## Procedure for Hearings

2. The Assistant Director (Environment & Neighbourhood Services), or representative shall outline the application, any relevant representations and relevancy to Licensing Policy and statutory guidance.
3. Members ask any questions of the Assistant Director (Environment & Neighbourhood Services), or representative.
4. Applicant presents their case (either personally or via legal representation) and introduces witnesses where appropriate.
5. Questions by Members to applicant and/or applicant's witnesses.
6. Representations by responsible bodies and/or interested parties and witnesses introduced where appropriate.
7. Questions by Members to responsible bodies/interested parties and/or their witnesses.
8. Parties may question and clarify issues raised with the consent of the Chair.
9. If required, responsible bodies/interested parties to be given opportunity to sum up.
10. If required, the applicant to be given opportunity to sum up.
11. Members to have the opportunity to clarify any points raised. The Chair shall ask whether all parties are satisfied they have said all they wish to.

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## 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To consider an application for a new premises licence in respect of Popworld, Victoria Road, Hartlepool

## 2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

- 2.1 Applicant: Stonegate Pub Company Ltd

- 2.2 The applicant has applied for the following activities: -

1. Films, 2. Live Music, 3. Recorded Music, 4. Performance of Dance,  
5. Anything similar to 2, 3 and 4

Monday to Sunday 11:00 – 03:00 hours

6. Supply of Alcohol

Monday – Sunday 11:00 – 03:00 hours

7. Late Night Refreshment

Monday – Sunday 23:00 – 03:00 hours

Additionally, for each of the above activities: -

- New Years Eve – From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day
- An additional hour to the terminal hour on the following days:- St David's Day, St Patrick's Day, St Andrew's Day, St George's Day, Burns Night, Halloween, Valentine's Day, Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of all Bank Holiday Weekends (including Easter),

Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, 27<sup>th</sup> December, 28<sup>th</sup> December, 29<sup>th</sup> December, 30<sup>th</sup> December.

- An additional hour to the standard and non-standard times when British Summertime commences.

A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 1**.

A map of the area is attached as **Appendix 2** and photographs of the premises are attached as **Appendix 3** (shown as 'Yates').

- 2.3 The premises to which this application relates has, until recently, traded under the name 'Yates'. It was re-branded as 'Popworld' in November 2018. The licence for the premises is attached as **Appendix 4**.
- 2.4 Whilst a licence for 'Popworld' is in force at this address, the applicant has chosen to apply for a new licence rather than to vary the existing one. If this new application is refused, or only partly granted, the applicant would be free to continue to trade under the current licence. If the new application is granted to the satisfaction of the applicant, it is likely (although not legally required) that the current licence would be surrendered.

### 3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and two representations were received – one from Cleveland Police (**Appendix 5**) and the other from Hartlepool Borough Council's Licensing Manager (**Appendix 6**).
- 3.2 The representation from Cleveland Police is an objection to the applicant's proposed extension of hours on the grounds of Crime and Disorder, and Public Safety and that it '*will not be conducive to promoting the four main licensing objectives....*'.
- 3.3 The Police have provided two statements and a number of documents as evidence and these are attached as **Appendices 7 and 8**.
- 3.4 The representation from the Council's Trading Standards & Licensing Manager, made on behalf of the Council in its role as licensing authority, highlights that the Council's current Licensing Policy states that '*....applications for licences to allow the sale of alcohol or the supply of late night refreshment beyond 2:00 a.m. will normally be refused....*'
- 3.5 The premises to which this application relates is in one of Hartlepool's main Night Time Economy areas and there are seven other bars in the immediate vicinity.

#### 4. ISSUES

- 4.1 As relevant representations have been received, a hearing must be held for Members to consider the application (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 The representation from the Council's Trading Standards & Licensing Manager highlights paragraph 5.14 of the Council's current Licensing Policy which states: -

*'The licensing authority does not accept that longer opening hours have been a benefit to Hartlepool but rather that they place an undue and unnecessary strain on the local transport infrastructure, Accident & Emergency services and law enforcement agencies and creates a nuisance for those residents who are affected by the general operation of a premises or from revellers returning home during the early hours.'*

*Shops, stores and supermarkets will in general be licensed to provide sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises at any time when the retail outlet is open for shopping but licences for before 9:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. in residential areas will generally be refused. In addition, licence applications for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises for before 9:00 a.m. or after 11:30 p.m. in residential areas will generally be refused.*

*In non residential areas applications for licences to allow the sale of alcohol or the supply of late night refreshment beyond 2:00 a.m. will normally be refused subject to relevant representations being received.'*

The area in which 'Popworld' is situated would generally be regarded as a 'non-residential' area.

- 4.3 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
- i) To approve the application in its entirety
  - ii) To approve the application in part - with or without the addition of further conditions
  - iii) To reject the whole or part of the application
- 4.4 Members are reminded that they must only consider those aspects of the licence application that are relevant to the representations received.

## **5. RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 5.1 That Members consider the representations made by the applicant and the objectors and determine what aspects, if any, of the application should be granted and, if appropriate, what conditions, if any, should be attached.

Stonegate Pub Company Limited have owned and operated this premises since 2011 and it has operated under their Yates brand. The premises is shortly due to undergo a significant investment and will reopen as a Popworld. Popworld are a premium quality offering with a focus on a friendly and inclusive atmosphere. Central to the investment, is an enhanced customer offer, and part of that includes an extension to the current terminal hour. On that basis, a new premises licence application has been submitted to seek permission for extended hours and provide an up to date operating schedule to accompany the new style of trading.

The premises has the benefit of an existing premises licence, number HART/PS/048

The existing premises licence permits sale of alcohol and regulated entertainment until 02:00 hours, seven days a week. In addition, non standard timings are permitted for British Summertime an New Year's Eve and an additional hour permitted on various notable days listed on the premises licence.

This New Premises Licence Application does not proposes a later start time to the existing start time for hours of operation, which are currently 9am for licensable activities. The only change sought to the terminal hours is the addition of one hour for all activities, and the inclusion of performance of dance and anything similar, in line with the entertainment offer.

This New Premises Licence Application has also been submitted to update the premises licence conditions to ensure that they are suitable for the style of operation at the premises. Much of the current operating schedule is replicated and offered as new updated conditions in boxes b) to e) below. However, new conditions are also offered which bolster the operating schedule ensuring it is robust, clear, appropriate and enforceable.

