving licences, PASS approved proof-of-age cards of Ministry of Defence "Form 90" identification Cards shall be accepted as proof of age.


