- 4. Applicant presents their case (either personally or via legal representation) and introduces witnesses where appropriate.
- 5. Questions by Members to applicant and/or applicant's witnesses.
- 6. Representations by responsible bodies and/or interested parties and witnesses introduced where appropriate.
- Questions by Members to responsible bodies/interested parties and/or their witnesses.
- 8. Parties may question and clarify issues raised with the consent of the Chair.
- 9. If required, responsible bodies/interested parties to be given opportunity to sum up.
- 10. If required, the applicant to be given opportunity to sum up.

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the variation of a premises licence in respect of 2 Sydenham Road, Hartlepool.

2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

2.1 Applicant: Janarthani Paramesvaran

Premises: Belle Vue Wines, 2 Sydenham Road, Hartlepool

2.2 The applicant has applied to vary their current licence so as to make off sales of alcohol between 0700 hours and 2300 hours seven days a week.

A copy of the application is attached as Appendix 1.

A copy of the current licence for the premises is attached as Appendix 2.

A map of the area is attached as Appendix 3 and street view images of the premises (seen as a shuttered end property) are attached as Appendix 4.

3. BACKGROUND

3.1 The application has been advertised in the prescribed manner and one representation has been received from Cleveland Police (Appendix 5).

4. ISSUES

- 4.1 As a relevant representation has been received, a hearing must be held for Members to consider the application (unless all parties agree a hearing is unnecessary).
- 4.2 Members attention is drawn to Hartlepool Borough Council's Licensing Policy which states the following in respect of licensed hours: -

'The licensing authority does not accept that longer opening hours have been a benefit to Hartlepool but rather that they place an undue and unnecessary

strain on the local transport infrastructure, Accident & Emergency services and law enforcement agencies and creates a nuisance for those residents who are affected by the general operation of a premises or from revellers returning home during the early hours.

Shops, stores and supermarkets will in general be licensed to provide sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises at any time when the retail outlet is open for shopping but licences for before 9:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. in residential areas will generally be refused.'

- 4.3 Having regard to the representations received, Members may take any of the following steps for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - i) To approve the application in its entirety
 - ii) To approve the application in part with or without the addition of further conditions
 - iii) To reject the whole or part of the application
- 4.4 The licensing objectives are:
 - i) The prevention of crime and disorder
 - ii) Public safety
 - iii) The prevention of public nuisance, and
 - iv) The protection of children from harm
- 4.5 Members are reminded that they must only consider those aspects of the licence application that are relevant to the representations received.



ANNEX 1 – Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- 2. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- **3.** (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(6);
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

where-

- (I) P is the permitted price,
- (II) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (III) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(7).
- (3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEX 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. A CCTV system of a type and specification approved by Cleveland Police shall be operational during all trading hours and, where more than one camera is in operation, at least one shall be permanently direct at the sales counter so as to record all sales taking place.
 - Images recorded by the system shall be retained for a minimum of 28 days and shall be made immediately available to police officers or other authorized officers on request.
- 2. There shall be in place a written policy to prevent the sale or supply of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age. That policy shall require any person who appears to be under the age of 21 to produce a recognized proof of age card accredited under the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS), a photo driving licence, a passport or official HM Forces or EU ID card bearing photo and date of birth.
- 3. At least one notice shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises where it can be clearly seen and read and shall indicate that it is unlawful for persons under 18 years of age to purchase alcohol or for any person to purchase alcohol on behalf of a person under 18 years of age.
- 4. A written record shall be maintained detailing the training provided to each member of staff authorized to sell or supply alcohol. Such a record shall be signed by the member of staff to confirm the date that such training took place.
- 5. The licence holder shall implement a policy of regular monitoring and review of all staff authorized to sell or supply alcohol. Such a policy shall include periodic analysis of CCTV footage to ensure sales and refusals correspond with till records.
- 6. There shall be a means of alerting staff to verify the age of a prospective purchase whenever an age restricted product is presented for purchase.
- 7. Hold a register which identifies clients who have asked for alcohol, have been refused and name asked. If the client will not give name then identity should be profiled e.g. short, brown hair, approximate age, clothing etc.
- 8. Training about how to deal with situations involving Children and Young People, not just about alcohol, but also "lost child", "injured child", "young person on premises consuming alcohol or has had excessive alcohol when entering premises.
- 9. Groups of people shall be discouraged from congregating in or around the premises and, if necessary, the Police shall be called.







GROUNDS FOR REPRESENTATIONS

Cleveland Police have received an application made under the Licensing Act 2003 for a variation to a premises licence granted at 2 Sydenham Road Hartlepool TS25 1QB. The

applicant is requesting an extension of licenced hours to 0700hrs – 2300hrs 7 days a week from Monday to Friday 09:00 – 22:00 and Saturday and Sunday 10:00 – 22:00.

Cleveland Police submit representations to this application for the following reasons,

The area that this premise is situated in already suffers from high levels of crime and disorder and antisocial behaviour.

On WEDNESDAY 1st DECEMBER 2021 a visit to the premises was conducted to gain more information with regards to the application. At this time the only member of staff who was on duty was spoken to. It was quickly established that this male had a very limited knowledge of the conditions on the premises licence and the licensing act. During the visit it was discovered that the premise was not complying with the conditions imposed on its licence.

On Friday 3rd DECEMBER 2021 a revisited of the premise was conducted and the DPS was spoken to. During this conversation it was established that the DPS had a limited knowledge of the licensing act and wasn't fully aware of the conditions on the premises licence. Again checks were conducted and the premises were still not complying with the conditions on their licence.

The result of both these visits is deeply concerning to Cleveland Police, particularly given how challenging the area can be and the importance of abiding by conditions granted to support the licensing objectives.

If required, a statement can be provided with supporting evidence.