In particular, the following conditions are offered in the event that the new premises licence is granted which will significantly bolster the current operating schedule:

- A significantly increased set of conditions relating to the prevention of crime and disorder, including conditions regarding staffing, training, customer management and last entry.
- Maintenance of all the conditions on the current premises licence relating to public nuisance
- New conditions regarding Challenge 25 and staff training to ensure the prevention of children from harm.

Given the changes proposed, the applicant has carefully considered the application, the effect of the licensing objectives and the Council's Licensing Policy. We note that the premises falls within Hartlepool's Cumulative Impact Policy Area. Steps have been taken to ensure that the application and proposed operation will continue to promote the licensing objectives without adding to the cumulative impact of the area or undermining the licensing objectives. In particular, pre-consultation on the application has taken place with the Police, Environmental Health and Licensing Officers prior to submission of the application and their comments have been taken into consideration in preparing and submitting this application. The applicant's Area Manager has also met with the Police Licensing Officer prior to submission to discuss the proposed application and explain the investment that will be made in the premises. As above, updated conditions and additional conditions have also been included in the Operating Schedule to ensure promotion of the Licensing Objectives and that the application will not add to Cumulative Impact of the area.

The purpose for seeking later hours comes from requests from our experience and our customers, who want to continue their night in a safe and comfortable environment, rather than leave and go to other premises. The applicant feels the extension of the terminal hours will ensure customers can stay in a well-managed, controlled and supervised environment for longer, if they wish (rather than go elsewhere), preventing double migration of customers leaving our premises and then another premises later on, as well as allowing a longer wind down period and a more gradual dispersal of customers which can be managed and contained, reducing impact on the area and licensing objectives by a mass dispersal at any one time.

This understanding reflects the Council's licensing policy with regards to the matters the licensing authority expects to be addressed, in particular in respect of crime and disorder. This is recognized in the conditions offered below.

Additionally, with regard to terminal hours sought through this application, the premises has operated to the hours sought in this application under Temporary Event Notices, whilst continuing to promote the licensing objectives and without any issues of note and which have not had a negative impact on the licensing objectives nor added to the cumulative impact of the area.

Stonegate also operate 28 other premises under their Popworld brand which operate until 3am or later and are therefore exceptionally experienced in operating under these circumstances.

Stonegate have a proven track record of successfully operating and continuing to promote the Licensing Objectives in premises located within cumulative impact zones across the country. No less than 53 Stonegate premises within cumulative impact have been granted extended hours since December 2012 and the Applicant notes that thanks to the Company's robust internal policies and procedures and co-operative with Responsible Authorities, none of these premises have been the subject of any subsequent enforcement action to reduce the hours.

Stonegate are an experienced licensed operator and have in place an extensive licensing manual containing policies and procedures across the whole estate, which are adapted at site level to ensure the premises operates to a high standard and promotes the Licensing Objectives. These include policies regarding social responsibility, training, underage sales and challenge policies, incident logs, queuing policy, drugs and dispersal policy, and noise management and the management of outside areas policies as well as procedures to prevent crime and disorder and public nuisance. These robust policies and procedures that are already in place will continue to operate if the extended hours are granted.

In the event that this new premises licence is granted as applied for or in an acceptable form, the intention will be to surrender the existing premises licence number HART/PS/048

Considering the above, we believe that the New Premises Licence Application will not have an adverse impact on the licensing objectives, nor will it add to the cumulative impact of the area. The Applicant believes that the proposed conditions and robust internal policies in place, as well as experience of the applicant (including demonstrating we can operate to the hours sought without any issues of note), will ensure the premises continues to promote the Licensing Objectives if the application is granted and further conditions are not required

**b) The prevention of crime and disorder**

1. A zero tolerance drugs policy will be adopted at the premises.
2. Clearly visible notices shall be displayed advising those attending that:
  - a) It is a condition of entry that customers agree to be searched and
  - b) Police will be informed if anyone is found in possession of controlled substances or weapons.
3. No person in possession of a drink in a sealed or unsealed container will be allowed to enter the premises except for the purposes of delivery or following re-entry from any external area of the premises.
4. Appropriate measures will be taken to ensure staff prevent the removal of bottles or glasses from the curtilage and grounds of the licensed premises.
5. An incident book (which may be electronic) will be maintained in which will be recorded:
  - All incidents of crime and disorder.
  - Refused sales to suspected underage and drunken persons.
  - A record of any person asked to leave the premises or that are removed from the premises.
  - Details of occasions on which the police are called to the premises.
  - A record of persons searched on suspicion that drugs are being carried and their reason for such suspicion.
  - The book will be available for inspection by a police officer.
6. All members of staff shall receive suitable training with regard to serving drunks and are to receive regular refresher training at intervals of a maximum of 6 months, records to evidence this will be made available to authorised officer upon request.
7. Frequent collection of drinking vessels will be undertaken to ensure that empty containers do not accumulate in or around the licensed premises
8. The premises will use toughened glass where available and only polycarbonate pint glasses shall be used.
9. A digital CCTV system shall be installed at the premises and maintained in good working order and used at all times when the premises are open for licensable activities. Any CCTV footage shall be held for at least 31 days and shall be made available to an officer of the Licensing Authority or Police on reasonable request.
10. A minimum of 2 SIA registered door supervisors shall be employed at the premises from 22:00 hours on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays until close, one of which shall be wearing a body worn camera when on duty. At all other times the need for door supervisors will be assessed by way of risk assessment and cognisance will be taken of any police advice.

11. Where Pubwatch exists covering the area of which the premises is situated then the DPS or other nominated employee shall participate in Pubwatch.
12. All door staff shall sign a register when performing duties at the premises. This register is to contain the full names, SIA badge numbers and contact details of that person. Those records are to be made available on request to any relevant authority for the purposes of investigating or preventing crime or apprehending or prosecuting an offender.
13. The licence holder / DPS shall arrange adequate supervision of any queue which may form to gain entry to the premises.
14. The licence holder shall erect and maintain suitable and sufficient conspicuous signage on the exterior of their premises advising patrons that causing any disturbance or disorder in a queue will result in admission being refused.
15. There shall be no new entry to the premises for customers after 02:00 on any day (save for re-entry for existing customers who have temporarily left the premises, e.g. to smoke).

