Subject: Electoral Cycle

#### 1. TYPE OF DECISION/APPLICABLE CATEGORY

1.1 Key Decision

#### 2. PURPOSE OF REPORT

2.1 To note the outcome and responses from the public consultation and to decide whether to retain the current electoral cycle of elections by thirds or to move to whole council/all-out elections from 2024.

#### 3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Constitution Committee, at its meeting held on 6 July 2021, agreed that consideration should be given to changing the current election of a third of all Elected Members held each year, except in every fourth year when no election is held, to an 'all out' whole Council election being held every 4 years.
- 3.2 At the meeting of the Committee held on 22 November 2021, the Chief Solicitor advised Elected Members of the requirements of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 (the 'Act') in relation to a proposal to change the electoral cycle (see Legal Considerations below).
- 3.3 Elected members noted that all other Tees Valley Council hold 'whole Council' elections. Members also noted the financial savings that would be achieved by changing to an election every 4 years and discussed when they considered it would be appropriate for the first year of whole Council elections. The Committee recommended to Full Council that consideration be given to the electoral cycle being changed to whole council elections with effect from May 2024, when the term of office of all currently elected members will have expired.
- 3.4 Full Council, at its meeting on 16 December 2021, agreed the recommendations of the Committee and for consultation to commence on 20 December 2021.

#### 4. CONSULTATION

4.1 The Act states that the Council need to have 'taken reasonable steps to consult on the change' and that 'it is for the council to decide which persons it is appropriate to consult'. No minimum or maximum timescale for consultation is described.

4.2 The following consultation has taken place between 20 December 2021 and 27 February 2022.

- 4.3 The poll asked from "Do you think that Hartlepool Borough Council should move to "whole Council" elections, where the whole council would be elected at the same time once every four years". There were 107 votes, of which:
  - 80 (74.8%) voted "yes"
  - 27 (25.2%) voted "no"

A copy of the consultation report is attached at **Appendix 2**. Unfortunately, the Your Say system does not require people to include where they live when signing up so we are unable to provide any data on the demographics.

#### 5. LEGAL CONSIDERATIONS

- 5.1 The Act provides that a Council that elects by halves or by thirds may resolve to move to a scheme of whole-council elections. A Council must comply with section 33 of the Act when passing a resolution for whole-council elections and must not pass the resolution unless it has taken reasonable steps to consult "such persons as it thinks appropriate on the proposed change".
- Having consulted, a resolution to move to whole council elections is required:

  (a) at a meeting which is specially convened for that purpose; and

  (b) by a majority of at least two thirds of the members voting on it. The resolution must specify the year for the first ordinary elections of the council at which all Elected Members are to be elected.

4.

- 5.3 If the Council passes a resolution to change the electoral cycle it may not pass another opposing resolution before the end of five years beginning with the day on which the resolution was passed.
- 5.4 If the Council resolves to move to whole council elections, the council must produce an explanatory document and make this available for public inspection at the council's principle office at all reasonable times and to the public by other means that it thinks is appropriate. The Council must publicise:
  - (a) that the Council has become subject to the scheme for whole-council elections under section 34 of the LGPIHA 2007;
  - (b) when elections will first take place in accordance with the scheme;
  - (c) how the explanatory document is available;
  - (d) the address of the council's principal office.
- 5.5 The Council must also give notice to the Electoral Commission that it has passed the resolution.

#### 6. RECOMMENDATION

6.1 That Full Council consider the outcome of the public consultation and decide whether to retain the current electoral cycle of elections by thirds or to move to whole council/all-out elections from 2024.

# **Local Council Elections Consultation**



Consultation has concluded

Hartlepool Borough Council is interested in your views on whether we should change to 'whole council' elections or continue with the current system of 'elections by thirds'.

The change to 'whole council' elections would mean the whole council would be elected at the same time once every four years.

Following a recommendation of the Constitution Committee, approved by Full Council on 16 December 2021, Members voted to hold a public consultation process to seek the views of the public on moving to 'whole council' elections in 2024. Below is some background information to help give you an informed view on the issue.

The consultation will run from **20th December 2021 until 27th February 2022.** 

#### **Background**

Hartlepool Borough Council has 36 councillors in 12 electoral wards. Each ward is represented by three councillors.

The councillors represent their ward as well as making decisions on the running of council.

#### The current process - 'elections by thirds'

Residents have three ward councillors for the area they live. The council currently uses a 'by thirds' electoral system. This means that over four years, elections are held in years one, two and three for one of the three councillors in each ward. In the fourth year there are no elections.

#### Benefits of this system:

- New councillors can be elected more frequently.
- Voters are able to react sooner to local circumstances, providing more immediate political accountability.
- Residents are familiar with this electoral system.

#### The alternative - 'whole council' election


This process would see all councillors up for election at the same time once every four years.

#### Benefits of this system:

- Provide stability for the council to adopt a more strategic, long-term approach to policy and decision making.
- Reduced costs. By reducing the number of elections held from three to one this would save approximately £40,000 per year over the four-year cycle.
- Greater opportunity for residents to influence overall political control of the council, which may encourage more people to vote.

The following infographic demonstrates how the system could change:



This consultation relates only to Hartlepool Borough Council local elections. No other elections will be affected by any future change in Hartlepool Borough Council's electoral cycle. Parish, parliamentary elections, Police and Crime Commissioner and Combined Authority Mayoral elections will continue on their normal electoral cycle.

Under the Local Government and Public Involvement Health Act 2007, amended by the Localism Act 2011, the council has the power to change its electoral arrangements to 'whole council' elections. This allows the council itself to decide whether to move to whole council elections, or back to elections by thirds. Following consultation, a special meeting of Full Council will be held in March 2022 for Members to consider the consultation and make the final resolution. If a change to 'whole council' elections is approved, it cannot be changed again until a period of five years has passed.
