#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the variation of a club premises certificate for Hartlepool United Supporters Club, Sandringham Road, Hartlepool.

#### 2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

2.1 Applicant: Hartlepool United Supporters Club

Premises: Hartlepool United Supporters Club

Sandringham Road,

Hartlepool

- 2.2 A copy of the existing club premises certificate, detailing current licensed activities, is attached as **Appendix 1**.
- 2.3 A copy of the application to vary the club premises certificate is attached as **Appendix** 2.
- 2.4 A map of the area and street view images are attached as **Appendices 3 & 4**.
- 2.5 In summary, the applicant has applied to license the front car park so as to allow for table service and the consumption of alcohol between 1100 and 2200 hours, seven days a week essentially creating a beer garden at the front of the premises.

## 3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and ten representations have been received one from the Council's Environmental Health Team (**Appendix 5**) and nine from Hartlepool residents (**Appendices 6 14**).
- 3.2 The representation from Environmental Health refers to the proximity of the premises to local housing and the objections from Hartlepool residents refer to issues of noise and anti-social behaviour.

#### 4. **ISSUES**

- 4.1 As relevant representations have been received a hearing must be held for Members to consider the application (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 Members may wish to note that the Supporters Club holds a Club Premises Certificate (CPC) rather than the usual premises licence. CPC's are only available to genuine private members/working men's clubs and similar establishments that operate entirely for the benefit of their members. The general public are not permitted into such clubs unless 'signed in' as a guest by a member of the club.
- 4.3 There is a mandatory condition applied to all CPC's which states that all 'off-sales' of alcohol most be sold in 'sealed containers'. An 'off-sale' is the sale of alcohol for consumption away from the *licensed* premises. In this case, the 'licensed premises' is currently the 'bricks and mortar' of the building only and does not include the car park.
- 4.4 To accommodate the post-lockdown re-opening of the hospitality trade on 12<sup>th</sup> April 2021, the Government has relaxed licence conditions requiring 'sealed containers' for off sales and, as such, the Supporters Club is temporarily permitted to supply alcohol for consumption outside. Once this allowance is removed, the club would have to stop selling alcohol in open containers (i.e. an open pint glass) for consumption outside and consumption would have to take place inside the building once again.
- 4.5 Should the sub-committee choose to grant the requested variation, the car park would become a licensed area and, as such, alcohol sold for consumption in the car park would be an 'on sale' and would not be subject to the 'sealed containers only' licence condition.
- 4.6 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - i) To approve the application in its entirety
  - ii) To approve the application in part with or without the addition of further conditions
  - iii) To reject the whole or part of the application
- 4.7 The licensing objectives are:
  - i) The prevention of crime and disorder
  - ii) Public safety
  - iii) The prevention of public nuisance, and
  - iv) The protection of children from harm
- 4.8 Members are reminded that they must only consider those aspects of the licence application that are relevant to the representations received.

# 5. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

5.1 That Members consider the representations made by the applicant and the objectors and determine what aspects, if any, of the application should be granted and, if appropriate, what conditions, if any, should be attached.

# **Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

1. The supply of alcohol must be made at a time when the premises are open for the purpose of supplying alcohol, in accordance with the club premises certificate, to members of the club for consumption on the premises

Any alcohol supplied for consumption off the premises must be in a sealed container.

Any supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises must be made to a member of the club in person

- 2. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less:
  - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
    (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
    (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

- 5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that—
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

# Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Club Operating Schedule

- 1. Except with the prior written approval of the Licensing Authority and subject to any conditions which may be attached to such approval:
  - (a) No special effects, naked flames, smoke production or any process creating a risk of fire or the illusion of smoke or fire shall be used on the premises.
  - (b) No explosives or highly flammable substances shall be brought into or used on the premises.

Except with the prior written approval of the Licensing Authority and subject to any condition, which may be attached to such approval, no special effects shall be used or displays given on the premises which consist of or include the use of lasers. Applications for consent, giving detailed descriptions of the equipment to be used and details of the event, including dates and times must be made not less than 28 days before the date of the event

- 2. The licensee must ensure that the electrical socket outlets in the licensed premises, which are used for the purpose of providing licensed entertainment are protected by a residual current device being a 30 MA tripping circuit.
- 3. There shall be maintained on the premises at all times an adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials for use by patrons.
- 4. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours also includes:

On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) the supply to, or consumption by, any person of alcohol in any premises where they are residing
- 5. In the event of the fire alarm being activated a suitable relay must be provided so hat the electrical power supply to all sound amplification system in the licensed premises must be immediately intercepted so that the alarm can be clearly heard in all parts of the licensed premises
- 6. C.C.T.V shall be installed in all rooms and the car park.

- 7. Disabled access shall be maintained to and from the club.
- 8. The car park shall be floodlit
- 9. Fire/Smoke alarms and Emergency exits shall be clearly marked and illuminated
- 10. All windows and doors shall be kept closed during the provision of regulated entertainment.
- 11. Children are prohibited from purchasing drinks.
- 12. All children shall be supervised by parents or a responsible adult.
- 13. Patrons who are drunk will not be served
- 14. Staff shall seek identification where there is any doubt about a purchaser's age.