#### **c) Public safety**

16. Adequate first aid provision is available at all times the premises are being operated.

#### **d) The prevention of public nuisance**

17. The premises shall maintain a written dispersal policy and will be made available for inspection on request to the Police or an Authorised Officer of the Council or Responsible Authority.
18. The external doors and windows to the parts of the premises used for the purposes of live and / or recorded music are not to be left open whilst regulated entertainment in the form of live or recorded music is being held in the premises, save for access and egress.
19. After midnight, the rear gates to the premises are only to be used for access and egress to the building in an emergency.
20. Notices will be displayed at the entrance and exits advising customers to leave quietly.
21. Reasonable steps shall be taken to recognise the rights of local residents and to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly.
22. The licensee or nominated person of the premises must ensure that any noise emanating from the licensed premises is such as not to cause annoyance to residents in the locality.

#### **e) The protection of children from harm**

23. A Challenge 25 proof of age policy shall be implemented and adhered to. Any person who looks or appears to be under the age of 25 shall be asked to provide identification that they are over the age of 18. The following are the only forms of identification acceptable:
  - A recognised proof of age scheme accredited under the British Retail Consortiums Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS).

- Photo driving licence.
- Passport.
- Official ID card issued by HM Forces or European Union bearing a photograph and date of birth of the holder.

If no suitable identification is provided the sale of alcohol to them will be refused.

24. All staff involved in the sale of alcohol shall receive suitable training in relation to proof of age scheme to be applied upon the premises. All staff receive regular refresher training at intervals of at least 6 months. Records to evidence this will be made available to officers upon request.

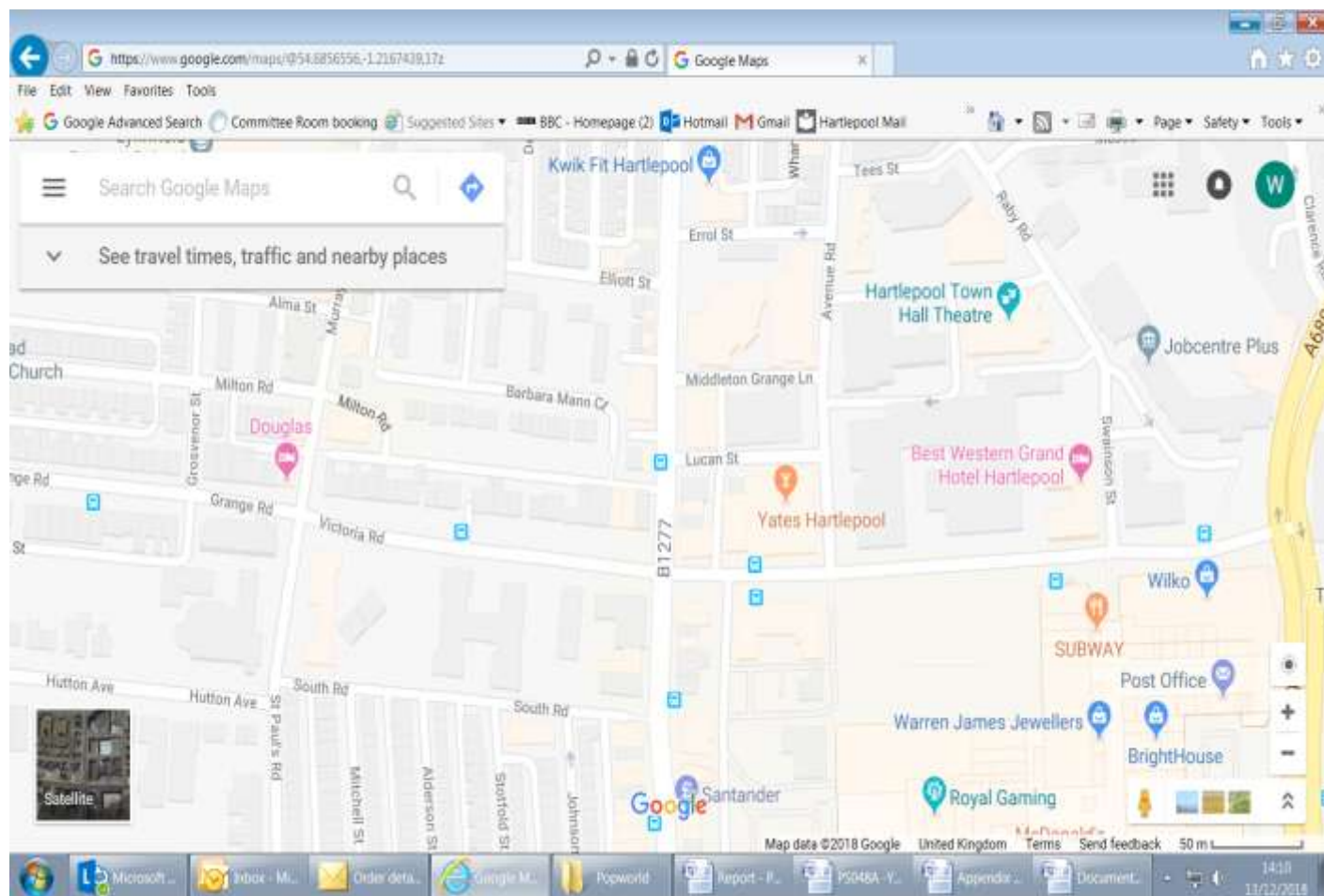

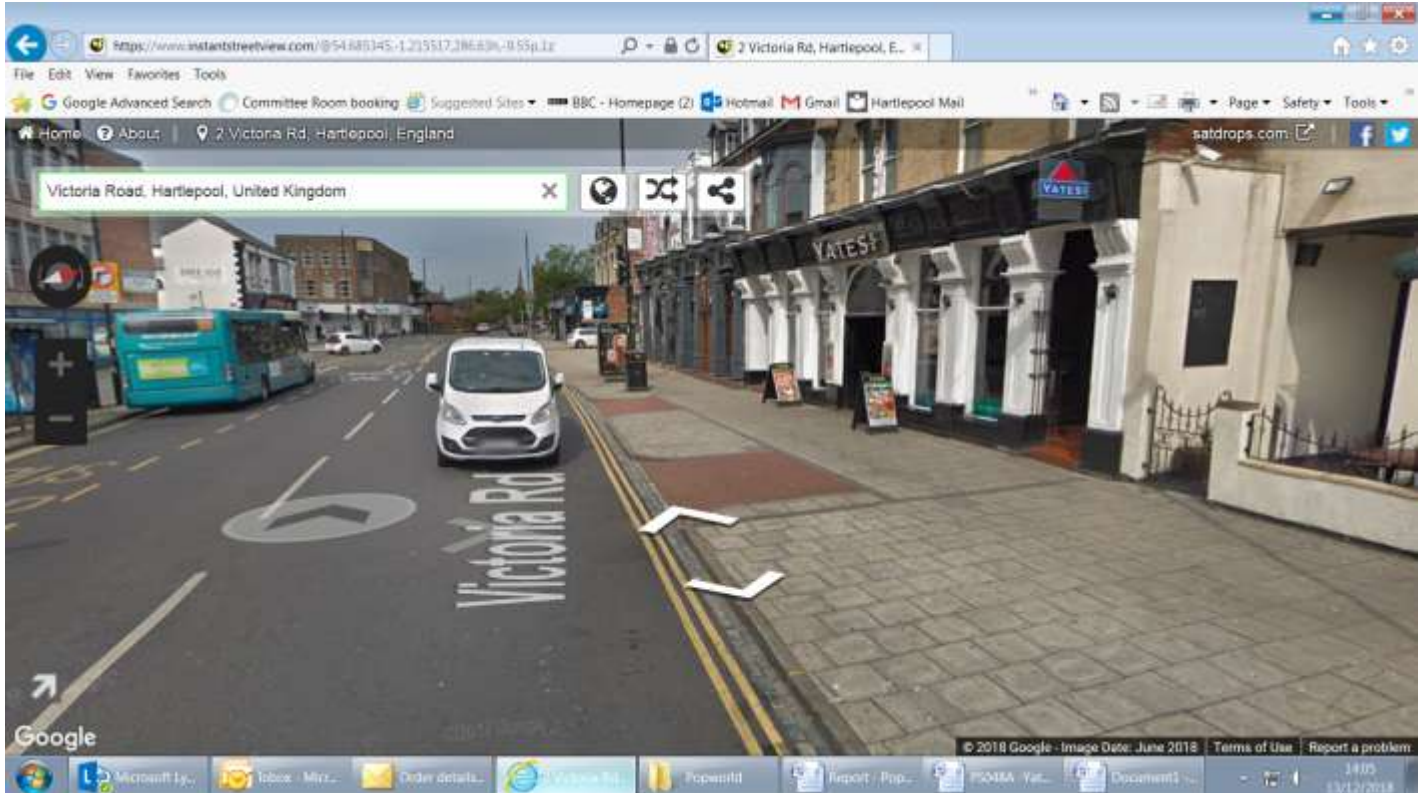
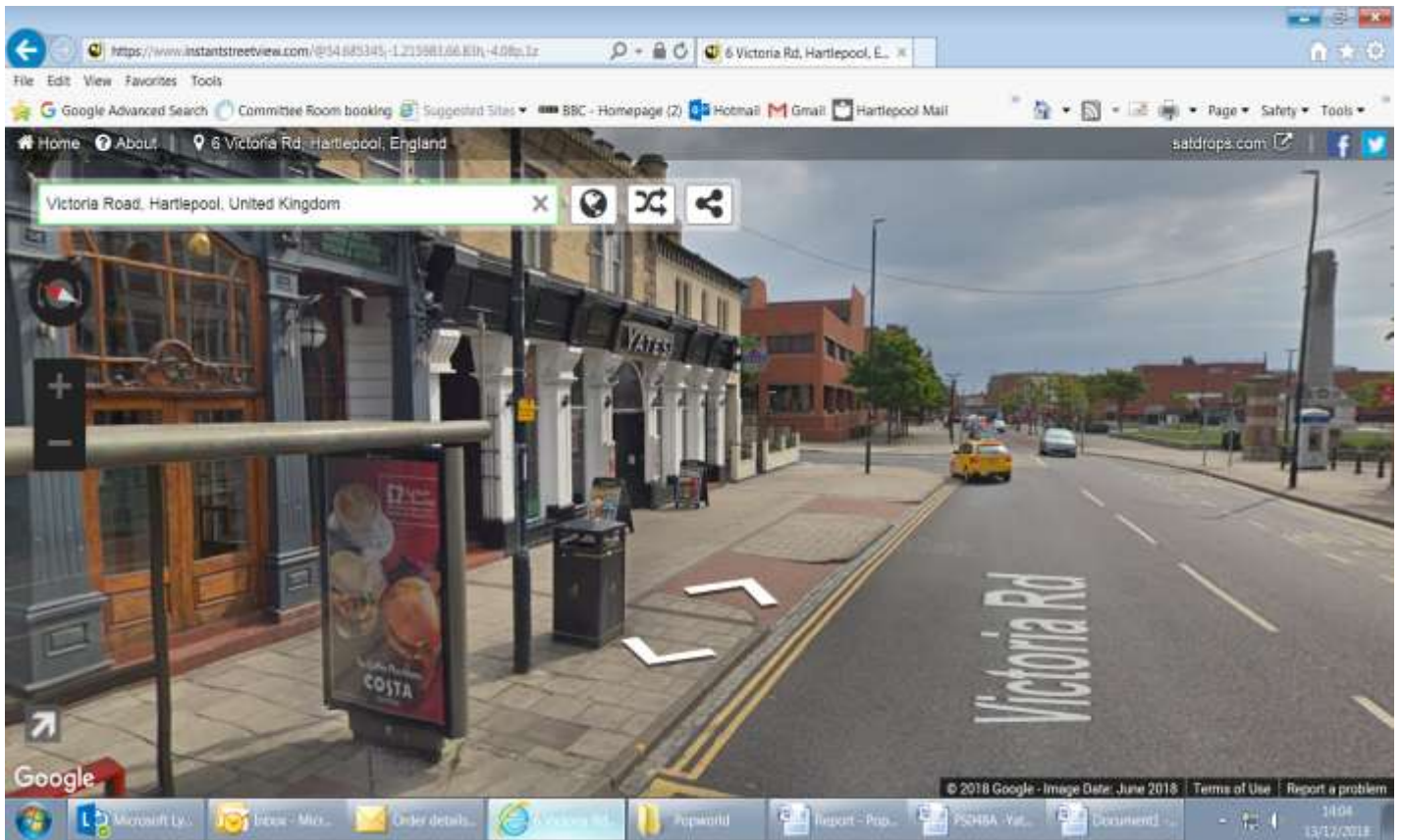

## ANNEX 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

2. In relation to the exhibition of films, the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with the classification designated by the British Board of film Classification (BBFC) or other authority designated by the Video Recordings Act 1984 for the film, or films being exhibited.
3. Each individual employed or otherwise engaged at the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
    - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other



than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
    - (a) a holographic mark, or
    - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person shall ensure that—
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - (b) These measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises and
  - (c) Where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
8. (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
  - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
    - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
    - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where—
      - (I) P is the permitted price,
      - (II) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (III) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
  - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
    - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
    - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
  - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
  - (e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

## **ANNEX 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

1. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted house includes:

New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31<sup>st</sup> December).

2. The external doors and windows to the parts of the premises used for the purposes of either live music and/or recorded music are not to be left open whilst entertainment's are being held in the premises, save for access and egress.
3. After Midnight the rear gates to the premises are only to be used to access and egress the building in an emergency.
4. In the event of the fire alarm being activated a suitable relay must be provided so that the electrical power supply to all sound amplification system in the licensed premises must be immediately intercepted so that the alarm can be clearly heard on all parts of the licensed premises.
5. The licensee must ensure that the electrical socket outlets in the licensed premises, which are used for the purpose of providing licensed entertainment are protected by the residual current device being a 30 MA tripping circuit.
6. A "Challenge 21" policy shall be operated at the premises at all times. Customers attempting to purchase alcohol who appear to be less than 21 shall be challenged by staff to produce a passport, photo driving licence, a PASS approved Proof-of-Age card or a MoD 'Form 90' identification card. No other form of identification shall be accepted. The policy shall be documented and all staff must have received sufficient training to ensure they understand it and can comply with it. A written record shall be maintained detailing when the Challenge 21 training was provided and shall be signed as confirmation by the member of staff to whom the record relates. The policy and training records shall be made available for inspection by Police Officers or other authorised officers. A Challenge 21 Notice or Poster shall be visible at the entrance to the premises and at each point of sale to both inform the public and remind staff of the policy.
7. Except with the prior written approval of the Licensing Authority and subject to any conditions which may be attached to such approval:-
  - (a) No special effects, naked flames, smoke production or any process creating a risk of fire, or the illusion of smoke or fire shall be used for the purpose of providing regulated entertainment on the premises.
  - (b) No explosives or highly flammable substances shall be brought into or used on the premises.
  - (c) No special effects shall be used or displays given on the premises, which consist of or include the use of lasers.

Applications for consent, giving detailed descriptions of the equipment to be used and details of the event, including dates and times must be made not less than 28 days before the date of the event.

8. The licensee or nominated person of the premises must ensure that any noise emanating from the licensed premises is such as not to cause annoyance to residents in the locality.
9. Reasonable steps shall be taken to recognise the rights of local residents and to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly.
10. Notices shall be displayed at the premises exits requesting customers to leave quietly and reminding them that they are in a residential area.
11. Door supervisors shall be employed from 23:00 hours on Friday and 22:30 on Saturday. On Saturday nights there shall be 5 door staff employed between 22:30 and half an hour before the premises close. This number shall be reduced to 3 in the month of January.
12. A digital CCTV system shall be installed at the premises and maintained in good working order and used at all times when the premises are open for licensable activities. Any CCTV footage shall be held for at least 28 days and shall be made available to an officer of the Licensing Authority of Police on reasonable request.
13. Where Pubwatch exists covering the area of which the premises is situated then the DPS or other nominated employee shall participate in Pubwatch.
14. The premises will use toughened glass where available.
15. The company shall operate a zero tolerance policy with regards to drugs.
16. An incident log book shall be kept on the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or Police which will record the following:-
  - a. Any incidents of disorder
  - b. Any seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - c. Any ejections or patrons

Good Morning All,

Could you please consider this e-mail my official objection to the application submitted on behalf of Stonegate for "Popworld" (by Poppleston Allen) for an extension to the licensable hours.

I am objecting on the grounds of Crime and Disorder, and Public Safety. We do not believe that allowing any on licensed premise licensable activity hours past 2am will be conducive to promoting the four main Licensing Objectives, in particular Crime and Disorder or Public Safety Nuisance.

Yates (as they are currently) has unfortunately suffered from sporadic incidents of violence over the past 12 months with a number of incidents involving violence being reported to police with the latest incident being 19<sup>th</sup> October 2018. This does not take in to account any other reported incidents involving drugs/theft or general disorder and ASB. We also still have a number of violent incidents reported between 2am and 4.30am in the area of Victoria Road and adjoining streets.

Also as you are well aware the Licensing Policy from Hartlepool Council does not generally allow licensable activity past 2am and we (Cleveland Police) support this policy.

Whilst we appreciate the updated conditions that have been offered we do not feel that any additional or strengthened conditions will prevent any negative impact the extended licensable hours could have.

We will supply a statement and evidence in support to this objection in due course which will be sent to all relevant parties for their information.

This representation is made on behalf of Hartlepool Borough Council in its role as licensing authority and in respect of an application for a new premises licence for the above named property.

Hartlepool Borough Council's current Statement of Licensing Policy (published in 2016) states the following: -

*5.14 The licensing authority does not accept that longer opening hours have been a benefit to Hartlepool but rather that they place an undue and unnecessary strain on the local transport infrastructure, Accident & Emergency services and law enforcement agencies and creates a nuisance for those residents who are affected by the general operation of a premises or from revellers returning home during the early hours.*

*Shops, stores and supermarkets will in general be licensed to provide sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises at any time when the retail outlet is open for shopping but licences for before 9:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. in residential areas will generally be refused. In addition, licence applications for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises for before 9:00 a.m. or after 11:30 p.m. in residential areas will generally be refused.*

*In non residential areas applications for licences to allow the sale of alcohol or the supply of late night refreshment beyond 2:00 a.m. will normally be refused subject to relevant representations being received.*

In addition, Chapter 6 of the Statement of Licensing Policy also establishes a Cumulative Impact Policy for the area in which Popworld is situated. Para 6.8 of the Policy states: -

*6.8 A Cumulative Impact Policy creates a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences, club premises certificates or material variations will normally be refused, if relevant representations are received.*

I am a serving police officer with Cleveland Police. I am currently stationed with the Licensing Support Unit at Middlesbrough Police HQ.

Part of my role as a licensing support officer is to monitor licensed premises within Hartlepool and Stockton districts ensuring that they are trading within the spirit of the four licensing objectives. We will ask that they will not have an adverse affect on the surrounding community or have a negative impact on Crime & Disorder, Public Safety or Public Nuisance objectives and will Prevent Harm to Children. We will only object to new applications or variations on existing licences if we consider that it may cause issues for the premise or have a negative impact on any of the four main licensing objectives.

This statement is in response to a new application for an on-licensed premises licence by Stonegate (with Poppleston Allen as agents) for their premise which is currently called Yates but which they intend to come under their "Popworld" banner. Cleveland Police object to the application because we consider that a new premise licence extending the

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hours of licensable activity past 2am will have a negative impact on the Licensing Objectives mainly Preventing Crime and Disorder, Public Safety.

Yates is situated on Victoria Road, Hartlepool, sandwiched in-between other late night venues. There is direct access leading from the Victoria Road Pavement to the front door of the premise. It is a large single level on-licensed premise with a curved bar to the right as you walk in to the premise. The premise has a beer garden to the rear which is fenced and gated off from Lucan Street which runs behind it. The beer garden is currently subject to some refurbishment. The Beer garden is included in the plans as a drinking and smoking area. Historically the premise has been the location of some issues which resulted in a condition being added to prevent the beer garden gate being used as an entrance/exit after midnight. When they have door staff on duty they cover the front door, the beer garden and the rear gate as well as carrying out floor walks over the night. There is nothing exceptional about the size of Yates compared to the other On Licensed Premises on Victoria Road.

Yates Premise Licence is held by Stonegate Pub Company Ltd, Porter Tun House, 500 Capability Green Luton and the new application is made on their behalf by Poppleston Allen Solicitors. The Designated Premise Supervisor (DPS) is currently Lauramay Lawson who recently took over as DPS. The premise, under it's current licence, is allowed to carry out Licensable Activity (as per the Premise Licence) between the hours of 09:00am and 02:00am Monday to Sunday, and has opening hours of 07:00am to 02:30 am for the same days. There are exceptions to this as detailed in both the licence when the premise was

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Yates and the new application, they have an hour extension for the patron saints days, Valentines Day, Halloween, Burns Night, Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays of Bank Holiday Weekends, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, the 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> December.

We have previously enjoyed a good working relationship with Yates through it's number of managers I have seen whilst carrying out my licensing duties, which I believe still exists. We have tried to encourage the managers to have regular (weekly if possible) contact with us to notify us of any issues which they have continued to do to date.

Despite this, Yates have been subject to sporadic incidents of violence and threats of violence over the past twelve months. This seems to be a cycle for the premise. I detail below the incidents that have been reported to police over the past twelve months.

1. During Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2018 at around 10:04 hours, the female victim contacts police to report that at around 01:15 hours that morning she was assaulted by an unknown person in Pop World. She has sustained bruising to her chin, a cut to the top of her head and a chipped tooth. It is believed there may be CCTV footage of the incident. No assailant has been identified yet. I will refer to this as Incident 1.
2. During the early hours around 00:35 hours on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> December 2018, the female victim was in Popworld enjoying a night out when a fight broke out between a group of males dressed as Santas. During the fight a bottle was thrown which hit the female victim on the head. The female was taken outside and an ambulance called. CCTV

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reported a number of scuffles at the time. Although CCTV from the premise was available no suspect could not be discerned. The female victim sustained some small cuts and a lump to the head. I will refer to this as Incident 2 for the purposes of any hearing.

3. On Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> December 2018 at around 01:45 hours a male reports to the police that his friend (another male) has been assaulted in the male toilets in Pop World. The victims eye is badly swollen. It is believed that 3-4 males attacked the male. When police contact the venue, they cannot trace the assailants and no CCTV exists covering the incident. I will refer to this Incident as Incident 3.
4. During the early hours of Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> December 2018 around 01:30 hours, a male and female who appeared to be husband and wife, seemingly without provocation lashed out at a male walking past them on the dancefloor. Door Staff immediately reacted to this by putting the male assailant out of the back of the premise and the female assailant out of the front of the premise. Whilst being escorted out the female clawed at the door staff and attacked the manager. As the female assailant was being restrained by door staff to prevent the attacks the male assailant made his way round to the front and punched one of the door staff. The male and female got in to a taxi and left the area. There is no police report for this incident although CCTV were aware and no incident was called in to the police by the venue. I will refer to this as Incident 4.
5. During the early hours of Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> October 2018 around 01:00 hours the male victim was in the beer garden at the rear of the premise. He has been hit with a bottle to the back of the head and has assumed this was a deliberate act which has resulted in the parties being aggressive towards each other. The groups have been ejected from

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the premise for causing problems. The victim has then turned in to the aggressor together with the party he was with who all turn on the younger male they believe to be the assailant. This has become so much of an issue the staff at the premise have taken the younger male back in to the premise until the door staff deal with the group who eventually leave. On reviewing the premise CCTV it was shown that the younger male did not throw the bottle at the male but rather the contents of his bottle. The victim decided not to pursue a complaint when contacted by police and did not disclose any injuries. I will refer to this as Incident 5.

6. On Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> July 2018 at around 00:50 hours a report was made that an altercation had started inside the premise. It is unclear how the fight started but it quickly spills outside. Witnesses state that three males have started on another male and whilst outside have knocked the male to the ground and stamped on his head a number of times. The victim suffered some horrific injuries which were documented by photos on the night and subsequent hospital treatment revealed that the victim had sustained a fractured cheekbone. This is still an ongoing investigation as the assailants have not been identified. I will refer to this as Incident 6.
7. On Monday 25<sup>th</sup> June 2018 at around 21:40 hours a female returns home and discloses to her partner/carer that she has been assaulted whilst in Yates, Victoria Road by another female. Witnesses support this stating that an unknown female is seen to drag the victim around the bar area by her hair. The victim will not, however follow up a complaint with police. I will refer to this as Incident 7.
8. On Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> May 2018 at around 02:08 hours police received a report of 3 females detained outside Yates, Victoria Road. Earlier that night door staff had escorted two

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females out of the premise due to their behaviour. The females hung around outside while the premises went through it's closing procedure and more people came out. The door staff then saw a female being attacked and went to assist. The door staff took two females back in to the venue to protect them. Police attended and detained three females. The injured parties would not pursue a complaint or disclose any injuries so all parties were taken to their respective homes. I will refer to this as Incident 8.

9. On Friday 27<sup>th</sup> April 2018 at around 23:57 hours, police received a call stating that a male had attacked the attendant in the toilets. A member of door staff attended the toilets and was attacked as well. Door staff managed to get the male out of the toilets and restrain him. On police arrival the door staff did not feel that they wanted to pursue a complaint of assault and no injuries were disclosed, so the male was arrested for public order offences. I will refer to this as Incident 9.

10. At around 20:07 hours on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> April 2018 police responded to a report from council CCTV that a party had got out of hand in the venue and glasses were being thrown. On police arrival the group responsible had left the premise, before police spoke to them. Staff at Yates did not wish to pursue any complaints. I will refer to this as Incident 10.

11. At around 00:49 hours on Easter Monday Bank Holiday (one of the times the venue can open until 3am), 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2018, door staff refuse entry to a male. The male then takes his belt off using it as a whip to hit the door staff with. Police arrive and door staff want the male removing before he can cause further issues. There were no injuries caused. Police take the male home. I will refer to this as Incident 11.

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12. During the early hours of Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> March 2018 at approximately 01:55 hours, leading on from a busy Saturday night, a male was acting aggressively towards customers and staff inside the venue. He was escorted out of the venue by door staff. The male picked up one on the metal stanchions which hold up the barriers and attacked the door staff with it. The door staff managed to wrestle it out of his grip and restrain him until police arrived. The male was arrested for common assault and dealt with. The victim reported no visible injuries. I will refer to this as Incident 12.
13. On Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> March 2018 at around 19:03 hours staff at Yates contact police to advise that a group of females have smashed up the female toilets and have threatened staff when confronted. Two females were detained by police, but the female thought to be responsible left before police attended and could not be identified. I will refer to this as Incident 13.
14. On Friday night 9<sup>th</sup> March 2018 at around 23:16 hours an injured male contacted the police to state that he had been glassed by an unknown male. The male was in Yates on the dancefloor when he was hit by an unknown assailant. When the injured male has come round he found he is bleeding from neck and head wounds. The male is taken straight to hospital by friends and the suspected assailant is arrested. The wounds to the victim have been substantial and have consisted of a large cut to his neck and a cut to the males head above his eye brow. The victim required hospital treatment for both of his injuries which were stitched. I will refer to this as Incident 14.
15. At around 00:06 hours on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> January 2018 staff from Yates contact police to report an incident involving a male victim who has been attacked sustaining a split lip.

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The male responsible could still be inside. The suspect was not traced. I will refer to this as Incident 15.

16. On Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> January 2018 at around 01:41 hours staff at Yates contacted police to advise that they had escorted a male out of the premises who was drunk and acting suspiciously. As they escorted him out the male threatened the door staff with bodily harm stating that he had a screwdriver and he would stab the door staff with it. Police arrived and detained the male. Door staff did not want to pursue a complaint but the male was arrested for other issues. I will refer to this as Incident 16.

17. On New Years Day 01/01/2018 at around 11:17 hours a parent contacted police to advise that between 00:00 hours and 01:00 hours their son had been assaulted whilst in Yates. Their son was walking to the bar when he bumped in to another male. He apologised immediately but the male, without further provocation head-butted and punched the victim in the face, causing swelling to his face and splitting his lip open. The victim did not want to take the matter any further. I will refer to this as Incident 17.

18. On New Years Day 01/01/2018 at around 00:28 hours, two females were in the venue arguing over a boy. One female raised her hand to hit the other with the glass she had in it, the other female blocked her hand and the glass smashed causing the female to sustain a bad cut which would not stop bleeding in her hand. The intended victim did not wish to take the matter any further as the cuts were not as bad as she had initially feared. I will refer to this as Incident 18.

19. Friday 29<sup>th</sup> December 2017 at around 01:15 hours police responded to reports of an unconscious male outside Yates. An argument had broken out on the dancefloor of Yates and when the door staff responded they found a male with his face covered in



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blood. The door staff separated what they believed to be the two groups and escorted one group outside. Once outside another fight between two males started. Meanwhile door staff are trying to help the male with blood on his face, but the male refuses help and walks outside with his friends. This escalates matters outside and the two groups again clash. Door staff try to intervene, but a male is knocked to the ground seemingly rendered unconscious, however the attacks on this male continue while he is on the ground immobile. A second male is knocked to the ground and punched and stamped on whilst he is prone on the ground. Door staff manage to intervene and administer first aid to the fallen males. When police arrived two males were identified as aggressors and were arrested at the scene. The victims were unwilling to take the matter further so charges against the perpetrators could not be brought.. I will refer to this as Incident 19.

20. During the early hours of Christmas Day 2017 leading on from a busy Christmas Eve at around 01:01 hours council CCTV contacted police to advise that door staff had a male restrained on the ground outside the premise. The door staff had asked a group wanting to get in to the premise for ID. One of the females in the group had no ID so the door staff refused to let her in. One of the males in the group then head-butted one of the door staff. The door staff restrained the male to stop any further assault but whilst restraining the male the female who had no ID started to kick the door staff and another male became aggressive towards the door staff. One member of door staff sustained a cut lip. One male is arrested for assaulting a member of door staff. He was dealt with for Sec 47 Assault. I will refer to this as Incident 20.

21. On Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> December 2017 at around 04:21 hours, ambulance contact police to advise they are attending to a female in The Showroom who was assaulted in Yates

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earlier that night. The female has suffered face and shoulder injuries. The victim discloses whilst in Yates she gets in the way of two males shoving each other and gets knocked into by them. The door staff immediately ejected the males and the door staff offer care to the female who they sit with for around 25 minutes. After that she moves on to The Showroom, but is feeling the affects of her knock so an ambulance is called. The suspects were not identified. I will refer to this as Incident 21.

22. In the early hours of Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> November 2017 around 01:36 hours a parent calls the police to advise that their daughter has just arrived home intoxicated and that she has been assaulted. The victim disclosed she was on the dancefloor in Yates with her boyfriend's brother when she has been bumped in to by a female. They begin to argue and a second male gets involved. One of the females throws a bottle at her, the bottle bounces off her head but another one hits her in the face. She has lost a tooth and her mouth is bleeding. She received hospital treatment for the cut to her mouth by having it stitched. The suspects have not been identified. I will refer to this as Incident 22.

Yates (soon to be "Popworld"), have applied to extend their licensable hours to 3am with the closing time of the premise to be 03:30 am. This could be problematic as we still find that, although the issues are much better, the hours between 02:00 and 04:00 hours are still some of the busiest for violent crime and disorder with 19 incidents reported to the police just since the beginning of 2018. Our fear is that if "Popworld" opens until 3.30am they will suffer from some of these types of incidents, putting a greater strain on their staff and door staff and resulting in an increase in the incidents reported from and at the premise.

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Hartlepool Borough Council's current licensing policy clearly states that they do not believe that longer opening hours are a benefit to Hartlepool and state in their policy "In non residential areas applications for licences to allow the sale of alcohol or the supply of late night refreshment beyond 2:00 a.m. will normally be refused subject to relevant representations being received." We at Cleveland Police fully support this policy and would agree with their belief.

We therefore believe that an extension in the licensable hours would, more than likely, have a negative impact on the Night Time Economy or the main licensing objectives.

I am a Police Sergeant in Cleveland Police currently attached to Cleveland Police Licensing Support Unit, located at Middlesbrough Police HQ.

I have over 28 years service as a Police Officer. I have worked as a Police Licensing Sergeant for 15 years. Up until 2014 I was responsible for Licensing in Middlesbrough. After 2014 I became responsible for Licensing across the Force.

I have successfully completed the BIIAB level 2 National Certificate for Licensing Practitioners and the BIIAB level 2 course in the Assessment of Licensed Premises.

I have read the application made by Stonegate Pub Company in relation to Popworld in Hartlepool.

The application seeks to increase the terminal hour for Licensable activities by 1 hour from 2am to 3am seven days a week with a closing time of 03:30hrs.

The application states that updated and additional conditions are offered to bolster the current operating schedule. Whilst these are welcome additions to the premises licence I believe that they are only the sort of measures that a venue trading until 02:30 should be doing anyway.

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In actual fact the application initially sought to reduce the liability on door staff numbers from 5 on a Saturday night to 2 door staff, although it is understood that the applicant is willing to revert back to 5 door staff on Saturday nights.

Only condition 15 makes any real impact on the increased time for licensable activities with a last entry time of 2am.

Cleveland Police have made a representation against this application as it is the view of the Police that if the additional hours are granted there will be an increase in Crime and Disorder at the premises and this will undermine the Licensing Objectives of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety. I can make this claim with a great deal of certainty based upon my experience in dealing with Stonegate's other Popworld premises in Middlesbrough.

The Popworld in Middlesbrough is situated at the junction of Albert Road and Wilson Street. It is also known as Flares as it contains two rooms, themed as Flares and Popworld.

In 2010 the Middlesbrough Flares/Popworld had a very similar licence to the current Licence at Popworld in Hartlepool in so far as the last sale of alcohol was 2am and the terminal hour was until 2:30am.

In 2010 the number of crimes occurring at Flares/Popworld in Middlesbrough were relatively low. There were a number of other venues in Middlesbrough with 3am Licences and Stonegate made an application to extend the opening hours on a weekend until 3am for the last sale of alcohol and 3:30am for the close of the premises.

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Stonegate put forward a similar argument that the premises would continue to be well managed. I attended a number of meetings with representatives from Stonegate prior to the application and to further allay Police fears they agreed to a condition that all drinks would be served in plastic and any glass bottles would be decanted into plastic.

I note that this is not a condition that Stonegate have put forward in it's application in Hartlepool.

As a result of the additional licence conditions Cleveland Police did not make a representation against the application.

The extended licence at Flares/Popworld Middlesbrough was granted in January 2011. This allowed for the sale of alcohol on Fridays and Saturdays until 3am with the premises closed by 3:30am.

After the licence was extended at Flares/Popworld in Middlesbrough the number of crimes occurring at the venue started to creep up. I have monitored these crimes rising year on year since that time. We have held a number of meetings with the management at Flares about this over the years.

On the 25<sup>th</sup> January 2017 we held a meeting with management of Middlesbrough's Flares/Popworld informing them that there were more crimes being recorded at Flares/Popworld in Middlebsrough than in any other Licensed premises in Cleveland. It was acknowledged that there were reasons for this as many of these crimes were possession of Class A drugs which had been discovered by a proactive approach to searching persons prior to entry. There were also a large number of thefts occurring at the

premises. Because of these factors Cleveland Police did not seek a Review of the Middlesbrough Flares/Popworld.

A further meeting was held with management of Middlesbrough's Flares/Popworld on the 6<sup>th</sup> October 2017 about the number of crimes occurring at the premises. On this occasion we only discussed the number of violent crimes occurring at the premises and a representative from the Security Industry Authority attended that meeting along with the Police.

Flares/Popworld in Middlesbrough continues to cause concern to Police over the number of violent crimes occurring there.

In order to demonstrate how this additional hour has impacted upon Crime and Disorder at Flares/Popworld in Middlesbrough there are some significant figures.

In 2010 there were only 9 violent crimes recorded as having occurred at Flares/Popworld in Middlesbrough.

In 2018 there were 38 violent crimes recorded as having occurred at Flares/Popworld in Middlesbrough.

Of the 38 crimes recorded at Flares/Popworld 20 of them happened between 2am and 4am, representing over 50% of all the violent crimes at that location.

There will no doubt be many other factors which have had an impact on crime at Flares/Popworld in Middlesbrough between 2010 and 2018, such as attendance numbers, mobile phone reporting and even crime recording. However the rise in violent crime at Flares is not reflected in the overall night time economy crime trend in Middlesbrough which has in actual fact been reducing.

The simple fact remains that 20 people have become a victim of a violent crime at Flares/Popworld in Middlesbrough between 2am and 3:30am in 2018 and these crimes would not have occurred had the extended licence not been granted.

PC Thorpe has provided figures demonstrating that violent crime is a problem at Hartlepool's Popworld now. If this application is granted then the experience of the Middlesbrough venue means this number of crimes may double.

I have attached a table of the crimes that have occurred at Flares/Popworld in Middlesbrough in 2010 and 2018.
